HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. The U23s were disbanded but we had an additional U18s (all U16s) playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays but this year playing in the U17s division.

This season sees Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure and Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach.

Bridges eventually won through to the next round of the Velocity Cup, but a young Burgess Hill side made them fight all the way. Both goalkeepers made an error that led to a goal but both made excellent saves too, notably in an often exciting second half where the rainy conditions saw players slipping at vital moments.

With one eye on their F.A.Cup tie at Sheppey five days later, the Hillians gave a few debuts and could hardly have made a worse start as Bridges stole ahead in less than thirty seconds! Kevin Rivera threaded the ball through for **NOEL LEIGHTON** to drive forward and slip his shot beyond former Bridges keeper James Shaw.

But the visitors settled, although Bridges came close to doubling their lead when Ferreria passed to Camron Lawson, whose shot was just over. Instead it was Burgess Hill who levelled after 33 minutes when **NOAH HOFFMAN** met a cross from the right. And seven minutes later a miskick by Mitch Bromage gave Joseph Overy the chance to set up **TOMMY BLENNERHASSETT** for a tap in.

Harry Lawson came close to making it 3-1 just before the interval, but Bridges looked more determined after the break and equalised on 53 minutes when Brannon O'Neill's corner was bundled in by **LEIGHTON** at the near post.

Shaw made a brilliant low save to deny Rivera, but what proved to be the winner after 72 minutes would surely be disappointing to the vociferous keeper. **ETHON ARCHER**'s 25 yard drive certainly had power and it swerved too, but the ball seemed to go straight through Shaw's hands.

He did however make a couple more excellent saves as did Bromage, who was also grateful for a last ditch clearance off the line by Harvey Woollard. Last word might well have gone to the tricky Archer in added time, but Shaw this time was not to be beaten as his side exited the competition but with their heads held high.

Three Bridges finally got a win against a resilient East Grinstead Town in the Isthmian South East Division on a gloriously sunny Saturday afternoon in East Grinstead. The sun beating down on the perfectly manicured pitch set things up for a good game of football between these two football rivalries. Bridges began the day sitting at the top of the league table with East Grinstead being at the opposite end with no points from their opening four games.

The game started very brightly for Three Bridges and the ever-lively Kevin Rivera forced Matte Pierson into an early save after just fourteen seconds! This would prove to be the pattern for the remainder of the first half with Bridges creating several openings in the first half but just not being able to find a way to get the ball into the East Grinstead net.

Nine minutes into the second half, **CAM LAWSON** found himself with space inside the box and opened the scoring with his fourth goal of the season. The chances continued to come thick and fast for Bridges with Ethon Archer, Noel Leighton and Cam Lawson all coming close to extending the lead. In previous seasons, Bridges would not have closed this game but this season is proving different. There is a real excitement when Bridges go forward and they did manage to extend their lead on 86 minutes when **KEVIN RIVERA** beat Matthew Weaire in a race and kept his composure to slot past the East Grinstead keeper to the delight of the travelling Three Bridges contingent.

Five minutes into the seven added on minutes at the end of the game, **WEAIRE** made amends by grabbing a consolation header from an East Grinstead corner but the revitalised Three Bridges team comfortably saw out the game to record their first win over East Grinstead for a long time.

Bridges remain at the top of the league table after five League games but they have played one game more than most of the teams around them so manager, Jamie Crellin, is certainly not allowing anyone to get carried away. However, as pre-season favourites to finish rock bottom of the league, this young Bridges side are certainly turning some heads so far this season with their performances.

Bridges limped out of the F.A.Trophy despite only being up against ten men for the whole of the second half. Although they shared the possession statistics with South Park, it was the home side who looked more adventurous when attacking in a first half where the final ball seemed to always be lacking for Bridges.

Camron Lawson had the first shot of note after nine minutes, but it was a comfortable low save for Danny Bracken, and this seemed the pattern for much of the game as the visitors couldn't quite get any power behind their shots.

South Park showed how to finish after fourteen minutes when a delightful deep ball from full back Jack Tucker was headed home by JOE BELL. The ever lively Kevin Rivera saw his shot saved after good interplay with Ethon Archer, but debutant Jasper Sheik in the Bridges goal had to make two excellent point blank saves to deny the hosts.

Bridges had a good shout for a penalty when Rivera was bundled over in the 34th minute, but after 40 minutes Sheik made another great block before the ball ran wide and swiftly came back in for BELL to head his second.

A good save by Bracken from Archer led to a corner and Kelvin Manuel Massango was cautioned for time wasting, this proving costly for him as in first half added time he received a second yellow for a bad challenge on Lawson.

Bridges huffed and puffed in a second half where South Park defended resolutely and Rivera, Noel Leighton and Ridwan Euba all had decent chances. They finally turned one of them into an 85th minute goal as Archer's cross was firmly headed home by LEIGHTON. A string of bookings then followed with Tucker "taking one for the team" when he hauled Rivera down as the Bridges player threatened to break clean through, but overall this was a below par performance by the visitors and the Trophy dream is over for another year.

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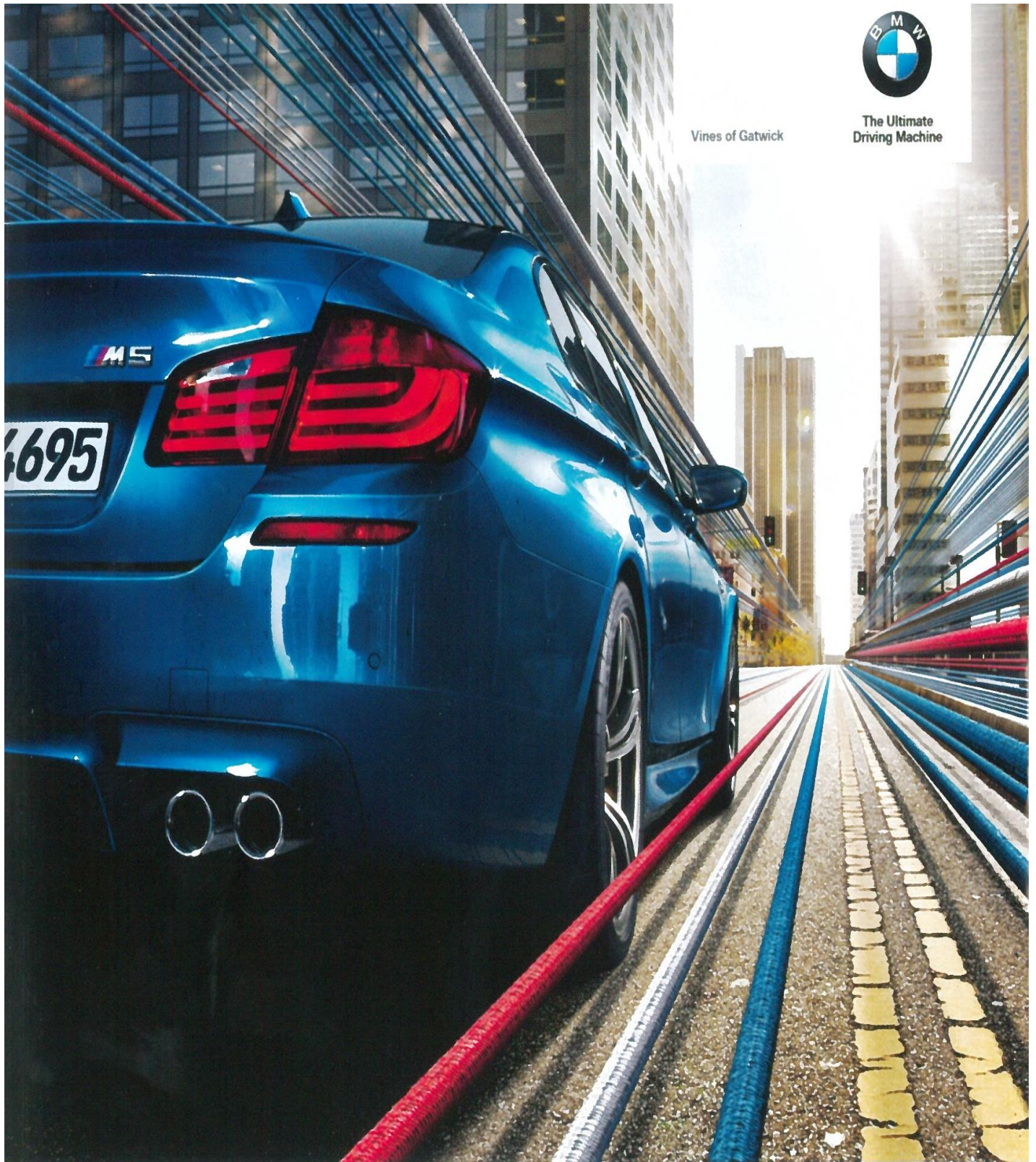

BROADBRIDGE HEATH

Broadbridge Heath Football Club was founded in 1919 by local ex members of the Armed Forces who had just returned from the 1914-18 Great War. In the very first season of competitive football, with only twelve registered players, the club won the Horsham and District Championship and Challenge Cup.

In 1970-71 the Horsham League amalgamated with the West Sussex Football League and Heath joined Division Three. Promotion was won to Division Two the following season. In 1978-79, following promotion from the Premier Division of the WSFL, Broadbridge Heath joined the Southern Counties Combination League, which at the time was a feeder to the Sussex County Football League. The SCCL amalgamated with the County League in 1983-84 with Heath becoming founder members of Division Three.

The club moved to the Broadbridge Heath Leisure Centre in Wickhurst Lane in 1987, where they had exclusive use of the stadium pitch, bar and social area. At the end of the 1987-88 season, the club were promoted to Senior football in Division Two for the very first time. They remained in Senior football for twenty years, with one season (1998-99) in Division One. Despite succeeding on the pitch, off the field events deteriorated when the Club Landlord decided not to renew the club's lease to run the bar and social area, and for several years with no home and no assets, the club struggled to survive.

At the end of the 2007-08 season, Heath were relegated to Division Three, and things got even worse when the team finished second from bottom two years later and only avoided demotion because there were not enough clubs in the feeder Leagues with facilities to satisfy County League requirements.

Season 2010-11 saw an improvement in the club's fortunes with the team finishing in sixth position and a year later they finished one place higher behind some very good Intermediate sides. As a result of restructuring in the Leagues above and despite finishing fifth, Broadbridge Heath were back in Division Two at the end of the 2011-12 season.

Back in Division Two after a five year break, the team finished in sixth position and reached the Final of the Sussex County F.A. RUR Cup, where they narrowly lost 1-0 to Division One runners up East Preston. A year later the team went even better by finishing the season as runners up to Eastbourne United AFC and with promotion back to Division One for only the second time in the club's history.

In the first two seasons back in Division One (now renamed the Premier Division), the club finished ninth and a year later went even better by finishing eighth. In 2017-18 a slight dip

saw the team finish in fifteenth position, but they bounced back a year later to end in sixth place, which was their best ever finish at that stage.

Things also improved off the field when, on 2nd August 2019, the club took possession of their new purpose built facilities, a ground to satisfy the grading requirements for Step 5 football with two further pitches for use by the Adult and Youth teams for matches and training.

In January 2020, former Heath player Chris Simmons took over as First Team Manager, initially on an interim basis, but with performances improving he was offered the position on a permanent basis three months later. COVID then struck and two seasons became null and void. But after his first full season in charge, the team finished seventh and last season they were crowned Southern Combination League Champions with promotion to the Pitching In Isthmian League South East Division, a new challenge and experience for everyone at the club.

They have played just four League games to date, their best result being a 4-0 win away to Beckenham Town just a week after Bridges won 5-1 there in the F.A.Trophy. Their only setback so far was a 0-3 home loss against high flying Chichester City, whilst they have had two very commendable 2-2 draws at home to Sheppey United and away to Cray Valley PM.

We welcome back to the Jubilee Field four Broadbridge Heath members who have played for us in the past. **Tad Bromage** actually started this season with us, playing in the two F.A.Cup ties against Crawley Down Gatwick, and he has played 108 games (four as a substitute) for Bridges in two spells with the side. He scored six goals in a Bridges shirt.

Club captain **Ryan Brackpool** was with us two seasons ago, playing 39 times, two as a substitute, and scoring five goals. One of these was a contender for Goal of the Season, a long range effort away to Lancing.

Another to score a Goal of the Season contender was **Mason Doughty**, one of his two goals for us being the only goal of the game at home to Chichester City. In all, Mason played 29 times for Bridges, eighteen of those being as a substitute.

Last but not least, one of their Coaches **Mark Hawthorne**, who had a glittering playing career, played just seven times for Bridges, five as a substitute, but he also served briefly as a Coach here too.

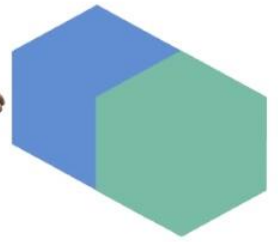
