HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faiil stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faiil stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. The U23s were disbanded but we had an additional U18s (all U16s) playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays but this year playing in the U17s division.

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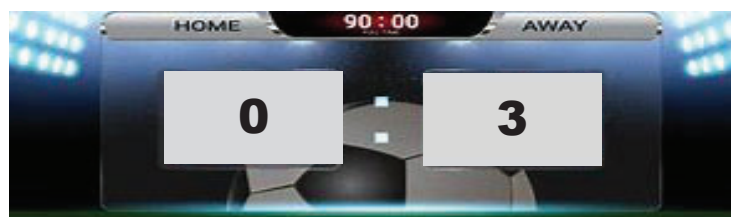

Bridges did not disgrace themselves as they battled against their National League North opponents, but once the visitors gained the lead, it proved an uphill task for Jamie Crellin's team.

There was nothing to choose between the sides in an open first half, although good chances were limited. Hereford keeper Dino Visser had to make a flying save to keep out a solid 25 yard drive from Brannon O'Neill, whilst Curtis Gayler drove over after being set up by O'Neill. Leo Anderson tipped Harry Pritchard's effort around the post and he also made a good save from the same player. Kevin Rivera hit the crossbar and Bryan Villavicencio saw a decent strike deflected for a corner, but Bridges just couldn't get their noses in front.

Former Crawley Town favourite, Tyrone Barnett, appeared for the second half and proved a nuisance within eight minutes of the restart, but there still seemed little danger as the ball came across the goal, but failure to clear left **Yan Klukowski** with a simple tap in.

Ryan McLean looked a constant threat for the visitors, but it was another scrappy goal that put Hereford two in front. Callum Donaghey was obviously struggling with injury as he tried to hoist the ball clear, and **James Caton** found himself free with another simple finish.

This was all rather cruel on a Bridges defence which had stood firm for most of the game. Teenagers Joe Stone and Billy Irving epitomised the determination of a Bridges side who never gave up, but when the ball cannoned off a defender into the path of **Miles Storey** in the 74th minute, he was clinical with his finish and the Bridges dreams were finally over.

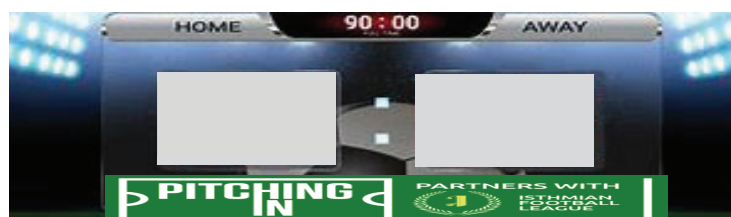
Sadly they couldn't even conjure up a consolation goal, the nearest they came being an effort from substitute Alex Barbary which went just wide.

A game of mixed fortunes for Bridges, who came close to snatching a draw after going down to ten men.

It was Curtis Gayler who saw red after an ugly scuffle involving about 14 players, and even then it was only the intervention of one of the referee's assistants, who only saw Gayler's reaction to provocation by City keeper Kieran Magee. City's Emmett Dunn and Bridges' Kieran Pamment had just been shown yellow cards for their parts in the semi brawl, but aided by a baying crowd, the officials decided that Gayler should go.

It had been a relatively comfortable end to end affair up to that point with Bridges taking a 24th minute lead when Brannon O'Neill's corner was met by the head of **TAD BROMAGE**, but City dominated the last ten minutes of the first half with Dunn heading against the post and Ryan Davidson heading wide.

Even then, Bridges might have doubled their tally but for an excellent block by Magee to deny Cameron Lawson following a superb ball from Noel Leighton. However, instead City made another swift break a minute before the interval and a corner by Ollie Munt spun to **JOSH CLACK** for a clinical equaliser.

Clack was denied twice in quick succession by Leo Anderson as City began the second half as they'd finished the first, and it was no surprise when Munt's 59th minute corner was met at the near post by the head of **LLOYD ROWLATT**.

Anderson made another brilliant save from Ethan Pritchard, but surprisingly it was Bridges who were now looking the more dangerous. Billy Irving's cracking strike went just wide, and both Joe Stone and Pamment had successive shots blocked following some trickery by Manny Tehe, whose cameo performance also saw him fire just over after another good run.

It was to prove a disappointing finale with skipper O'Neill admitting that it becomes difficult trying to play with only ten men.



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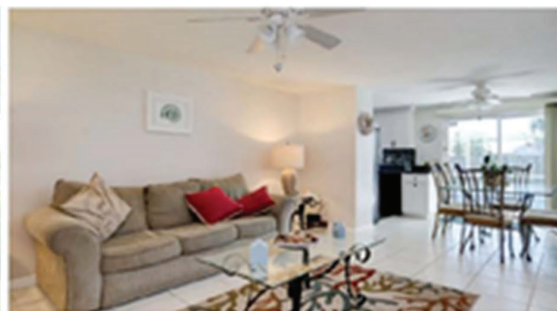

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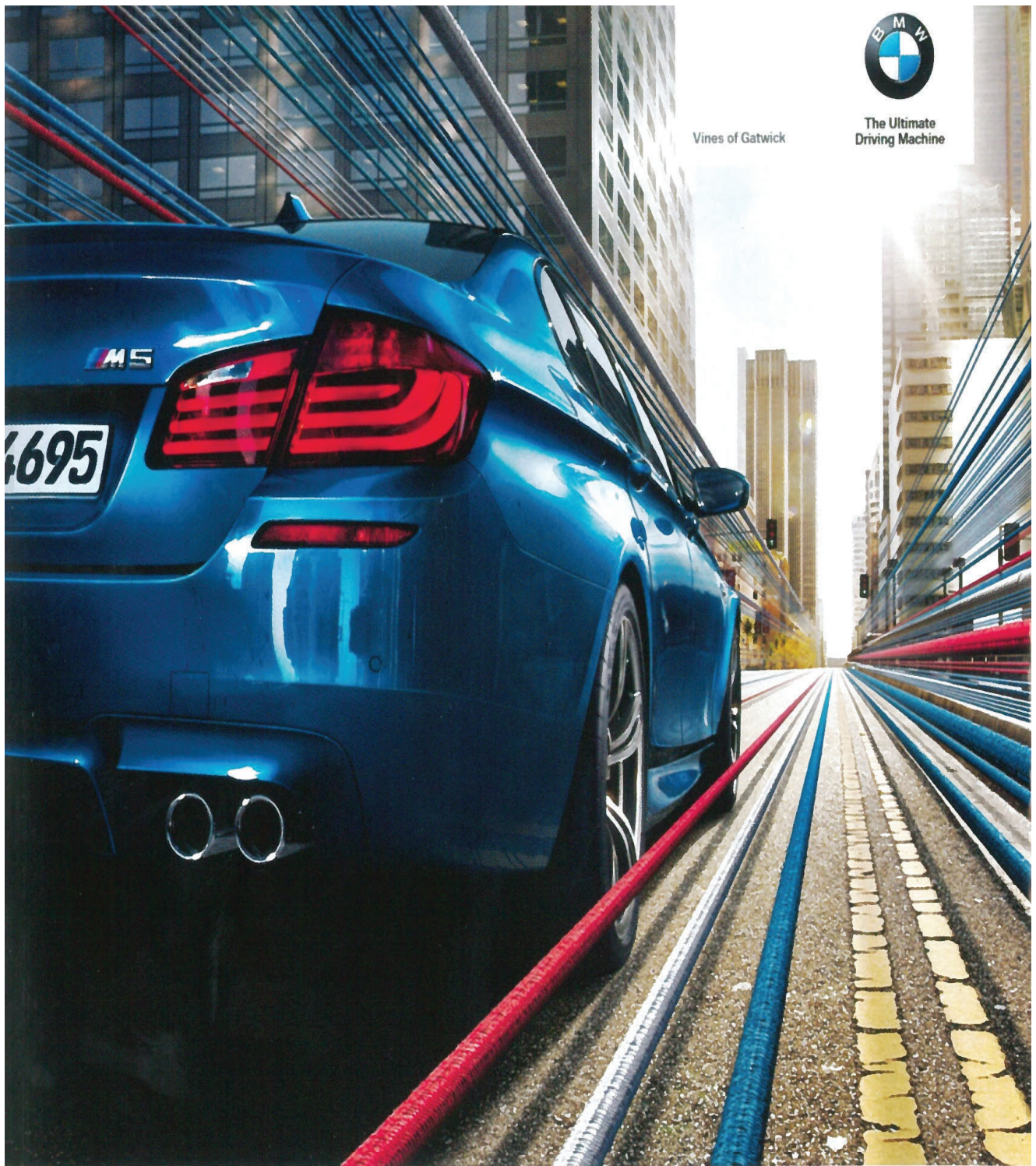

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EAST GRINSTEAD TOWN FC

East Grinstead Town Football Club was formed on 8 May 1890, although it was another ten years before they played their first competitive matches as founder members of the Mid Sussex Football League. In those early days the club played in blue and white with the town's coat of arms on the breast pocket. It was some years before they adopted their current colours of amber and black and were nicknamed 'The Wasps,' both of which survive to this day.

They won the Mid Sussex League in 1902 and their first major honour followed seven years later when they shared the Sussex Junior Cup with Arundel. In 1909 they were awarded senior status which they have held ever since apart from two seasons when they were relegated to the intermediate third division of the Sussex County League in 1989.

In 1912 Grinstead reached the Sussex Senior Cup final for the only time in their history but lost 4-1 to St Leonards Amateurs in a ferocious snowstorm.

The Wasps were original members of the Sussex County League when it was founded in 1920, but they struggled to make any impact and after finishing bottom in 1927 they were not re-elected.

Rather than returning to the Mid Sussex League, they had four successful seasons in the Brighton League before stepping up to the Southern Amateur League. A fresh challenge reinvigorated the club and they won the Division Three title in 1932 with 15 victories out of 18. Three years later they played on the Test match cricket ground at Trent Bridge in Nottingham when they defeated Nottinghamshire Amateurs 6-0 in the old FA Amateur Cup.

Determined to regain their place in the Sussex County League, they were re-elected back in 1937 after winning the Mid Sussex League again and finished fifth in their first season.

In those halcyon days either side of the Second World War, four-figure crowds were the norm at their old ground in West Street, East Grinstead, which they shared with the town's cricketers. The club's record attendance is 2,006 for an FA Amateur Cup tie against Lancing in November 1947.

Success eluded Grinstead until 1952 when they won the Baldwin Cup, the forerunner of the Sussex County League Cup. That team is reckoned by many to be the finest the club has ever produced. It was certainly the most entertaining - 42 games that season in league and cup produced 222 goals!

Grinstead finished third in 1955, but their fortunes began to decline along with crowd numbers after that. They left West Street in 1959 but it wasn't until 1967 that they finally moved to their current home at East Court after a protracted battle to get the ground, which was prone to waterlogging, fit for football. In the meantime, they had a spell at King Georges Field in the town centre.

The club again finished third in 1973 in the Sussex County League but that was as good as it got for another 30 years although Grinstead did reach their first cup final since 1952 when they lost 4-1 to Haywards Heath in the RUR Cup in 1974 despite taking the lead. During the 1980s the club regularly hosted Crystal Palace and Brighton in charity fixtures watched by crowds of over 2,000.

Wasps found themselves in Division Two for the first time in 1979 and even had two seasons in Division Three before regaining senior status. They were promoted back to Division One in 1993 but lasted just two years.

Bob Smith, a former player, led Wasps back to Division One in 2003 and they also won their first trophy for 52 years, beating Three Bridges 4-0 in the final of the RUR Cup.

Unfortunately, the club were relegated back to Division Two on the final day of the 2004-05 season and in October 2006 Smith, the longest-serving manager in the club's history, was replaced by another ex-player Steve Norris.

In his second season Wasps romped to the Second Division title by a massive 18 points, losing just twice all season. Their winning run of 14 successive league games at the start of the season meant they became the last senior non-league team in the country to drop points.

The club established itself in the top-flight over the next decade and their progress on the field has been matched off it.

Floodlights were installed in 1997 and in 2008 two new stands and a pitch perimeter barrier were erected. In 2014 with East Court already meeting the requirements of the Isthmian Football League after installing additional seating, the club began work on a new dressing room and hospitality area, turnstile block and entrance and a resurfaced car park. More than £225,000 of the cost came from external grant-aid funding.

Simon Funnell's side finished the season in second place, their highest ever County League position, and in May 2014, the club were accepted into the Isthmian League for the first time in our history. In October 2014, Simon was replaced by Tony Beckingham, who returned for a second spell having previously been in charge between February 2010-October 2011. Tony managed to keep the club in the league for a second season despite finishing in 23rd place in the table but left to join Hythe Town in September 2015. Matt Longhurst was appointed manager in October 2015 and consolidated the Wasps at Step 4 for three seasons, despite a big turnover of players. In December 2019, Matt was replaced by the former Kingstonian and Whyteleafe manager Leigh Dynan. The suspension of the league saved the club from relegation, as they were bottom of the table when Covid-19 forced the curtailment, but Leigh rebuilt the squad and the club began the season with renewed confidence and were fourth when the 2019-20 season was abandoned because of the pandemic. Leigh had to step down at the start of 2021 due to work commitments and former Wasps' striker Tony Reid, who had enjoyed success with Westfield, was appointed in May 2021 but after a disappointing start to the season Reid left the club in November 2021 and Beckingham returned for a third spell as joint-manager alongside Drew Cooney, who has made more than 400 appearances for the club. Cooney took over as permanent manager in March 2022 and guided the club to 15th place after a strong finish to the campaign.

During the summer of 2020 the first major overhaul of the pitch since 2003 took place with new drainage and irrigation installed, most of the cost being met by grants. This project was completed in the summer of 2021.

MATTE PIERSON: Matte has had experience at various clubs including Bedfont Sports, Merstham and Hampton & Richmond. He joined the Wasps last season and has established himself as a key member of the squad.

FINTAN WALSH: Former Horsham and Bognor defender who has become a mainstay of our defence since joining the club in 2020.

TARIQ STRAKER: Dependable defender in his second spell with the club, defender Tariq has also played for Aylesbury and Haywards Heath Town.

LEWIS UNWIN: Midfielder who joined the club this season. Rusthall, Crowborough and Whitehawk are among Lewis's former ports of call.

HARRISON PARKER: Former Lancing full-back or wing-back who joined the club during the summer. A regular for the Lancers last season.

GLENN WILSON: Club captain and the most experienced player in the squad. Glenn played during Crawley Town's rise into the Football League a decade or so ago and has played at all non-league levels. Now 36, he joined his home-town club in 2019. Started his career at Crystal Palace.

MATTHEW DANIEL: Another summer arrival from Lancing, for whom he scored 11 goals in 40 games last season during his second spell with the club. Has also played for Horsham YMCA.

ANDREW BRIGGS: Attacking midfielder who made a big impact after joining the Wasps at the end of 2021 with some spectacular goals and performances. Eastbourne Borough, Leatherhead, Burgess Hill and Haywards Heath are among his former clubs.

TAHJAE ANDERSON: Striker who joined us from Merstham, for whom he scored five goals in 36 appearances last season, during the summer. He previously turned out for Hendon, Bromley, South Park, Haywards Heath Town and Beckenham Town.

DANIEL UCHECHI: Attacking midfielder or striker who returned to the club in February 2022 for a second spell from Cray Wanderers.

REECE PRICE-PLACID: Attacking right-footed player who joined Wasps in the summer. Most recently Reece played for Sutton Common Rovers. Speedy with an eye for a goal.

DEAN PERANA: Joined the club this summer. Dean offers physicality and ball-winning ability in midfield. Previous clubs include Met Police and Aylesbury.



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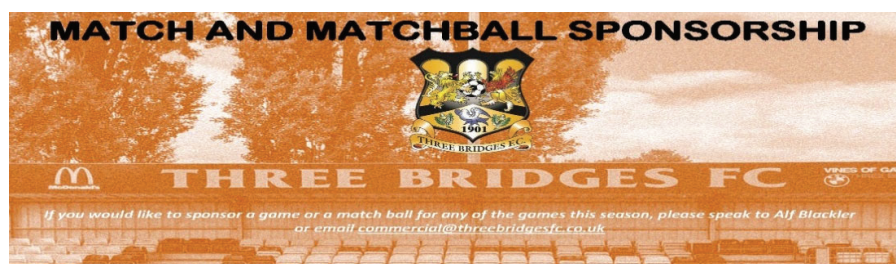
