Good afternoon everyone and welcome to the Jubilee Field for the visit of **CRAY VALLEY PM**. We trust that their players, officials and supporters have a safe homeward journey after the game and offer the same hospitality to today's match officials.

Cray currently sit in 4th place in the League table, their 39 points from 23 games including a 3-2 home win against us in October, when Gianni Ashley and Kevin Rivera were on target for us. Next up for us is an away trip on Tuesday night (14th) to local rivals East Grinstead Town, and then we are back here next Saturday when Chichester City will be the visitors.

HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faiil stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faiil stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. The U23s were disbanded but we had an additional U18s (all U16s) playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays but this year playing in the U17s division.

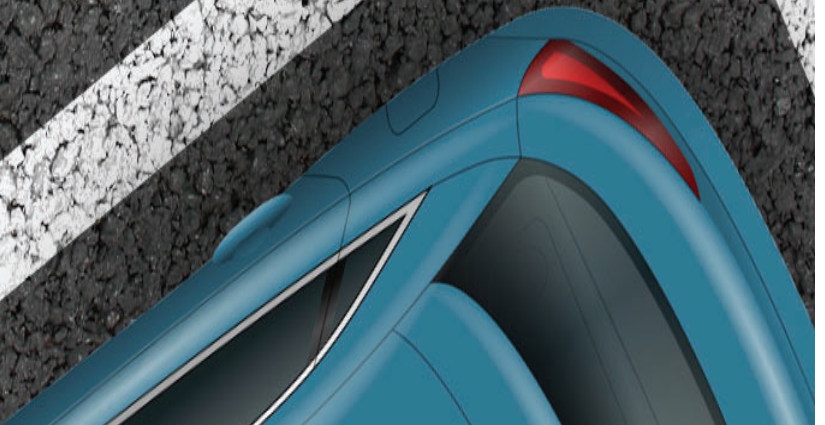

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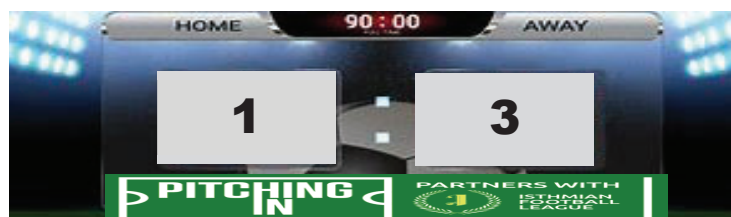

After the excellent win over Ramsgate, this proved to be a very disappointing evening for Bridges as they lost a League game at home for only the second time this season.

Leo Anderson was first to show his ability with a fine low save to tip away Shad Ngandu's low drive after only 7 minutes, but apart from a Noel Leighton effort following good work by Curtis Gayler, the game seemed to meander along with little to enthuse the disappointingly small crowd.

However, it all changed six minutes before the interval when another low drive by Toby Bancroft drifted wide of the post. Anderson rightly let it go past him and was therefore astonished when the referee awarded a corner to the visitors! Bridges certainly should have defended it better, but after **JARRED TRESPADERNE** had netted at the far post – indeed onto the post and in – things got worse as Joe Tennent was cautioned for his protests, a significant yellow card as it later proved.

A deflected effort by Gayler in first half added time went safely into keeper Lucas Henley's arms, whilst a good move early in the second half saw Henley called into action again as he held onto Joe Stone's shot from just outside the box.

After 54 minutes though all seemed well again for the hosts when **JOE TENNENT** headed home from Brannon O'Neill's corner, only for Hythe to restore their lead three minutes later from a free kick awarded against an astonished Kieron Pamment. Shad Ngandu delivered and it was another far post header as the Bridges defence seemed to just watch as **JOHAN CANEY BRYAN** took full advantage.

A great effort by Marvin Hamilton crashed against the bar and this time it was the Hythe bench that received a yellow card for abuse across the pitch to one of the assistant referees for his perceived failure to flag for a goal. Hamilton injured himself in the process, but a challenge virtually on the half way line was deemed to be a Hythe free kick with **Joe Tennent** receiving a second yellow card despite him feeling that he was the one that was fouled!

An innocuous coming together in the penalty area after 80 minutes saw a spot kick awarded against Bryan Villavicencio as he and Sam Itauma collided, **SHAD NGANDU** promptly netting from the spot.

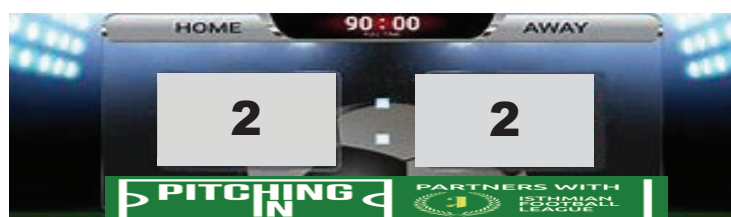

Football sometimes borders on the bizarre as this result proved. Chatham had won every one of their twelve League games at home this season whilst Bridges had lost each of their eight away fixtures. Chatham deservedly led 2-0 at half time to maintain most of the 708 crowd's expectations, but two stunning second half strikes by Curtis Gayler earned Bridges a point that few saw coming.

It was the second week running that Bridges had shocked the team at the top of the table, following on from the home win against Ramsgate, and the midweek loss at home to middle of the table Hythe Town – only Bridges' second home reverse – makes the whole thing so bizarre!

Chatham attacked in numbers in the early stages with Jack Evans coming close with a header and Daniel Thompson incredibly firing over following an excellent inviting cross by Andy Drury. The inevitable opener took half an hour to materialise, however, a cross from the left leading to a half cleared header before **DANIEL THOMPSON** stabbed the loose ball past Mitch Bromage.

With a minute to go in the first half, everyone seemed to back off as the veteran **MATT BODKIN**, a 39 year old who delivered a number of inviting crosses, strode through and hit what was a rare goal for such a talented player.

Bridges had hardly troubled Chatham at this point and were fortunate that Joe Tennent and Billy Irving were looking supreme in the heart of the defence. Only Kieron Pamment had looked likely to score for Bridges at that stage, but three minutes into the second half **CURTIS GAYLER** hit a long range shot that swerved and then nestled into Ben Bridle Card's net.

After 63 minutes **CURTIS GAYLER** delivered an even better fierce free kick to level the scores. By now, belief was running through the visiting side, whilst Chatham's frustrations began to boil over. **Simon Cooper**, who had conceded the free kick that led to the equaliser, received a second yellow card, whilst manager, Kevin Hake, was shown a straight red card when he seemed to kick out at a Bridges player!

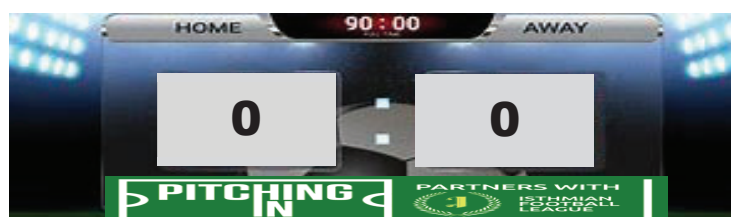

Decidedly not a game for the purists as two teams cancelled each other out with few players shining on a cold evening. Bridges, with Joe Tennent serving a one match suspension and Joe Stone unavailable, changed their formation with skipper Brannon O'Neill acting as an effective sweeper.

Kieron Pamment worked his socks off by harassing the VCD defenders into mistakes, while Mitch Bromage looked comfortable in a second rare outing in the Bridges goal, but no one else really got going on a regular basis, although much the same could be said about the home side.

Pamment had an effort blocked following intelligent play by Noel Leighton, but the only other note worthy of mention came just before half time when a strangely unpunished challenge on Kevin Rivera led to him being helped to the dressing room by Bridges Secretary Richard Munn!

The sparse crowd of just 60 paying customers had little to enthral them after the break either, although VCD looked the more likely to break the deadlock but could not get past a stubborn visiting defence.

Karl Dent came closest for the homesters to produce a fine save by Mitch Bromage, but it was Bridges who almost snatched an unlikely winner after 81 minutes when substitute Conner Collcutt threaded a good ball into the path of Noel Leighton, whose fierce shot was blocked by keeper Jordan Gilmore.

A number of free kicks were conceded by Bridges, and Gilmore delivered a few tempting ones into the danger area from the half way line, but the game petered out into a terribly disappointing affair.



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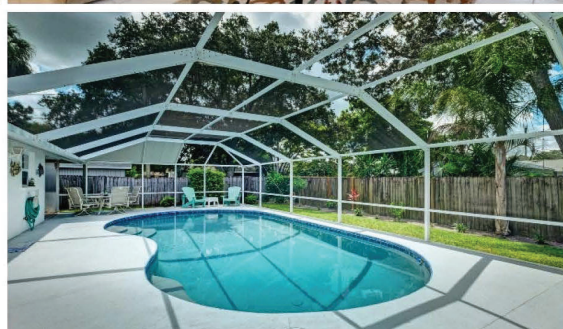
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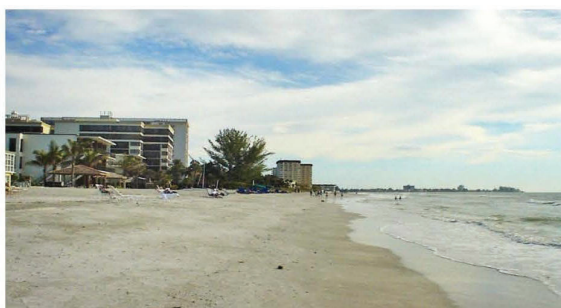

CRAY VALLEY PM

Records held by Kent FA show that Cray Valley Paper Mills FC (CVPM) was founded in 1919 - the team originally playing in green and white, matching the livery of the paper mills vehicles and company banner - and was supported by the Nash family who owned the paper mills until its closure in 1981

Playing in the newly formed Sidcup and Kent League Division 2, the Club's first match was a 1-0 victory against Hamilton House FC on September 20th 1919, followed by a 7-0 victory in our first away match at Sidcup Invicta. CVPM went on to win the division in their first season - gaining promotion to the Bromley & District League Division 1. The following season they were again champions - also winning the Kent County Junior Cup, defeating Sittingbourne Paper Mills 3-0 in the Final.

Their next success came as members of the Kent Amateur League Western Section in 1932/33 - winning the Divisional title that season before finishing runners-up in 1936/37.

Records between the late-fifties and the early-seventies are scarce, until 1975 when CVPM joined the South London Alliance League, winning Division 1 in 1979/80 and the Premier Division in 1980/81 - their final season playing at the sports ground of the mills at St Pauls Cray in Kent.

Following a "nomadic existence" CVPM arrived at their present home at Badgers Sports Ground in Middle Park Avenue, Eltham for the season 1998/99, when "Paper Mills" was abbreviated to "(PM)" in the Club's name.

The Club continued to enjoy success in the South London Alliance - winning Division 1 in 1983/84 and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1988/89 - before joining the Spartan League, gaining promotion to Division 1 in 1990/91 by finishing as runners up, only missing out on the title on goal difference. They moved to the re-structured Spartan Midland League in 1997/98, - finishing as runners up in their first season - and became founder members of the London Intermediate League - reaching the Final of the League Cup in 1998/99 - before, under the management of Mark Edwards, being elected to Division One of the Kent County League in 2001/02.

During Edwards' reign, CVPM enjoyed regular success - winning Division 1 West in 2002/03 before winning the Premier Division by 11 points in 2004/05. They were also victorious in the London Intermediate Cup in 2003, 2004, 2010 and 2011.

Willie O'Sullivan became manager in season 2009/10, before leaving in January of the following season 2011/12, at the end of which the Club effectively gained two "promotions" - moving from the "Step 7" Kent County League to the "Step 5" Kent League.

With Steve Chapman then taking over at the helm, their first season at that level saw them finish in a highly creditable 11th position while the following two seasons saw further progress, with 8th and 7th placed finishes, while reaching the semi-final of the London Senior Cup - narrowly losing to eventual winners AFC Wimbledon.

2012/13 saw their debut in the FA Vase, followed by a first appearance in the FA Cup the following season - beating Lancing away in a replay, before losing to Redhill in the Preliminary round.

After Paul Gross took over from Chapman for the 2014/15 season, The Millers finished 7th in the newly named Southern Counties East Football League (SCEFL) - a late season slump resulting in a disappointing 10th place finish the following season.

Under James Collins, the 2016/17 campaign saw the Club finish in a very creditable 4th place in the league, and reach the Final of the Kent Senior Trophy - losing 2-1 to League Champions Ashford Town. They also became the lowest ranked team ever to win the London Senior Cup when, on a memorable night at Dulwich Hamlet, The Millers beat Ryman Premier Division opponents Metropolitan Police 2-1. It was also a successful season for the Club's youngsters - the Reserves winning the Suburban League South Division before losing to Metropolitan Police Reserves in the League Cup Final.

Kevin Watson was appointed as manager early in the 2017/18 campaign, guiding The Millers to 6th place, while again reaching the final of the London Senior Cup - on this occasion being beaten by Balham.

The centenary season 2018/19 saw the Club again scale new heights - winning the SCEFL title by a single point, accruing 91 points from 38 matches while scoring 108 goals with a goal difference of +72, and securing promotion to the Isthmian League. The Club also made their first appearance at Wembley - Combined Counties League side Chertsey Town beating Valley 3-1 after extra time in the FA Vase Final in front of a crowd of 42,962.

Their first season in the Isthmian League South East Division (Step 4) came to a premature end due to the Covid-19 outbreak, as they were in 3rd position off the back of a run of eight consecutive victories and looking set to challenge for further promotion.

While the 2020/21 season was also curtailed in December 2020 due to Covid-19, there was still time for The Millers to embark on a record breaking run in the FA Cup. Progress to the First Round Proper will live long in the memory - in particular a famous 3-2 victory at National League side Maidenhead United in the Fourth Round Qualifying.

Season 2021/22 finally saw The Millers complete a full season at step 4, achieving their highest ever finish in 5th place to secure a play off spot - a 1-0 defeat in the semi-final at Ashford United ending any promotion hopes. When Watson left the Club in November 2022, his long standing assistant Tommy Osborne assumed the mantle of continuing the Club's journey while supporting a thriving youth section along with the Ladies team.



CRAY VALLEY PM

CHRIS LEWINGTON. Goalkeeper Chris joined The Millers in the summer of 2021 – keeping 10 clean sheets in his 40 appearances last season. After coming through the junior ranks at Charlton Athletic, the experienced custodian made over 140 Football League appearances for Dagenham & Redbridge.

TOM CHAMBERS. 21 year old Tom spent last season playing with Lewisham Borough in the SCEFL Division 1 before joining Valley in the summer. The left sided defender adds pace and power to the attack when pushing forward.

VINNIE MEDHURST. Defender age 20 former Gillingham academy player. After a spell at Ramsgate started this season with SCEFL side Welling Town and joined the Millers in November 2022.

MITCHELL NELSON. 33 year old defender Mitchell joined Valley in December 2022 from Isthmian League Premier side Lewes. Lambeth born, Nelson has enjoyed an illustrious career – winning the South East Division Championship with Cray Wanderers in 2018/19.

KIKI OSHILAJA. Central defender Kiki joined Valley in the summer of 2022 after being named as VCD Athletic's Player of the Year in 2021/22. Tall and pacy, Kiki was a member of the Carshalton Athletic squad that won the Isthmian League South Division in 2017/18.

CEM TUMKAYA. Tall centre back Cem has made over 200 first team appearances since making his Millers debut as a 16 year old. A valued member of the SCEFL Championship winning side in 2018/19, Cem appeared for the Club in the FA Vase Final at Wembley at the end of that season.

BARNEY WILLIAMS. Versatile defender Barney joined the Club from Barking in May 2022. Williams previously spent four successful seasons at Cray Wanderers – winning promotion to the Isthmian League Premier Division in 2018/19.

JULIEN ANAU. A "box to box" midfielder, the 28 year old Frenchman joined Valley in October 2022 looking for full fitness after an injury ravaged career. Jules' career has seen him play in Spain and Ireland after leaving his homeland.

SONNY BLACK. Hard working midfielder Sonny joined Valley from VCD Athletic last summer. The former Crystal Palace youngster won promotion from the Isthmian League South East Division with Walton Casuals in 2017/18.

ANTHONY EDGAR. Creative midfielder Anthony is in his second spell at the Club having featured in the SCEFL Championship winning side in 2018/19, while also appearing in the FA Vase Final at Wembley that season. Currently unavailable through injury, Anthony has netted 37 times in his 97 appearances to date.

HASSAN IBRAHIYM Former Barnet youngster Hassan joined The Millers from Ashford United in November 2019. A hard working midfield powerhouse, Hass has scored nineteen times in over 80 for Valley.

AYO MAJEK. Midfielder Ayo age 23 joined Valley in September 2022 having spent last season with Marlow in the South Central Division, for whom he made 17 appearances. Ayo appeared for Molesey prior to joining The Blues.

KERSHANEY SAMUELS. Midfielder Kershaney joined Valley in the summer from Isthmian League Premier Division side Kingstonian. The former Dulwich Hamlet, Worthing and Carshalton Athletic man was an integral part of Merstham's squad that reached the Isthmian League Play-Off final in 2019.

DAN BENNETT. Attacking midfielder Dan joined Valley from Carshalton Athletic in July 2022. A constant goal threat, Dan spent four years at Farnborough in the National League South before serving Merstham, Kingstonian and Carshalton in the Isthmian League Premier Division.

DENZEL GAYLE. Pacy striker Denzel made his 200th appearance for the Millers at the end of last season having joined the Club from Erith & Belvedere in 2017. A member of the 2018/19 SCEFL Championship winning and FA Vase Final sides, Denzel has netted over 50 times for Valley.

ADE ADEYEMO. Tall striker "Toks" first signed for Valley in the summer of 2020. With 14 goals in over 50 appearances for the Club, Ade's versatility provides a range of options in front of goal.

ADAM COOMBES. Signed for Valley in the summer of 2022. A product of the Chelsea academy, former England Under 16 striker Adam netted 4 times in 14 appearances for Tonbridge Angels last season following spells at Welling United and Billericay Town among others

TOMMY OSBORNE (Manager). Tommy took over as first team manager in November 2022 after five years on the managerial team. During a distinguished playing career, Tommy achieved promotion from Step 4 to Step 3 with previous Clubs Hastings Town (United), Dartford and Maidstone United, before making 104 appearances for Valley. He was then Assistant Manager as Valley won the SCEFL Championship and reached the FA Vase Final at Wembley in 2018/19, and went on to break Club records in the FA Cup and Isthmian League.



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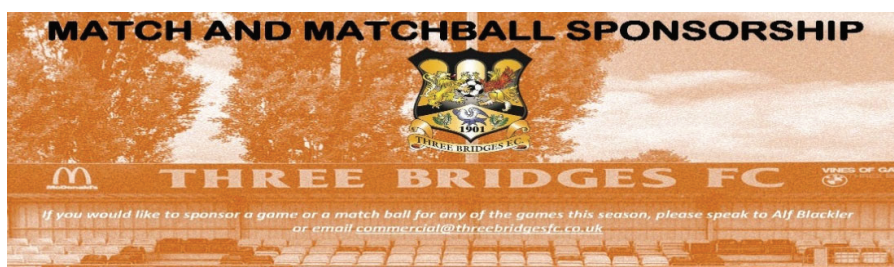

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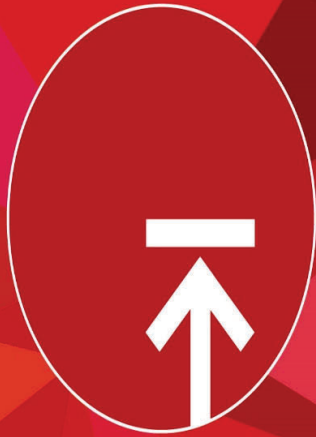
