Next up is the FA Trophy Preliminary Round next Saturday (10th September), with a home fixture to Hullbridge Sports, before getting back to League action at home to local neighbours, East Grinstead Town.

In the meantime, our U18s had great success in the FA Youth Cup on Tuesday evening (30th August), beating Steyning Town 7-0 – two goals from each of Connor Colcutt and Ethan Cowdrey and one from each of Yassin Ainine, Deren Bedir and Elliot Hanslow. We now await our opponents in the draw for the First Qualifying Round which is to be played the week commencing 12th September.

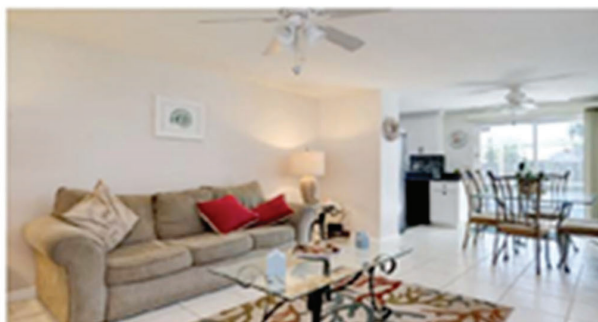

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HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faiil stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faiil stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was Ryan Gayler appointed as the new manager for the U23s (Development Squad), assisted by Tom Hayward and Chris Irving, and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 sees Jamie Crellin taking over as First Team Manager, with both Danny Lee and Lee Cole (former Academy manager and coach) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager and First Team coach respectively. The U23s (Development Squad) has been disbanded, but we will have an additional U18s playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays.

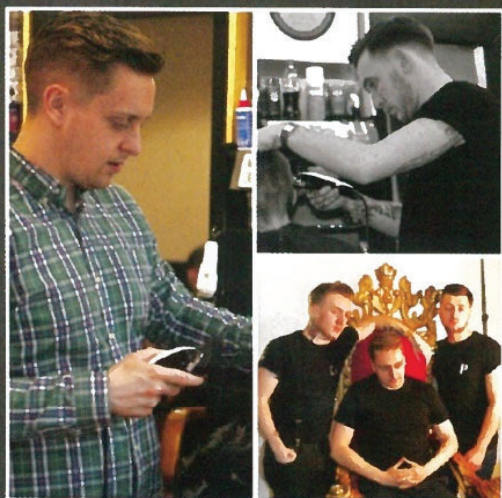

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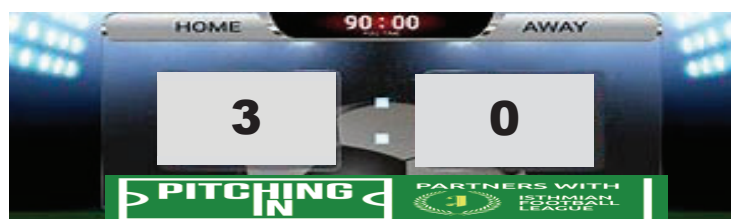

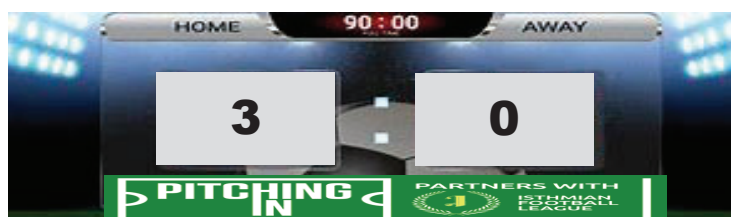
That's two wins from three games so far for Three Bridges leaving them in 4th place in the Isthmian South East Division.

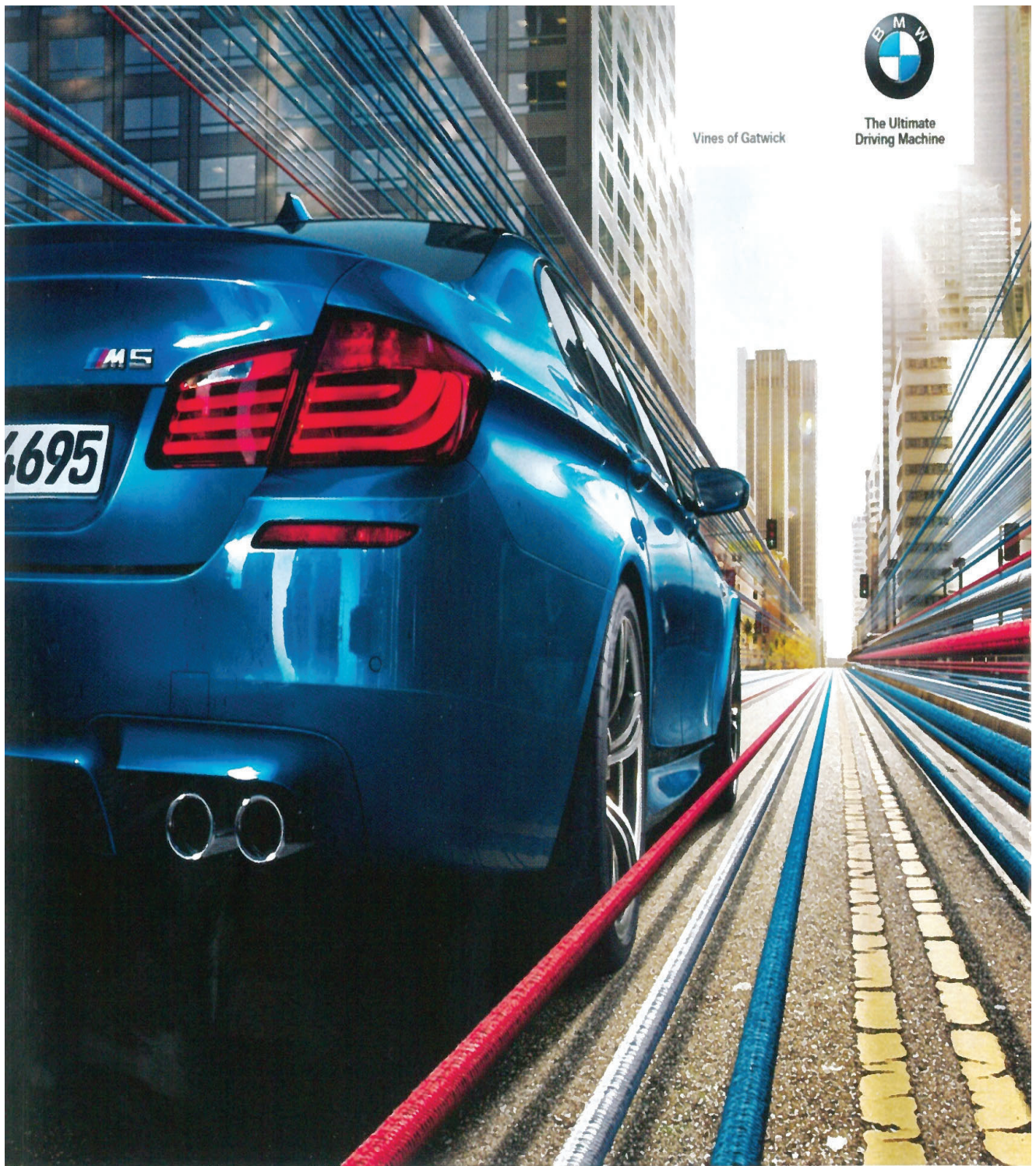

ERITH TOWN FC

Formed in 1956 as Woolwich Town, the club initially competed in the London Metropolitan Sunday League, winning the Senior Section Championship in 1965/66, 1970/71 and 1974/75.

The club briefly changed their name to Woolwich Heathway but reverted back within a year and in 1991 the club made the switch to Saturday football when they joined the London Spartan League Division Two. They also moved from Woolwich Barracks Stadium to share with Greenwich Borough FC.

Despite finishing 9th, the club went up to Division One as a result of a restructure in 1992/93. In 1994/5 the Dockers finished as runners-up in the London Intermediate Cup and London Spartan League Intermediate Cup.

The summer of 1995 saw the club attain senior status and promotion to the London Spartan League Premier Division. In October of 1995 the club moved from Greenwich to Erith Stadium.

In March 1996 the club were given permission to cross the pyramid and tendered their resignation to the Spartan League to join the Kent League for 1996/97. They also played in the FA Vase for the first time, losing 4-0 at home to Lewes in the first qualifying round.

From June 1997 the club reflected their new location by changing name to Erith Town and made their bow in the FA Cup, losing 3-0 to Harlow Town in the 1997/98 season.

The following season the Dockers moved back to Greenwich Borough for a year while extensive building work took place at the Stadium.

After struggling in the lower reaches of the League for three seasons, the return to Erith in 1999/2000 saw the Dockers celebrate the new Millennium with a then best seventh place in the League and a place in the London Senior Cup Final under manager Micky Watts, although losing 5-1 to Bedfont.

John Adams took over from Watts in 2002/03 and over the next few years the club had several changes of manager before former Fisher Athletic player, Mark Tompkins, took the reins following a poor start to 2006/07. The club saw an upturn in fortunes and the following season 'Tommo' guided the club to fifth in the Kent League. He also brought the club their first silverware as a senior club, lifting the Kent League Cup with a 1-0 win over favourites Hythe Town at Folkestone Invicta.

Tompkins resigned on the eve of 2008/09 and his place was taken by Steve O'Boyle who took the Dockers back to the Kent League Cup Final for a second season. Despite drawing 1-1 after extra time against Croydon, the Dockers lost 3-1 on penalties.

O'Boyle resigned in October of 2010 and was replaced by his assistant Tony Russell who guided the club to a third successive mid-table finish and brought success as the club lifted the Kent Senior Trophy for the first time with a 3-1 win over Tunbridge Wells in the Final.

Having achieved a new best of fourth the following season, Russell departed for neighbours VCD Athletic with Erith Town top of the League in November 2012 and after a brief spell with James Collins in charge, Mark Tompkins returned to take the Dockers to new personal best of third spot.

The club entered a ground share arrangement at Cray Valley Football Club at the start of 2013-14 where they recorded a second successive third place in the League, with their best ever League record before departing.

A troubled 2014-15 season saw both Simon Austin and Ennio Gonnella manage the club prior to appointment of joint managers Martin and Joe Ford who steered the club to safety in a Houdini-style escape from relegation on the last day of the season. Seven points adrift with three games remaining the father and son team saw their young side win the final three games to climb off the foot of the table.

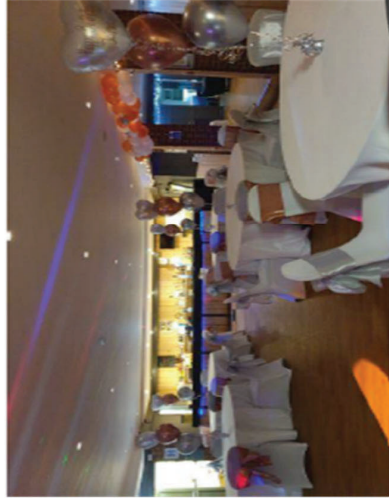
An improved finish of 13th came in 2015-16, with the club announcing a return to the Borough of Bexley with a two season ground share agreement at VCD Athletic's Oakwood ground starting in 2016-17.

Two further seasons of struggle followed before the summer takeover by local businessman Mark Deveney, immediately appointing former owner Albert Putnam as President for his work as player, manager and Chairman in over 50 years with the club.

Mark moved quickly to bring in Adam Woodwood from SCEFL Division One Champions Glebe, expanded the club committee as well as made strides to take Erith back to their own town.

2107-18 on the field saw a 17th place League finish but a return to the Stadium in 2018-19 inspired the Dockers to an excellent ending position of 6th.

2019/20 ended early, due to Coronavirus, as did the following campaign so The Dockers now go into 2021/22 looking to continue our progression both on and off the field.
