Today's visitors are currently at the top of the South East Division. Although they fell to second on Saturday following their first League defeat of the season, 0-1 at home to Herne Bay, they regained top spot on Tuesday evening when a single goal was this time in their favour at home to Chichester City.

They came into the Isthmian League at the same time as us, pipping us for the Southern Counties Combination title in 2017/18, although it was only an administrative error that prevented them from being promoted the previous season.

Congratulations to Horsham on reaching the First Round Proper of the F.A.Cup following their 1-0 win at home to Woking last Saturday. They might well have hoped for a better reward than the trip to Carlisle United that they now have to make in a fortnight's time!

Four other Isthmian League sides were involved in the Fourth Qualifying Round. Hastings United, who are our next home visitors, lost 1-3 away to Alan Devonshire's Maidenhead United, whilst Bedfont Sports lost by a single goal at home to Kidderminster Harriers.

Corinthian Casuals took St. Albans City to a replay before losing on penalties on Tuesday night, but surely Folkestone Invicta must have been feeling the sickest. Last Saturday they were three up inside the first twenty minutes away to Eastleigh, but a last minute goal by the home side brought the score to 3-3. On Tuesday night it was Eastleigh who went into a two goal lead and this time Folkestone hit back to level the scores and take the game into extra time, but a sending off and another conceded goal meant that Eastleigh ran out 3-2 winners.

I wonder if today's two managers would want such excitement this afternoon!

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HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 sees Jamie Crellin taking over as First Team Manager, with both Danny Lee and Lee Cole (former Academy manager and coach) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager and First Team coach respectively. The U23s have been disbanded but we will have an additional U18s playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays.

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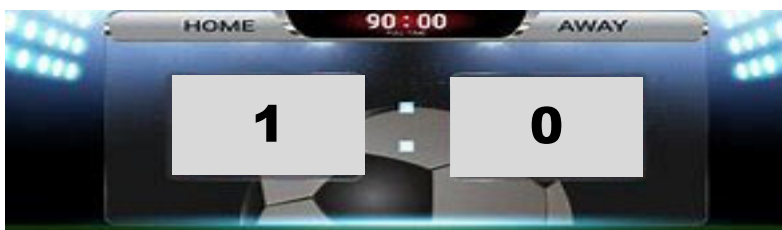
Views from Marina Jack

At half time nothing but a Chichester win would have been imaginable as they dominated proceedings throughout those 45 minutes. A stubborn defence and an outstanding goalkeeping display by Daniel Smith were all that stood between the visitors, Dan Ferreira clearing off the line after just two minutes and Smith producing the first of his saves five minutes later as he smothered a Ryan Davidson shot.

Smith then made good low saves to deny Davidson and Emmett Dunn, and he also tipped over a header and a wicked swerving shot from Dunn. It obviously wasn't to be Dunn's night as he then headed over in the 33rd minute when it seemed easier to score. Apart from a Brannon O'Neill free kick that went just wide, Bridges had no answer to City's dominance, and Smith made two more tip overs to deny Tyrone Madhani and Scott Jones as the one sided half drew to a close.

However, what a difference in the second half as Bridges started to put together a string of decent moves whilst still keeping the odd attack from a more subdued City at bay. The major difference was Mason Doughty playing a lone role up front and constantly harassing the visitors' defence. He shot just wide of the near post following a great through ball from Lee Hall, celebrating his 100th League start for Bridges, and came close with a shot on the turn and another drive that went wide before forcing keeper Kieran Magee to a good block.

An ambitious effort from Callum Chesworth, who was celebrating his 18th birthday, and another one from Doughty that went just wide again suggested that this might be Bridges' second goalless affair in four days, but after 79 minutes the steadily influential Hall played a glorious cross field ball to **MASON DOUGHTY**, who cut inside a defender before delivering a superb curling shot into the top far corner.

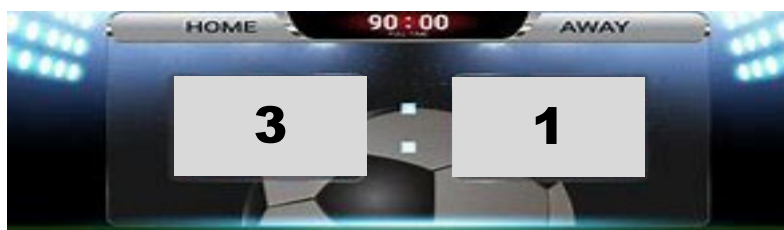

Out of the FA Trophy against a side who had won just once this season and were able to celebrate progressing in this competition for the first time in eight years!

Bridges dominated the first 20 minutes with Brannon O'Neill just failing to reach Curtis Gayler's cross, Staines keeper Joe Ringer tipping Mason Doughty's drilled effort wide and Lee Hall heading onto Callum Chesworth, whose shot was comfortably saved.

A bizarre injury to referee Samuel Read, who seemed to twist his ankle as he was running backwards, proved fatal not just to him but also to Bridges, who were knocked out of their stride by a 15 minute break in proceedings. Sadly, Mr. Read's replacement, assistant Neo Neophytou, was not up to standard for much of the time, and both Michael Wilson and Tadley Bromage can count themselves unfortunate to have picked up yellow cards for accidental infringements.

However, all the blame couldn't be attached to the officials as Bridges allowed themselves to be overrun at times by a Staines side intent on impressing interim manager, Jack Porter. Daniel Smith had read a good through ball shortly before the break, but eight minutes into the second half Wilson lost possession and a swift through ball gave **David Pitt** the opportunity to slide the ball past Smith for the precious opening goal.

Doughty and Hall, who never stopped running and hassling, both created half chances for the visitors, but after 67 minutes substitute Omar Watt Ndongo, only on a minute earlier, created the opening for **Noah Amissah** to finish clinically.

It could have been worse for Bridges five minutes later as Smith saved from Amissah and Ndongo made a hash of the rebound. Bromage headed wide from Gayler's corner as Bridges tried to breathe life into their challenge, but after 77 minutes a foul by the otherwise impressive Rhys Paul on Ben Aubrey led to a mass brawl with those two both being shown red cards.

A foul on Dan Perry after 84 minutes gave Bridges a lifeline as **BRANNON O'NEILL** coolly despatched the resulting penalty, but two minutes later Staines caught them with a swift counter attack that was finished well by **Jack Torbett**.

A couple more needless bookings for Staines and a good free kick by Gayler that was pushed away by Ringer brought the game to its conclusion, and while the home side celebrated a rare victory, Bridges were left to rue on what might have been until that unfortunate injury to the referee.

Bridges are fast becoming the draw specialists this season. They even drew in the FA Cup before being knocked out, but it's now six draws from their ten League games to date, and in this latest tied affair they came from two down at half time to snatch a point.

They almost scored inside four minutes when Brannon O'Neill's corner saw Ryan Brackpool's header blocked by William Godmon before Ben Bacon scooped the rebound over the crossbar. Hythe then took over and Bridges needed Dan Smith to make a good save at the near post and Dan Ferreira to make a brave block to deny Tom Walmsley.

The almost inevitable opening goal than materialised in the 17th minute when Darren Oldaker threaded a ball through for skipper **Charlie Webster** to finish coolly. Bridges tried to respond with Ben Bacon creating a chance for Lee Hall, who drove well but too near to Godmon. O'Neill was denied by the offside flag and then after 33 minutes Oldaker's corner was met by a free header from **Scott Doe** to put Hythe 2-0 ahead at half time.

The second half looked set to continue with Hythe on top as their three best players, Liam Smith, Webster and Oldaker all combined before the latter shot wide of the far post. However, a crude challenge on Curtis Gayler by Alex Brown after 58 minutes led to a mini brawl before Gayler rose to deliver a deep free kick into the goal area for **DAN PERRY** to open his Bridges account with a glancing header.

It was now Bridges in the ascendancy and after 70 minutes O'Neill's corner skidded through a packed goalmouth to reach **RYAN BRACKPOOL** with a header at the far post for the equaliser that hadn't looked likely at half time.

Chances were few at either end after that although Dan Smith made a good block to keep out substitute Kane Philip and another substitute, this time a Bridges one in the shape of Camron Lawson, saw a header go just wide of the near post.

Bridges' defenders were excellent after the interval with Brackpool looking dominant and Giani Ashley subduing the previously dominant Webster and Smith. With Tadley Bromage also in a belligerent mood in the heart of the defence, this proved to be a valuable hard earned point.

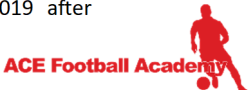

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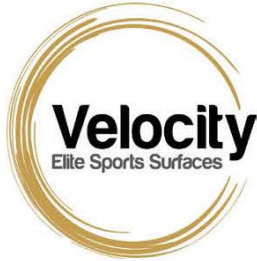

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HAYWARDS HEATH TOWN

The first match to be played by a team representing Haywards Heath was in March 1888, which provided the impetus for the formation of 'Haywards Heath Juniors'. After a brief change of name to 'Excelsior' in 1894, the club adopted the name 'Haywards Heath FC' in 1895.

Without a home ground, the club led a somewhat nomadic existence in its early days, playing most of its games away until 1895 when it was offered the use of the field in South Road which was later to become Victoria Park and the club's home venue until 1952.

Haywards Heath FC lifted its first silverware in 1900 when it won the Sussex Junior Cup and played in the Mid-Sussex League of which it was a founding member. 1901-1906 saw the club finish as runners up in the senior division in four of its first five seasons, then division 2 winners in 1911-12 after relegation in 1908. In 1919-20 Haywards Heath were Mid-Sussex League champions without losing a game. They won the title again in 1922-23 and went on to retain it for the next two seasons, losing only one match in each season.

In 1926 the club transferred to the Brighton, Hove & District League and, after winning the league title at the very first attempt, joined the Sussex County League the following year. The first five seasons in the County League (1926-1932) saw the club finish in the top four but they were sadly to finish bottom of the league in the 1932-33 season.

In 1941-42, the club were winners of the Sussex Senior Cup and, after the war, were the league's Eastern Division winners of 1945-46. A single division league was re-introduced the following year which the club won in both 1949-50 and again in 1950-51.

In 1952 the club finally moved from Victoria Park to the newly finished Hanbury Stadium which enabled it to join the Metropolitan League which included the reserve sides of professional clubs such as West Ham, Tottenham, Chelsea and Arsenal. After a promising first season finishing in fifth place, the club struggled against the professional opposition and, finishing bottom in 1960-61, elected to re-join the Sussex County League.

The Division 1 title was won in 1969-70 and the League Cup in 1972-73. The club was also runners-up in 1974-75 but were relegated at the end of the 1979-80 season. The Division 2 Cup was won in 1983-84 and, as runners-up in 1985-86, the club again gained promotion back into the senior division.

In 1988, our centennial year, the present name of Haywards Heath Town Football Club was adopted in to reflect the 'town' status of Haywards Heath itself.

Two successive relegations in 1992 and 1993 saw the club drop into the third division where they won the Division 3 Cup in 2000-01. The following year as Division 3 runners-up, HHTFC were promoted back to Division 2 but were again relegated after only one season. Heath won the Division 3 Cup in 2008-09 and after finishing as runners-up in 2012-13 gained promotion back into Division 2.

On the rebranding of the Sussex County League to the Southern Combination Football League in 2015, the 2nd division was renamed Division 1 and the title was won that first season, earning Haywards Heath Town FC promotion to the Premier Division. The club finished top of the Premier division the following season (2016-17) and were due to be promoted to the Isthmian League.

Unfortunately, promotion was denied following a nine-point deduction, due to an inadvertent off-field administrative error, which saw the championship awarded elsewhere. The club however, responded in style by winning the Premier Division again in the 2017-18 season, this time adding the Peter Bentley League Challenge Cup.

Heath enjoyed a successful 2018-19 debut in the Isthmian League, finishing in a very respectable fifth position which qualified them for the play-offs at the first attempt. They were eliminated by Horsham who went on to win promotion to the Premier Division.

As well as achieving the club's highest ever finishing position in the non-league football pyramid, Shaun Saunders' squad also reached the final of the Sussex RUR Cup and the semi-finals of the Sussex County Senior Cup. Our Senior Cup run included a famous away win at Crawley Town.

Last season the club appeared to be struggling at the half way stage but this was in part due to a good run in the FA Trophy. Once this distraction was ended by Royston Town our league form looked up. Prior to our final game against Phoenix Sports we had won four in a row. The rest, is as they say history, because a few days later football was rightly suspended.

After one of the longest between season breaks for many a year, we are looking forward to playing again and hopefully challenging at the top of the table.
