Good evening everyone and welcome to the Jubilee Field for tonight's match against **SEVENOAKS TOWN**, and we welcome their players, officials and supporters. We also warmly welcome the three match officials and hope that they all have a safe homeward journey after the game.

Sevenoaks currently sit 7th in the League table with 41 points from 26 games, but they would move into the play-off positions if they were to win their game in hand over the two sides immediately above them. On Saturday they came from behind to win 1-3 at Burgess Hill Town, and our first away game of this season ended in a single goal defeat at their ground.

Last season saw us draw 2-2 here early in the season, although Sevenoaks took a two goal lead after being reduced to nine men, and we needed late goals from Steve Smith and Ben Bacon to salvage a point. However,, at Christmas time, our away game saw us triumph 2-3 with two goals apiece from Dan Perry and Curtis Gayler, one of the latter's being voted Goal of the Season at our Annual Awards Night.

Considering we didn't have our first League draw of the season until 2nd January, when we drew 0-0 with Burgess Hill Town, it seems strange that we have now had five successive draws. That elusive win is hopefully around the corner, but things don't get any easier as we travel to in-form Hythe Town this Saturday before entertaining Sheppey United here next Tuesday. Before all that though, this Thursday sees our U18's hoping to get back to winning ways here against Horsham.

If Michael Wilson plays any part of tonight's game, it will mark his 100th appearance for the first team. Curtis Gayler is only four games away from that mark whilst Tadley Bromage has six games to go before reaching that milestone. Well done to all of them.

HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faii stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faii stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. The U23s were disbanded but we had an additional U18s (all U16s) playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays but this year playing in the U17s division.

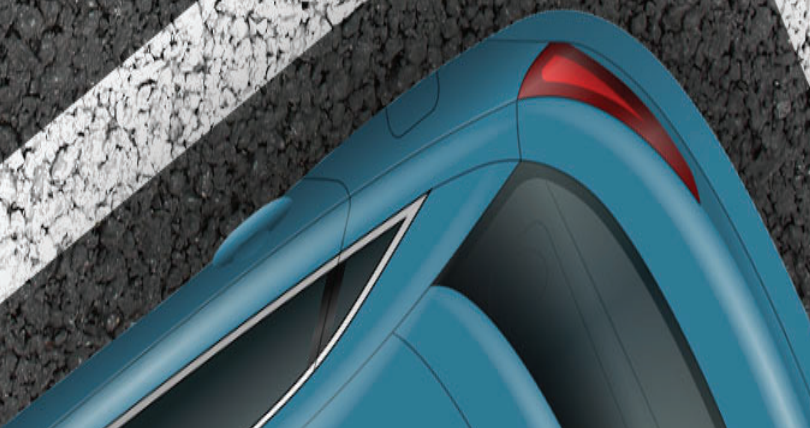

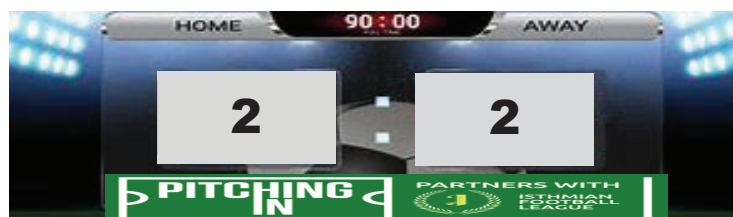

A late equaliser meant that Bridges have drawn each of their last five matches, but Chichester deserved a share of the spoils, especially after looking the better side for much of the first half.

Kieran Pamment had an early effort for Bridges, but Mitch Bromage was soon called into action with good saves to deny Steve Hutchings and Lloyd Rowlatt. Noel Leighton fired wide after a promising move by the home side, but it was no surprise when City took a 29th minute lead thanks to a smart volley by the influential **LLOYD ROWLATT**.

The first half ended with Connor Cody heading wide from a good position, but generally the home defence coped well with a side who had won five and drawn one of their previous six games.

Bridges had a much better second half and were level within three minutes of the restart. Brannon O'Neill's corner was met by Curtis Gayler, whose shot deflected home off **NOEL LEIGHTON**.

Kieron Pamment came close three times in a five minute spell, including hitting a post, but City also had their chances with Mitch Bromage again denying Rowlatt from a free kick.

In the 82nd minute Bridges seemed to have made the breakthrough at last when Billy Irving's long throw was headed in by **TAD BROMAGE**, who almost had another soon after before returning to his normal dominant display at the back.

However, City weren't to be denied, and after 87 minutes Rowlatt provided a dangerous free kick from the left and **STEVE HUTCHINGS** nudged it home to frustrate Jamie Crellin's side once more.

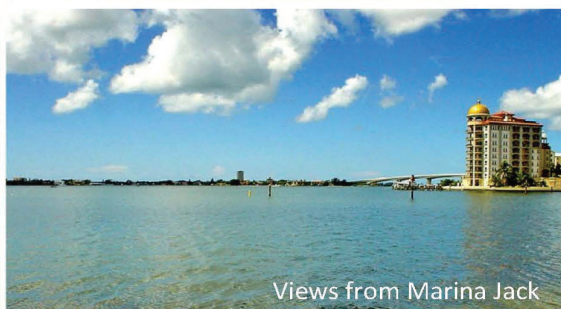
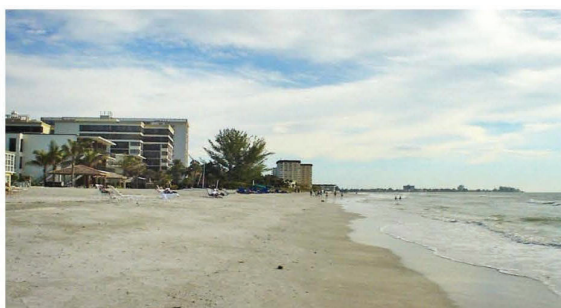

SETTING THE SCENE

Today's newspapers and magazines may use modern colour print and photographic techniques, but they would still be recognisable to a Victorian transported by time-travel to 1998. Similarly with other periodicals, and certainly with books. It is most unlikely, however, that our time-warped visitor would recognise the printed word as sold to him at a football match.

The match day programme has undergone dramatic change since it first emerged as a means of identifying players in the 1870s. Today, it is a glossy, colourful and sophisticated communications and marketing vehicle, sold in prodigious quantities and for sums far removed from the penny or halfpenny of Victorian days.

In the course of this series articles, the development of match day programmes will be chronicled, and put into the perspective of contemporary life and the game they represent. Avid readers of modern programmes may bemoan the prevalence of advertisements, but these vital fund-raisers become fascinating historical markers as we roll back the years. The local butcher, baker and candle-stick maker were present in just about every club programme, as was the local brewery, theatre (and then cinema), newspapers and menswear shops.

Local industries were prominent amongst the advertisements - razor blades in the Sheffield clubs' programmes, vehicle and cycle accessory manufacturers in the Birmingham clubs' issues, ship-builders advertising for workers on Clydeside. We can watch local economies evolve over the life of a club's match day programme by reading the adverts.

Trends within the game are, of course, apparent in editorials and features, while great teams, marvellous players, and some unhappy times in the game may be recalled from the playing and managerial personnel listed in the programmes.

If the content of programmes down the years is varied, then so are the formats and styles used by clubs and associations. From the simple teamsheet of Victorian days, listing players and their distinguishing features, to the colourful, glossy booklets of the 1990s - the history of football programmes is as varied and interesting as the game itself, as we will discover over the course of this season.

NINETEENTH CENTURY TEAM SHEETS

The first ever football programme is probably lying undetected in an old suitcase in an attic; or lining an antique cutlery drawer; or it may be displayed in one of the football museums which are springing up at clubs around the country. Quite frankly, we do not know with certainty which was the first ever fixture to have a team-sheet printed and distributed to spectators, but we can take a pretty educated guess at how it looked.

The purpose of the earliest programmes was to identify the players and advise spectators of forthcoming fixtures. There were no team numbers on the backs of Victorian football shirts, but players did sometimes have distinguishing features, whether in the colour of their stockings, or the type of cap or cowl they wore. Certainly, there were well defined formations - firstly 2-2-6 and then 2-3-5 - and spectators were able to identify the players from the positions they took up on the field, which corresponded to the formation in which their names were printed on the team sheet.

Thus for the match between Queen's Park and The Wanderers on 9th October 1875, the home team's "Centre Back-up" (centre half) C. Herriot was to wear a "Black and white cap - no stocking" while C.W. Alcock, the Wanderers Captain and Centre would wear a "Cap - blue and white chequers". The front of this card would be recognisable as a programme / team sheet today - it had the teams, referee and umpires and fixture details. If there was printing on the reverse, it would likely be a fixture list, perhaps incorporating results to date, and details of forthcoming fixtures.

When Heart of Midlothian visited Royal Arsenal at Plumstead on 30th March 1891, the large single sheet had match details and team selections on one side, and on the reverse was printed a poem which served as the welcome to the visitors. At the foot of the page were four small advertisements for local traders.

In April 1893, at the Ardwick Ground, Hyde Road, Manchester (home of the club which evolved as Manchester City) Bolton Wanderers and Newton Heath (now Manchester United) contested a Manchester Senior Cup Final and the team sheet, sold for 1d, listed the teams with spaces to record the result and goal scorers. As the game developed around the turn of the century, so did its programmes, and as football left the Victorian age, match programmes assumed some of the familiar features by which we recognise them today.

1900'S - THE FIRST RECOGNISABLE PROGRAMMES

Programmes started to adopt something approaching their modern appearance when the clubs and authorities discovered that they could charge buyers a penny, thus introducing the possibility of the programme making a financial profit. To justify such a price they had to provide some value for money, which meant including more information on the club, their opponents and their respective players.

Printers and publishers quickly cottoned on to the example shown by other branches of entertainment, chiefly the theatre, and attracted paid advertising to the issue. That, in turn, required sufficient sales to keep the advertisers happy, which meant that content had to be good enough to attract buyers at the match.

By this process, the match programme evolved from a single sheet, to a folded, and then stapled, publication. Liverpool first issued in September 1892 with the visit of Rotherham Town to Anfield Road, and their 1d programme was a four page affair, with teams listed on the front page, surrounded by adverts; first and reserve team fixtures and results surrounded by adverts, and two pages of features on players, officials and recent matches, and "Notes".

The programme issued by Chester for the visit of Welsh club Druids on Christmas Day 1907 had the teams (in 2-3-5 formation) on one page, surrounded by adverts, and on the inside of the 4 page folded programme was substantial editorial entitled "Club Gossip", a photograph and description on one of the home players, reserve team results and scorers, and "Notes by Rambler."

A number of clubs were more ambitious in their programme production. In 1887 Aston Villa entertained London Casuals and issued a "Programme Card" but by 1906-07 they had launched "The Villa News and Record" in multi-page form. This remained at 1d, but sold far more copies than the brief team sheets of a few years previously, which in turn satisfied the multitudinous advertisers.

Not every League club issued for every fixture, and it often took a special occasion to compel the club to print. One such milestone was Cardiff City's first ever match at Ninian Park, against Aston Villa in September 1910, and a special souvenir programme was issued, some time before City contemplated a regular programme.

The inexorable tide of commercialism was apparent even in those early days of the Association game, and few clubs could resist the blandishments of advertising agencies and printers who put much needed money into club funds thanks to the penny programmes.

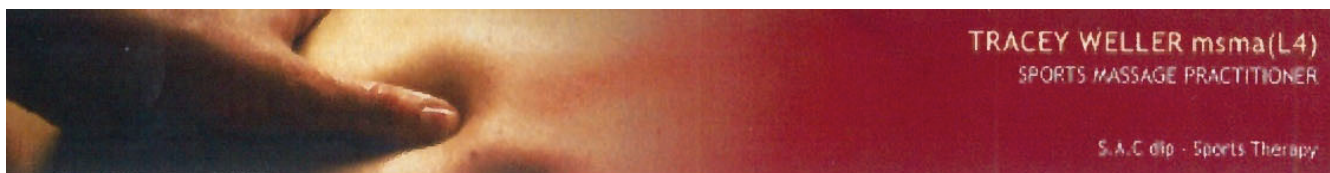

SEVENOAKS TOWN

Sevenoaks Town FC was originally formed in 1883 and they were founder members of the original Kent League, but they left after just one season and wouldn't return for another 110 years. There are few existing records of the club during that era, but it is known that on 26 April 1893 they played Royal Arsenal, who were, at the time, the only professional team in the South of England, with over 1,000 spectators watching the game.

In 1906 the club, now known as Sevenoaks Town, became one of the founder members of the Sevenoaks League.

In 1951 Town amalgamated with another local club, St. John's United, and became members of the Kent Amateur League (Western Region), which they won on two occasions.

In 1984 the Kent Amateur League was re-organised as the Kent County League and Sevenoaks were the first Premier Division champions, a feat they repeated in seasons 1995–96 and 2002–03.

After over a century playing in almost exclusively amateur leagues, Sevenoaks applied for promotion to the semi-professional Kent League after winning the 2002-03 title.

Their first season in the county's senior league ended with a respectable 11th place and included a memorable victory away to former Football League side Maidstone United, when they recovered from a 3-1 half-time deficit to win 4-3.

The move to senior level also meant Sevenoaks were eligible for FA competitions. Their first appearance in the FA Vase came in 2004-05, when they lost 2-1 at home to Deal Town. Their longest run in the competition came in the final season they were eligible, 2017-18, when they made it to the Third Round Proper before losing 3-1 away to Thatcham Town.

Since achieving promotion to the Isthmian League, Town have switched to the FA Trophy. In their first ever match in the competition in 2018-19 they beat former Conference side, Grays Athletic, 4-2 before losing 2-1 in the First Qualifying Round away to Dorking Wanderers, who went on to win the Isthmian Premier Division.

In the FA Cup, Town's best performance came in 2016-17 when they took Chesham to a replay in the Second Qualifying Round and although they've yet to meet Football League opposition, one of their most memorable ties came in 2008-09 when they held Folkestone Invicta to a 4-4 draw at Greatness Park in the preliminary round. Town led 2-0 and 3-2 but were trailing 4-3 in stoppage time when a free-kick from Dwayne Gibbons earned them a replay, which they eventually lost 4-1.

After a decade, during which their highest league position was 6th in 2009-10, Town appointed the former Dartford and Tonbridge player, Micky Collins, as manager for the 2014-15 season. Having previously won the Kent League title with Erith & Belvedere, Collins oversaw four seasons of progress, which saw the club rise from 16th to 8th, 5th and 3rd in 2016-17, a season which also saw them win the Premier Division Cup.

In 2017-18, having installed a 3G pitch, Collins led them to win the Southern Counties East League title and promotion to Step 4 football for the first time in the club's history.

A 10th place finish in their first season in Isthmian League South East proved an impressive start. Two Covid interrupted campaigns followed – last season proved a difficult one – and a poor run of results ending with the departure of Collins following a 4-0 defeat at Ashford United in mid-February, after seven and a half seasons in charge.

Harry Hudson was appointed two weeks later – with 10 games left – a host of new players featuring in his first match in charge, earning a 1-1 draw at Corinthian.

A point was a good enough start with an almost completely new side, but nobody could have predicted the dramatic transformation in the team's fortunes – from relegation candidates to mid-table finishers – in the remaining two months of the season, completed with a 2-1 final day win at champions Hastings United.

A seventh successive victory clinched 13th place, winning 26 points out of a possible 30, putting them top of the form table, with Hudson named Manager of the Month for April.

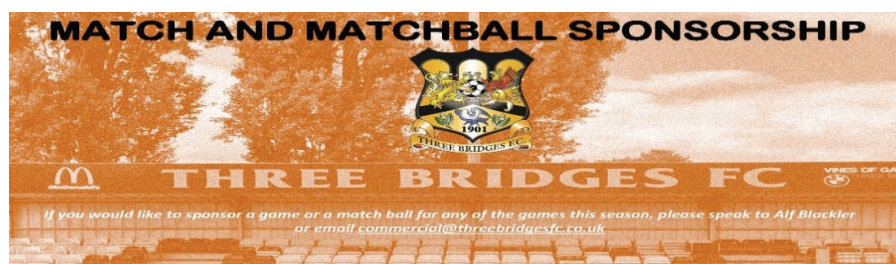

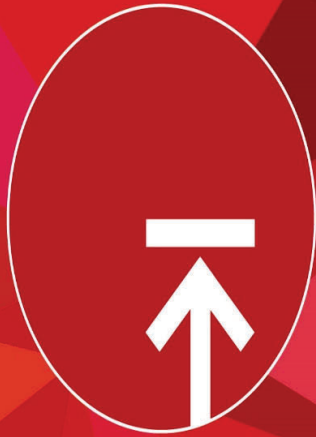
