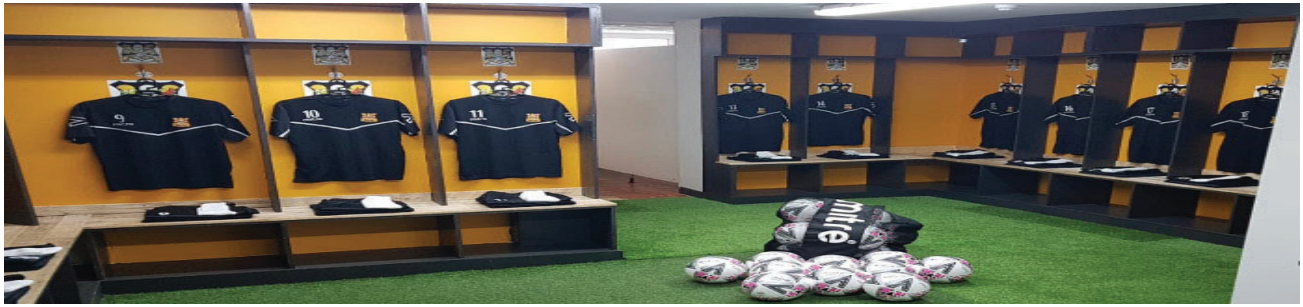

Good evening everyone and welcome to the Jubilee Field this evening for this FA Cup Second Qualifying Round replay. We warmly welcome our visitors from **LEWES FC** – players, officials and supporters alike – and also warmly welcome tonight's match officials.

After last Saturday's 1-1 draw at the Dripping Pan, tonight's match goes to a finish one way or another. If the scores are level at the end of 90 minutes, there will be extra time and then potentially a penalty shoot-out.

Lewes currently sit 8th in the Premier Division of the Isthmian League with nine points from six games, their only defeat being a 0-2 reverse away to Horsham. We need to be very guarded in tonight's replay though as they were also taken to a replay by Sheppey United in the First Qualifying Round. Sheppey actually led 0-2 in the first game at home, but a 2-2 draw brought them back to Lewes, who turned out 8-0 winners on the night. Much vaunted striker Joe Taylor scored five that night, including a hat trick of penalties.

We've only played four League games so far as we've been busy in both the FA Cup and FA Trophy, and this Saturday sees us travel to Ashford United in the Second Qualifying Round of the Trophy.

The League game away to Ashford, which was originally scheduled for three days ago, is now set for Tuesday, 25th October, and the match at home to East Grinstead Town, which was originally scheduled for tonight, has yet to be rearranged at time of writing these notes.

Meanwhile, our U18s had another great result beating East Preston 0-4 away in the First Qualifying Round of the FA Youth Cup. They now face Dorking Wanderers away in the next round which is due to be played week commencing 26 September.

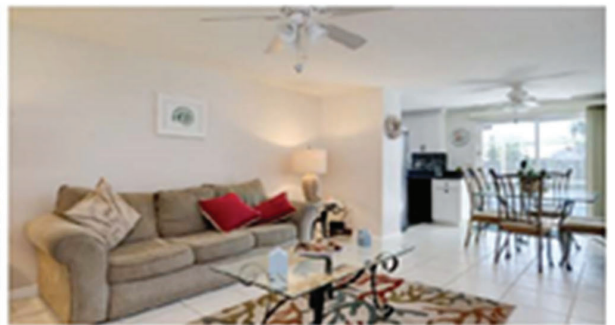

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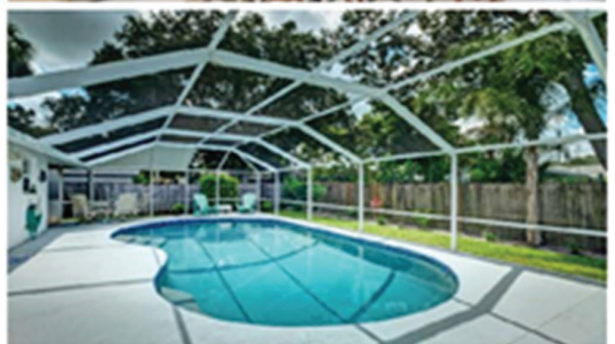

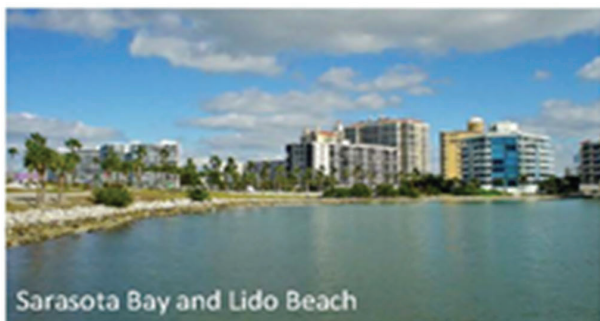

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HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faiil stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faiil stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was Ryan Gayler appointed as the new manager for the U23s (Development Squad), assisted by Tom Hayward and Chris Irving, and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 sees Jamie Crellin taking over as First Team Manager, with both Danny Lee and Lee Cole (former Academy manager and coach) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager and First Team coach respectively. The U23s (Development Squad) has been disbanded, but we will have an additional U18s playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays.

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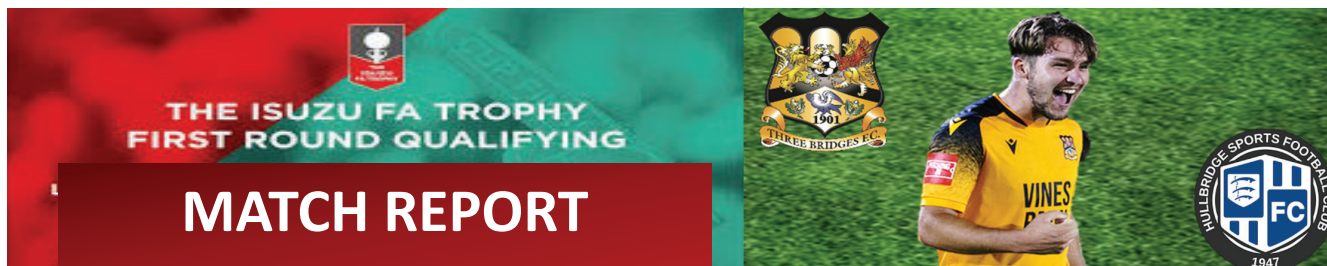


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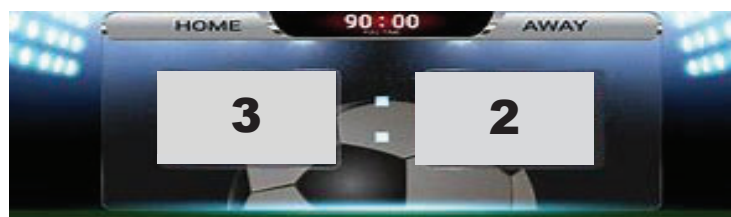

What a difference the second half became as the visitors made two half time changes, with one of them – **ANISIUS LEWIS** – finding himself unmarked in front of goal to meet a cross and head home in the 52nd minute! Hullbridge suddenly looked a half decent side and Bridges had to rely on occasional breaks, Pamment heading wide from a Gayler cross being the nearest they came to bring sighs of relief for the home supporters.

After 81 minutes Hullbridge's efforts paid off as a free kick from wide was claimed by **EMMANUEL FOLARIN**. Nerves were being shredded as George Smith didn't connect well and left Anderson a simple save as the referee indicated five additional minutes. Somehow, though, Bridges held on and can now look forward to an away tie with Ashford United on Saturday 24th September.





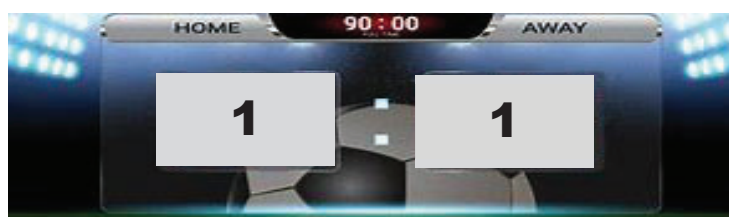

Bridges came so close to causing an FA Cup upset away to Isthmian League Premier Division Lewes, whose equalising goal came two minutes into the six added before the final whistle.

Cameron Lawson didn't quite connect with an early cross as Bridges decided to show no inferiority complex, but it needed the first of a number of fine saves by Leo Anderson to keep out the dangerous Bradley Pritchard's free kick inside seven minutes.

Lawson fired wide from an Alex Barbary cross and a move involving Lawson and Kieron Pamment ended with a fierce effort by Brannon O'Neill that was tipped away by Lewis Carey. Another good quick fire break then saw Barbary go close after good work by Lawson and Curtis Gayler.

Lewes ended the first half dangerously with a good move culminating in Razz Coleman De-Graft firing across goal but wide, and Billy Irving cleared another effort off the line.

Lawson and O'Neill were both involved again before Pamment stung the hands of Carey, but after 54 minutes Bridges went ahead when Gayler played a lovely ball inside to **KIERON PAMMENT**, who scored at the second attempt.

Pamment came close again from Barbary's neat pass, but Anderson then had to make an excellent block to keep out Ronan Silva. Irving and Callum Donaghey were proving to be rocks in the heart of Bridges' defence, but Gayler almost caught the home defence napping with a long range effort that Carey was happy to see go wide.

Lewes were however carving out great chances which were either saved or missed, but in the 92nd minute **RAZZ COLEMAN DE-GRAFT** found himself on the edge of the box for a clinical finish to earn a replay.

LEWES FC

The Early Years: Lewes Football Club was formed following a meeting at The Royal Oak pub on 23 September 1885. For the first eight years, the players wore light green shirts which were designed to reflect the scenery of the surrounding South Downs, but black and red finally became the club colours in 1893.

The club has played at the Dripping Pan ever since, apart from a couple of seasons prior to the First World War when the club was banished to the adjoining Convent Field. The early years of the club produced only mediocre results and successes were few and far between. In 1920, Lewes became founder members of the Sussex County League.

1960s: Progress was slow and despite four runners-up places, by the 1960s Lewes had only one Sussex RUR Cup win to their name. In 1965, the club's fortunes changed dramatically, winning the County League title for the first time with a massive nine-point lead over runners-up Lancing, as well as both the RUR and Sussex Senior Cups.

Lewes became members of the Athenian League and after winning the Division 2 title in 1968, promotion to the Premier Division was gained just two years later when the Division 1 title was snatched from Boreham Wood, with a further Sussex Senior Cup triumph added in 1971. Six years later, the club entered the newly expanded Isthmian League.

1980s: Promotion to Division 1 soon followed although two sixth-place finishes in 1982 and 1989 were the highest positions attained in Division 1. During that time, Lewes reached the final of the Sussex Senior Cup on three occasions, and won the trophy in 1984/85.

1990s: Disaster struck in 1990/91 when Lewes were relegated for the first time in their history. An immediate return as runners-up to Purfleet followed, but that success was short-lived and relegation in successive years meant that by the 1994/95 season the club was down in Division Three.

The slide continued and the first season in the basement division would have been the last in the league if it hadn't been for Cove who conveniently propped-up the league and saved Lewes from automatic demotion.

The club survived rather than thrived until the 1998/99 season when Jimmy Quinn joined as manager, and at the first attempt missed out on promotion by just one place. Midway through the 1999/2000 season Martin Elliott and a new board of Directors stepped in and immediately the fortunes of the club began to improve, with the capture of the Sussex Senior Cup in 2001 following victory over Bognor Regis.

Naughties (2000s): There was mixed news on the pitch. The pinnacle of the Men's team's achievement, and what a pinnacle, was to gain promotion to the top of the non-League pyramid in 2007/8. However, the Rooks only lasted one season in the top flight as the Global Credit Crisis hit and funds dried up. The Rooks' new economic reality saw them drop down the divisions.

However, a brand new Women's team was started by Jacquie Agnew and underwent a dramatic rise from park football to the Women's Combination.

A New Dawn (2010s): Behind the scenes, a group of six supporters calling themselves Rooks125 were working hard to take the club into community ownership having witnessed the serious financial problems that had befallen the club, despite the owners' best efforts.

Finally on July 8th 2010, Lewes FC was officially transferred out of private ownership into a mass-ownership Community Benefit Society called Lewes Community Football Club, consisting of benefactors and members of the former Management Committee.

The six members of Rooks125 formed the inaugural Executive Board, working as volunteers to install improved working practices and procedures during the season before planning to open up the wider ownership of LCFC to all the club's supporters in 2011/12. The first chairman of the Community Club was appointed in 2013 with club legend Terry Parris taking up the position. Terry was succeeded by Stuart Fuller in 2015. All Board positions now are elected by the whole Ownership base.

In the summer of 2017 the club hit the headlines globally when it announced that it would pay our Men's and Women's squads the same – a first for any semi/professional club in the world. Under the Equality FC banner, the club attracted a number of partners who shared the same beliefs and vision for gender equality in sport.

On the pitch, restricted resources saw the team drop two Leagues, down to Step 4 but under Darren Freeman they gained promotion as runners-up in the Isthmian League South in 2017/18, then came within a whisker of a play-off spot in the Isthmian Premier the following season.

The Lewes Women's side were given a place in the inaugural Women's Championship, the second tier of English football playing alongside sides such as Manchester United, Leicester City and Tottenham Hotspur. In December 2018 they attracted a record attendance when nearly 2,000 fans saw them host Manchester United at the Pan.

So where are we now?: Freeman stepped down in October 2019 after four years in charge to concentrate on his footballing career away from management and after a period when his former assistants Ross Standen and Tony Coade led the side, Hugo Langton took over the hotseat in February 2020, leading the team to 16th spot before the COVID-19 pandemic curtailed the season.

In April 2021, the Club appointed Tony Russell as manager and former Lewes player Joe Vines as his assistant. Their appointment and unique playing style brought new impetus to the Rooks who finished just four points outside the play off places in 2021/22 and have much to look forward to in 2022/23.

The club is building a solid foundation on which to build for the future. It has around 2,000 Owners and has gained a great reputation for all its community work and stand-out marketing especially with the continued stance on pay equality and committed stance against the harms of gambling advertisement in football.



LEWES FC

Lewis Carey – Goalkeeper: An ever-present between the sticks in 2021/22, Carey previously played for us in the 2018/19 season winning Supporters Player of the Season. Lewis came through the youth ranks at Bristol City, and is an experienced non-league keeper having appeared for Bromley, Tonbridge Angels, Eastbourne Borough and Cray Wanderers.

Tom Carlse – Defender: An energetic full-back, Tom has previously played for Sittingbourne, Greenwich Borough, Ashford United and was part of the Cray Wanderers side that were promoted from the Isthmian South in 2018/19. Tom made 36 appearances in the Isthmian Premier Division in 2021/22, scoring once in the home tie against Haringey Borough in November.

Marcel Elva-Fountaine – Defender: A technical and strong right back, Marcel progressed through the youth ranks at Reading, joining Burnley's U23 side in 2020. He signed with Hayes & Yeading in November 2021 and joined Aldershot Town in August 2022 before heading to the Rooks on loan.

Mitchell Nelson – Defender: An experienced and gifted centre back, Mitchell started his career at Bournemouth and subsequently played for Eastleigh, Sutton United, Margate, Dulwich Hamlet, Welling United, Tonbridge Angels and Cray Wanderers. Mitchell has previously played for the club joining on loan from Bournemouth in the 2010/11 season. Appeared 34 times for the Rooks in 21/22.

Will Salmon – Defender: Salmon began his career with Aldershot Town before moving to AFC Wimbledon and then Ebbsfleet United in the Conference in 2009. He won the Conference North title with AFC Telford then moved to Bath City in 2013. He will be a familiar name to Isthmian League fans after long spells at Met Police and Leatherhead. He was an ever present in the last aborted campaign for the Tanners. Joined on loan in October 2021 and the move became permanent in November 2021. Salmon made 30 appearances in the red and black during the 2021/22 season, scoring the winning goal in the away fixture at Folkestone in March.

Alfie Young – Defender: The ball playing centre back played over 100 games for Worthing before departing for Potters Bar Town in October 2021. Alfie joined Kingstonian in late January 2022, making 15 league appearances for The K's joining the Rooks in August 2022.

Kenny Yao – Defender: Predominately a right-back but comfortable across the defence, the former Charlton player joined us in the summer from Dartford. An injury in November limited Kenny's league appearances to 17 although he returned as regular starter towards the end of the season.

Tom Champion – Defender: A commanding centre back, Tom started his professional career at Barnet, subsequently joining Bishop's Stortford before moving on to Dartford and was an ever-present in their promotion to the National League in 2012/13. In 2013, he moved to Cambridge United, once again achieving promotion, this time to League Two. In 2015, Tom rejoined Barnet for a second spell for two seasons followed by four seasons in the National League with Boreham Wood and a season at Woking from whom he joins us. Tom is the Rooks captain for 2022/23.

Tom Phipp – Midfielder: A strong and technical midfielder, Phipp started his career as a 17 year old with Ebbsfleet and went on to play for Maidstone, Margate and Tonbridge Angels before taking a break from football to study for a degree in marketing. After a spell at Crowborough Athletic, Phipp joined Tony Russell at Cray Wanderers in the summer of 2018 and was an integral part of the team that won the Isthmian South East title in 2018/19. Phipp joined us from Herne Bay in December 2021 and went on to make 13 appearances.

Ayo Olukoga – Midfielder: Joined in the summer of 2021 following a string of impressive pre-season performances. The midfielder made 19 appearances for the Rooks before departing for Whitam Town in January 2022. Rejoined the Rooks in late March for the season run in.

Bradley Pritchard – Midfielder: The evergreen Pritchard joined us from Cray Wanderers in the summer of 2021 and went on to make 33 league appearances scoring five times. Pritchard is best known for his performances in the English Football League for Charlton Athletic and Leyton Orient, winning League One with the former in 2011/12. Bradley also helps to co-ordinate the community garden located at The Dripping Pan.

Jack Skinner – Midfielder: Born in Australia, Jack joined Woking's Academy in 2018 and a series of impressive performances for both Woking and on loan at Leatherhead earned him a senior deal for 2019/20. Jack had spells on loan at Hampton & Richmond and Eastbourne Borough before returning to Woking for 2020/21.

Ronan Silva – Midfielder: An athletic and technical box to box midfielder, Silva deviated from the conventional route of a professional footballer by committing to studying, gaining a degree from Loughborough University. After his studies had concluded, Ronan returned to football with his local club Biggleswade Town and his impressive performances and goalscoring capability quickly alerted the attentions of Crawley Town who signed him to a professional contract in February 2022. Silva joined Eastleigh at the start of March 2022, making ten appearances for The Spitfires in the National League. Joined the club on loan from Crawley in August 2022, scoring on his debut against Wingate & Finchley.

Razzaq Coleman De-Graft – Forward: A technical and powerful player, Razzaq can play in a front three and as left back, the former Hampton & Richmond Borough player joined the Rooks following a series of impressive performances in pre-season and was a standout performer for the Rooks as the 2021/22 season progressed.

Deshane Dalling – Forward: A rapid and tricky winger, Dalling joined us in December 2021 and was one of the the Rooks top performers in the final quarter of the season, producing several talismanic performances.

Deshane started his senior career at Queen's Park Rangers and spent time on loan with Cork City and Wealdstone whilst with The Hoops. After leaving QPR, Dalling had a short spell at Hemel Hempstead and then Dartford before heading to The Dripping Pan.

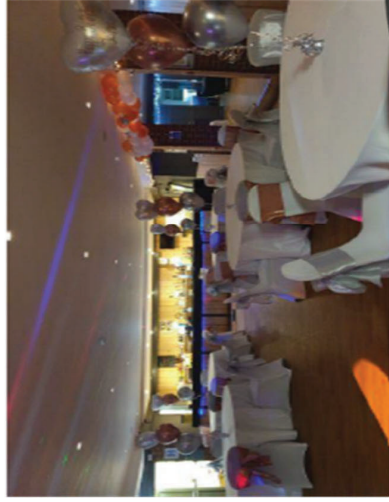

Deon Moore – Forward: Previously played for the club on a one month loan in October and November 2021. Starting his youth career at Carshalton, Deon went on to join Peterborough making his debut against Norwich in the EFL Trophy at just 17 years old. That was followed by a move to Bristol Rovers in 2018 and a short spell at Hemel Hempstead in 2020. Deon joins us from Dulwich Hamlet with whom he spent two seasons.

Joe Taylor – Forward: A prolific goal scorer, Taylor counts Ramsgate, Folkestone, Margate and Cray Wanderers amongst his former clubs. Scored 33 goals in 43 appearances for the Rooks in the 2021/22 season.

Taylor was Tony Russell's first signing as Lewes manager.

Fraser Middleton-Tozer – Forward: Signed for the senior side in addition to joining our Under 18's side. Still only 16 years old, Fraser has impressed in pre-season and joins us from Eastbourne Borough having previously played for QPR's youth team.
