Good afternoon and welcome for this FA Cup Third Qualifying Round match and a special warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of **HEREFORD FC** today. We also welcome just as warmly today's match officials.

This is the first time we have reached this stage of this famous competition, and today's game marks our sixth in this year's Cup run already! The replay win here against Lewes will remain in the memory for some time, but today sees a new challenge for us against a team from the National League North.

Hereford, of course, have had memorable moments of their own in the FA Cup, most notably back in February 1972 when – as Hereford United – they beat Newcastle United 2-1 in a home replay in the Third Round Proper. The much shown stunner from Ronnie Radford that levelled the scores eight minutes from the end of normal time remains a classic, but let's not forget the extra time winner from Ricky George either.

Hereford currently sit 16th in the National League North table, earning 12 points from 10 games. Their wins include 2-0 at home to Buxton and 1-0 away to Chester, but their most recent success came just last Saturday when they won 3-0 at home to Blyth Spartans. Three draws came via a 3-3 at home to Spennymoor Town, 1-1 away to Alfreton Town and a 0-0 draw at home to Leamington on Tuesday night. Their only home setback was 1-3 against Gloucester City, whilst away they have lost 2-1 at Brackley Town, 1-0 at Scarborough and 3-1 at Banbury United.

If today's game needs a replay, that will take place at Edgar Street on Tuesday evening (4th October).

We return to League action at Chichester City next Saturday, and the next fixture here is against East Grinstead Town on Tuesday 11th October.

Meanwhile, our U18s also marched through to the Third Qualifying Round of the FA Youth Cup on Tuesday (27th September), beating Dorking Wanderers 2-4 away. Two goals from captain, Conner Colcutt, and one from each of Marley Bigg and Regan Jeffery sealed the win.

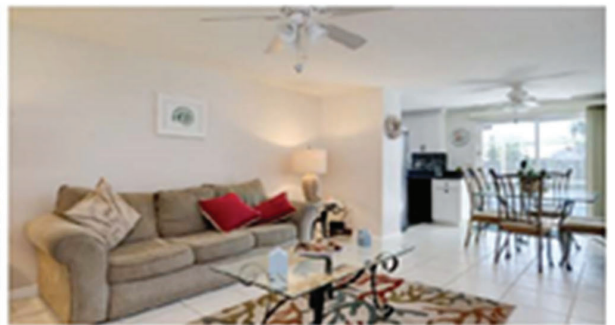

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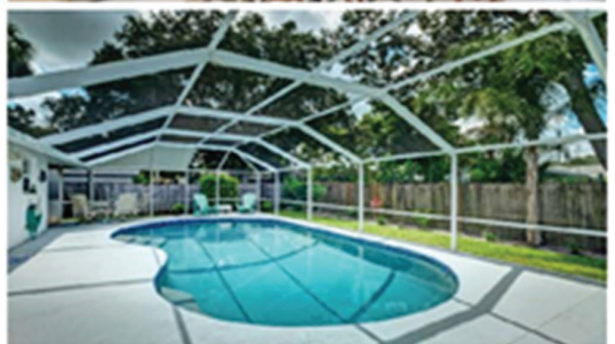

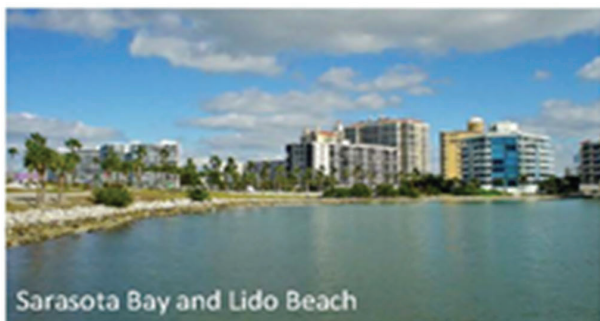

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HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faiil stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faiil stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was Ryan Gayler appointed as the new manager for the U23s (Development Squad), assisted by Tom Hayward and Chris Irving, and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 sees Jamie Crellin taking over as First Team Manager, with both Danny Lee and Lee Cole (former Academy manager and coach) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager and First Team coach respectively. The U23s (Development Squad) has been disbanded, but we will have an additional U18s playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays.

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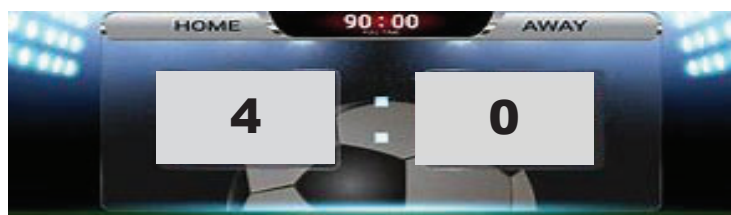

After narrowly missing out on victory at Lewes on Saturday afternoon, Three Bridges put together a demolition job of the Isthmian Premier Division club, winning 4-0 in the replay and booking their place in the Third Qualifying Round of the FA Cup for the first time in club history.

Bridges started the brighter, with top goalscorer Kieron Pamment going close with three chances in the opening half hour as Lewes looked noticeably rattled by the occasion. The busy Kevin Rivera also saw a shot well saved by Lewis Carey in the away team goal, whilst Callum Donaghey, Billy Irving and Leo Anderson all stood strong in defence at the other end of the pitch.

The home side deservedly took the lead just short of half-time, when Rivera put a ball in to the back post area after a winding run and **CAMERON LAWSON** was on hand unmarked to slot home from 6 yards out.

The second-half began in similar fashion, with Bridges having most of the play and Irving going close with a header from a Curtis Gayler free-kick. but it was a spell of 3 goals in 17 minutes that won this cup time in superb fashion though, as Bridges put Lewes to the sword and then some.

First Rivera assisted **CAMERON LAWSON** once again, with the young left winger slotting his shot through Carey's legs in the 53rd minute to double the Bridges lead. **KIERON PAMMENT** then got on the score sheet, smashing the ball past Carey and a helpless defender on the line on the hour mark. Huge credit for the goal must however go to captain Brannon O'Neill, who fought tirelessly to keep the ball alive in the box before putting it on a plate for the Bridges number 9.

The win was then all but secured on the 66th minute, as the brilliant **KEVIN RIVERA** was played through and placed his shot past Carey into the bottom right hand corner of the goal to send a shocked Jubilee Field into scenes of delirium.

Lewes very rarely threatened, but when they did in the 87th minute, Leo Anderson was on hand to stop Ronan Silva's shot when he looked certain to score.

At full-time there were scenes of unbridled joy, as Jamie Crellin and Danny Lee's team made history and setup a home tie with National League North side Hereford FC in the next round, due to be played on the weekend 30 September to 3 October.

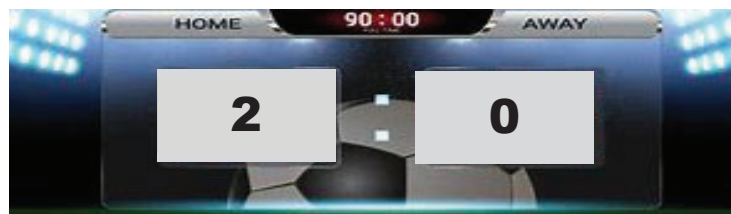

After the highs of the two Lewes games in the FA Cup last Saturday and Tuesday evening it was always going to be a big ask to raise those levels even higher against a good Ashford United side. A couple of forced changes to the Three Bridges starting line-up and a difficult playing surface added to the task of getting through to the next round of the FA Trophy.

The early half chances of the game fell to Ashford through a mixture of good play and unforced mistakes by the normally dependable Bridges back line. Bridges also had a couple of early opportunities going forward but they really were not threatening enough to cause any change in the score.

On 28 minutes Billy Irving was forced to leave the field following an awkward landing and he was replaced by Tressor Difika. The best chance of the half fell to Ashford United just before half time but they failed to convert from just 4 yards out, blazing over the bar.

The second half began with Ashford coming out strong and a long ball from their own half on 47 minutes fell to **GEORGE NIKAJ** who converted past Leo Anderson in the Bridges goal at the second attempt, despite possibly looking offside in the build up. Ashford then hit the Bridges post in the 50th minute following a penalty box scramble and that should have acted as a warning.

It was, therefore, no surprise when **GARY LOCKYER** doubled Ashford's lead on 67 minutes following a dangerous cross into the area. Three Bridges had a couple of half chances to get back in the game but everything they seemed to try just didn't work out and disappointingly did not have one attempt on the Ashford goal throughout the whole game.

To add insult to injury a clumsy but innocuous-looking coming together in the 92nd minute resulted in substitute, Tressor Difika, being shown what appeared to be a harsh straight red card for a professional foul.

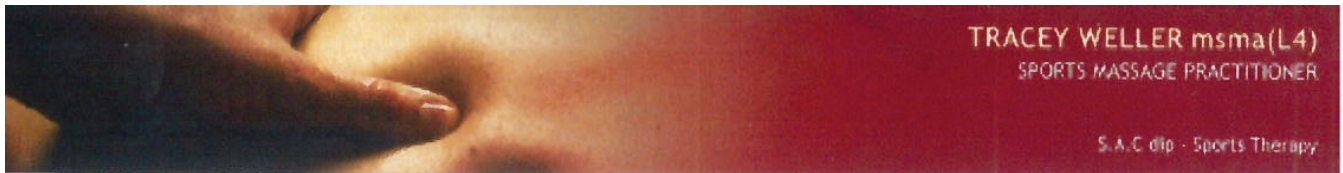

HEREFORD FC

Born out of the ashes of Hereford United, Hereford FC were placed in the Midland Football League for the 2015/16 season after the former club folded in December 2014.

Hereford United - famed for the 1972 FA Cup victory over Newcastle United and that Ronnie Radford goal – had been blighted by financial issues for the final years of their existence, facing winding up petitions in the Court nearly twenty times during the last two years.

The club's varying owners were in open disagreement with the majority of the support over the final few months, and the end came as a relief to many, albeit tinged with much sadness.

Playing out of the historic Edgar Street Athletic Ground that hosted a string of Hereford clubs in the 1920s, before Hereford United was formed from a merger of local sides, the new club have retained the nickname The Bulls, the white shirts, and the Herefordshire Bull on the club crest, even parading the real thing at their first competitive match in August and later at Wembley for the FA Vase Final.

In the first season The Bulls started writing their own history by setting a string of Midland Football League attendance records, starting with their first game, and breaking ground attendance records at several away grounds as they took the Midland Football League double. That season also saw The Bulls win the Herefordshire FA County Challenge Cup, before finishing off with taking over 21,000 supporters to Wembley in the FA Vase Final.

The second season saw Hereford race to the Southern League South & West title, winning the league with a total of 107 points, beating second place Salisbury by 18 points. The 2016/17 season also saw The Bulls win the Herefordshire FA Challenge cup for the second season in a row, as well as beating the winners of the Southern League Central division, Royston Town, in the end of season 'Champions' vs 'Champions' match.

The Bulls completed a hat-trick of promotions in the 2017/18 season, but King's Lynn and Kettering made sure it wasn't an easy ride, running The Bulls close for the title. Hereford finally secured the league with three games to spare.

The 2017/18 season also saw The Bulls enjoy their best-ever run in the FA Cup since forming in 2015. Beating AFC Telford in the 1st Round Proper, Hereford then held League 1 Fleetwood to a 1-1 draw at Highbury, before sadly losing the replay at Edgar Street, a game that was screened live on BT Sport. The Bulls were the last surviving non-league side left in the competition.

The 2019/20 season saw Hereford face their toughest season to date, playing against the likes of former Football League sides, Stockport, Kidderminster, York, Darlington and Chester in the National League North.

It was a challenging season that saw Peter Beadle replaced by Tim Harris (Head of Football) and Marc Richards (Head Coach) as The Bulls reorganised their footballing structure to better prepare them for future seasons. The primary objective for the first season in the National League North was to consolidate and that job was completed with The Bulls ending the season in 17th place.

Now in a much stronger position, The Bulls have made some impressive acquisitions ahead of the 2019/20 season, with the arrival of Reece Styche from Alfreton, Jordan Nicholson from Darlington and Brandon Hall from Kidderminster to name just three.

MANAGEMENT

JOSH GOWLING – Manager: After joining Hereford FC as a player in December 2018, Josh took up the reins as the Bulls interim-manager a little over a year later. Impressing during a short-spell alongside assistant Steve Burr, the experienced central defender was offered the role permanently in the summer of 2020. He has a psychology degree and a UEFA B licence, in addition to a plethora of other coaching badges and qualifications, as he begins his first season as a club manager. Gowing is excited by the opportunity here at Edgar Street, and is intent on moving the club forward, progressing on a sustainable basis. It is a challenge which he is relishing.

Coventry born Josh, began his playing career at West Bromwich Albion prior to a year with Herfølge Boldklub in Denmark. Upon returning to the UK he signed for Bournemouth where he established himself in the Football League. After three seasons on the south-coast he had a short spell at Carlisle before moving on loan to Edgar Street during the 2008/2009 season. Josh chalked up 56 appearances for Gillingham before a year at Lincoln saw him feature in his 250th first team game. He then moved to Kidderminster on deadline day in August 2012 and enjoyed a very successful time at the Harriers first becoming captain in 2014, before taking up a player-coach role too. Josh was selected for the Conference Team of the Year in the 2012-2013 season. In March 2015 he linked up with Grimsby Town, initially on loan, and played in the Mariners 3-1 victory over Forest Green Rovers in the 2016 National League play-off final at Wembley. His performances gained him a place in the 2015-2016 National League Team of the Year. After a season with Torquay United, and a loan spell at Alfreton, he then joined Hereford, and has over 500 first team appearances under his belt.

STEVE BURR: Assistant Manager: Steve is one of the most respected managers of non-league football, and has agreed to join Hereford as assistant to Josh Gowing, forging a new managerial partnership here at Edgar Street ahead of the 2020/2021 season. He guided Hucknall and Northwich Victoria to level six championships, and has vast experience, which includes a successful period alongside Paul Fairclough when coaching the England 'C' squad.

A striker in his playing days he began his career at Stafford Rangers, but moved to a very successful spell with Macclesfield Town in 1984, becoming their top scorer, and netting a hat-trick in an FA Cup match. His other playing clubs include Hednesford Town, Nuneaton Borough and Halifax Town. Nuneaton saw him take on a player-manager role, until he moved fully into management in 2001. His next appointment proved his credentials, as he took Hucknall Town to the top of the Unibond League. Steve then steered Northwich back into the Conference, before joining Stalybridge Celtic in 2007, building a side with young players from a level below, frequently unearthing talent and providing them with opportunities to develop their careers. He became the manager of Kidderminster Harriers in the winter of 2009/10, and proceeded to build a squad which competed for a play-off position on a regular basis. Indeed, he guided the club to the runners up spot in the 2011/12 season only to lose out on promotion to Wrexham. He later managed Southport, Chester and Stafford Rangers, before becoming the senior club scout at Fleetwood Town in July 2019.



HEREFORD FC

BRADLEY WADE: The talented and agile 'keeper joined The Bulls in the summer of 2022 from Rochdale, for whom he emerged through the ranks before having loan spells with the likes of Barrow, Ramsbottom United and Guiseley. Whilst he was unable to make the breakthrough into the first-team at Spotland, it was his performances during three loan spells at Guiseley that started to alert attention in the Gloucester-born custodian.

YAN KLUKOWSKI: The player-coach is a calming influence whose early career saw him play in America and Canada before returning to these shores with former club Chippenham Town. He was then snapped up by Forest Green Rovers from Larkhall Athletic and his career really took off as he served the likes of Newport County, York City, Torquay United, Kidderminster Harriers and Hungerford Town.

MARK DERRICOTT: The emerging defender has been promoted from the U18 team following a number of assured displays that belied his tender years. His progress continued during the pre-season games and big things are expected of the local lad who plays with an abundance of energy.

HARRISON SUMMERS: The talented young front-runner was part of the youth set-up before moving on to Westfields and then returning to The Bulls following the formation of a new U18 team. His progress was such that he was promoted into the first-team at the start of the 2022-23 season.

JACK EVANS: An accomplished full-back who started his career with Blackburn Rovers before moving on to Forest Green Rovers in 2020. Whilst there he had loan spells at AFC Fylde and Gloucester City before joining The Bulls on a permanent deal following a successful trial.

ORRIN PENDLEY: A robust, powerful and no-nonsense central defender who joined The Bulls in July 2022. He previously served the likes of Highgate United, Redditch United, Kettering Town, Rushall Olympic and Tamworth, cementing his place as one of the top defenders at Southern League Premier level. This will be his first taste of life at this level and he is determined to grab it and show what he is capable of. Joined Coalville Town on a dual registration in September 2022.

THIERRY LATTY-FAIRWETHER: The talented left-back joined The Bulls from League One Burton Albion in July 2022, having impressed during our early pre-season games. An athletic performer, he was part of the Nottingham Forest Academy before making the switch to The Brewers where his progress continued and he was able to gain senior experience from loan spells with the likes of Grantham Town and Guiseley.

ZAK LILLY: Having established himself as a central defender with previous club, AFC Telford United, he turned down a new contract offer in favour of making the switch to Edgar Street in the summer of 2022. It was at AFC Telford United where he emerged onto the senior stage and loan spells with Leamington, Rushall Olympic, Romulus and Tamworth gave him a good grounding into competitive senior action.

JARED HODGKISS: The club captain has plenty of experience and know-how from a long career in the game which began within the youth ranks at West Bromwich Albion. During his time at The Hawthorns he was loaned out to Aberdeen and Northampton Town before joining Forest Green Rovers on a permanent basis in 2009 and becoming a popular figure. He then moved on to Kidderminster Harriers, Torquay United (on loan) and Macclesfield Town, from where The Bulls secured his services in the summer of 2019.

LUKE HAINES: A player of undoubted talent and ability who has become a firm favourite for his never-say-die approach and commitment since joining the club on a permanent basis from Swindon Town in the summer of 2021 following a couple of previous loan spells. Learning his trade whilst coming up through The Robins' ranks, his progress has continued at a pace since his arrival at Edgar Street and he is now a key member of the team.

JETHRO HANSEN: A hard-working defensive midfielder who started his career as a youngster at Millwall and has gone on to serve Leatherhead. He joined The Bulls following a successful trial spell during the summer of 2022.

KANE THOMPSON-SOMMERS: A skilful and intelligent central midfielder who has cut his football teeth within the youth ranks at Birmingham City. He had a loan spell at Woking last term and was snapped up by The Bulls having played against them as a trialist in pre-season for Cardiff City.

HARRY PINCHARD: A player who possesses plenty of skill and ability on the ball, he is able to make things happen. He was plucked from the youth ranks at Cardiff City in the summer of 2021 and went on to adapt well to the demands of senior football before injury halted his progress. He is expected to have a key role to play for The Bulls during the campaign ahead.

RYAN LLOYD: A highly consistent performer who goes about his business efficiently and with the assurance of someone who has competed at a higher level. He joined the club from Port Vale in October 2020, having started his career with the Valiants before also turning out for Tamworth (on loan), Chester and Macclesfield Town.

LEKAN OSIDEKO: The lively front-runner was snapped up following a highly successful trial spell in the summer of 2022 where he was a regular on the scoresheet. He joined the club having previously served Chatham Town, where he was a popular figure and key member of their forward line. Joined Redditch United on a dual registration in September 2022.

AARON AMADI-HOLLOWAY: A talented striker who started his career within the Bristol City youth set-up before going on to play over 50 games for Wycombe Wanderers. He then spent four seasons in League One with Oldham Athletic, Fleetwood Town and Shrewsbury Town as well as having spells in Australia and India prior to returning to these shores with Barrow. An eve of season capture whose higher-level experience will prove vital.

TYRONE BARNETT: The experienced front-runner joined The Bulls in the summer of 2022 from Eastleigh. His football journey began two decades ago within the youth ranks at West Bromwich Albion but it was at Rushall Olympic where he first made his mark on the senior game and saw him serve AFC Telford United, Willenhall Town and Hednesford Town before Macclesfield Town gave him his League chance. From there he went to Crawley Town before Peterborough United paid a six-figure fee for his services and then he went on to Ipswich Town, Bristol City, Oxford United, Peterborough United (again), Shrewsbury Town, Southend United (on loan), AFC Wimbledon, Port Vale and Cheltenham Town.

MILES STOREY: A player with real presence whose strength and pace make him a difficult opponent as he gets forward. His career started at Swindon Town where he was loaned out to the likes of Salisbury City, Shrewsbury Town, Portsmouth, Newport County and Inverness Caledonian Thistle during his formative years. Moving north of the border with Aberdeen in 2016, he then served Partick Thistle before returning to Inverness, from where The Bulls snapped him up in readiness for the 2021-22 campaign.

RYAN MCLEAN: A wide-man of outstanding pace who is comfortable on the ball and provides excellent delivery. He has made the step up from Newcastle Town to become a real favourite amongst the fans with some high octane displays.

RYAN PRICE: The youngster is an assured and level-headed defender whose progress for the U18s was rewarded with promotion into the first-team squad. Having skippered the U18s, he is a natural leader and a well-respected figure.

JAMES CATON: The experienced wide-man joined the club in September 2022 following a successful trial spell. He has Football League experience under his belt from spells at the likes of Blackpool, Accrington Stanley (loan), Shrewsbury Town and Mansfield Town (loan). He was most recently with Dover Athletic and has also served the likes of Southport and Darlington.

JORDAN THOMPSON: The talented defender joined the club in September 2022. He came through the ranks at Coventry City before signing his first professional contract with the club in 2017. Loan spells at Barrow, Wrexham and Solihull Moors followed before he joined Gloucester City on a permanent basis where his no-nonsense and assured style served the club well.

DINO VISSER: The South Africa-born goalkeeper joined the club in September 2022. He began his career in his homeland with the likes of Platinum Stars, Bloemfontein Celtic, Black Leopards, Polokwane City and Santos. Moving to England in 2019, he initially joined Exeter City before moving on to Crewe Alexandra for a short spell. He then linked up with Port Vale where injury halted his progress.

JACK HOLMES: A player of undoubted talent and ability who can make things happen from the middle of the park and looks to get forward at every opportunity. He joined the club in September 2022 having started the season in fine form for Halesowen Town, where he had been on The Bulls' radar for some time.

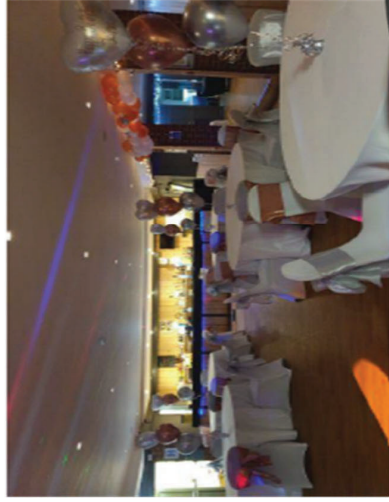
