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HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. The U23s were disbanded but we had an additional U18s (all U16s) playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays but this year playing in the U17s division.

This season sees Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure and Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach.

Beckenham's first decent attack after eight minutes brought them a goal as three defenders were found wanting as **EMMANUEL OLOYEDE** brought down a cross and drove the perfect shot past a helpless Leo Anderson.

Anthony Adeseite was causing all sorts of problems for the visitors in these early stages, but Bridges dug in and began to make some decent inroads into the home defence. Tresor Difika threaded a fine ball through for lively debutant Ethan Archer to fire just over, and five minutes before the interval the outstanding Harvey Woollard made a hefty challenge against Adeseite and sent Kevin Rivera away. Despite being forced a little wide, Rivera ended by setting up **CAMRON LAWSON** for a neat equaliser.

George Goodwin headed just wide and Jargal Enkh rattled the crossbar as the half ended, but at the other end Rivera was blocked twice, Noel Leighton was just offside as Brannon O'Neill provided an audacious chip, whilst a Lawson shot produced a solid appeal for a penalty.

Anderson made a couple of timely saves as the hosts threatened again, Adeseite and Oloyede inevitably being involved, whilst Leighton shot just wide after a good run. But, after 67 minutes, it was Bridges who stole ahead with Difika finding Sam Packham, who interacted with **LAWSON** before the latter drove into space and hit a lovely curling shot beyond keeper Nick Blue.

Sadly, the excellent Packham was hurt in the build up and had to be replaced, but Bridges continued to dominate with Blue brilliantly tipping over a rasping effort from Leighton before pushing away another good drive by Conner Collcutt.

A rather ruthless performance by Bridges with plenty of good attacking moments brought a well deserved three points on the road.

Quite how Bridges didn't win this game will remain a mystery. Even Merstham boss Tony Reid thought that his side were "awful" on the day, but credit to the visitors for not giving up even when they trailed by two goals with twelve minutes to go.

Camron Lawson alone might have had a hat trick in the first nine minutes. He hit the post when Kevin Rivera crossed inside the first minute, crashed a header against the crossbar from another Rivera cross and then saw a drive turned away by keeper Zack Basey.

Ethon Archer also saw a shot diverted away, so it was something of a shock when the visitors took a 25th minute lead when full back **MICHAEL ABNETT** danced through three challenges before finding himself with just Mitch Bromage to beat from close range!

And it almost became worse when Loranzo Lewis found himself free and forced Bromage to a good low save. Merstham skipper Dean Gunner cleared off the line from **ARCHER**, but the little winger was rewarded four minutes before the break when he broke through and finished with aplomb.

Dan Ferreria and Noel Leighton both came close as Bridges stepped up the pace before a lovely 70th minute move involving Lawson and Archer was finished by **BRANNON O'NEILL**. And eight minutes later **O'NEILL** struck a free kick firmly to seemingly clinch the points for the homesters, but just two minutes later a needlessly conceded corner led to **LEWIS PEARCH** driving through a crowded goalmouth.

And it needed only another two minutes for Abnett's cross to somehow evade a packed defence with **PAUL LUSUKU** looking to get the final touch.

Not much more could have gone wrong for Bridges it seemed, but it did. O'Neill couldn't quite meet Leighton's chip with a solid enough header, Basey made a brilliant double save to deny O'Neill and Rivera, and even when the referee awarded Bridges a penalty, he changed his mind after consulting an Assistant! And the final nail in the coffin was the straight red card shown to Taylor Curran for a tackle from behind five minutes into the seven added!

Having started poorly for the second time at this ground in the space of two weeks, Bridges ran out comfortable winners in the end with no doubt a lot of positive half time chats by the visiting management team.

It took Beckenham just three minutes to take the lead when the impressive **Anthony Adesite** cut inside and drove wide of the helpless Mitch Bromage. And the home side looked the more likely to get the next goal as Bridges spent too long on the ball and were reduced to a glut of back passes.

When they decided to be positive, Kevin Rivera saw a good effort diverted over the bar whilst Camron Lawson forced Nick Blue to a good save. Bridges defended well to keep out a free kick from Bradley Ryan, whilst Adesite was just wide and there were a few more decent opportunities wasted by Beckenham.

Just moments before the half time whistle though, Bridges unexpectedly found themselves level when **Rivera** rose to meet Brannon O'Neill's corner with an excellent header. At the start of the second half, he was denied a second by a brave block by Blue, but the pattern was now set as Bridges were far superior in the second period.

Rivera set up **Noel Leighton** to put Bridges in front ten minutes into this dominant phase, and it was another Rivera pass after 70 minutes that set up **Lawson** for a beautiful volley beyond Blue.

Mitch Bromage was forced to make a great diving save to keep out Freddie Nyhus' free kick before Blue hauled down Ethon Archer in the box in the 82nd minute to give **O'Neill** the task of netting from the ensuing penalty. And three minutes later a terrific long ball down the flank by Tresor Difika found the irrepressible Rivera, who once again was the provider for **Leighton** to add the fifth and earn an away tie at South Park in the next round.

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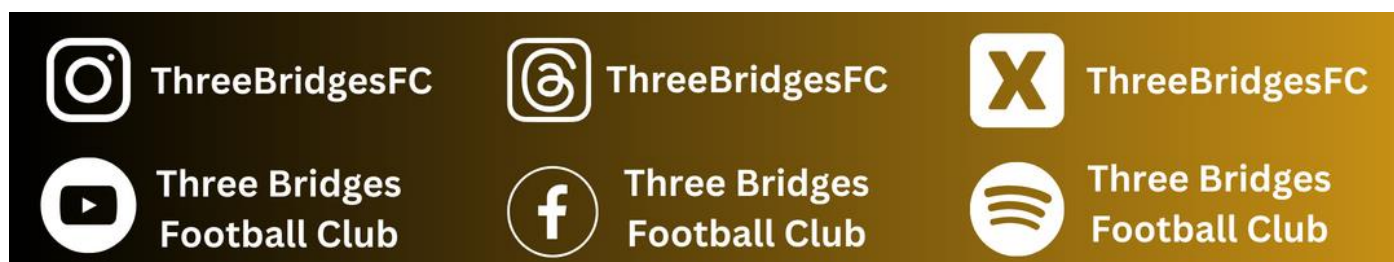

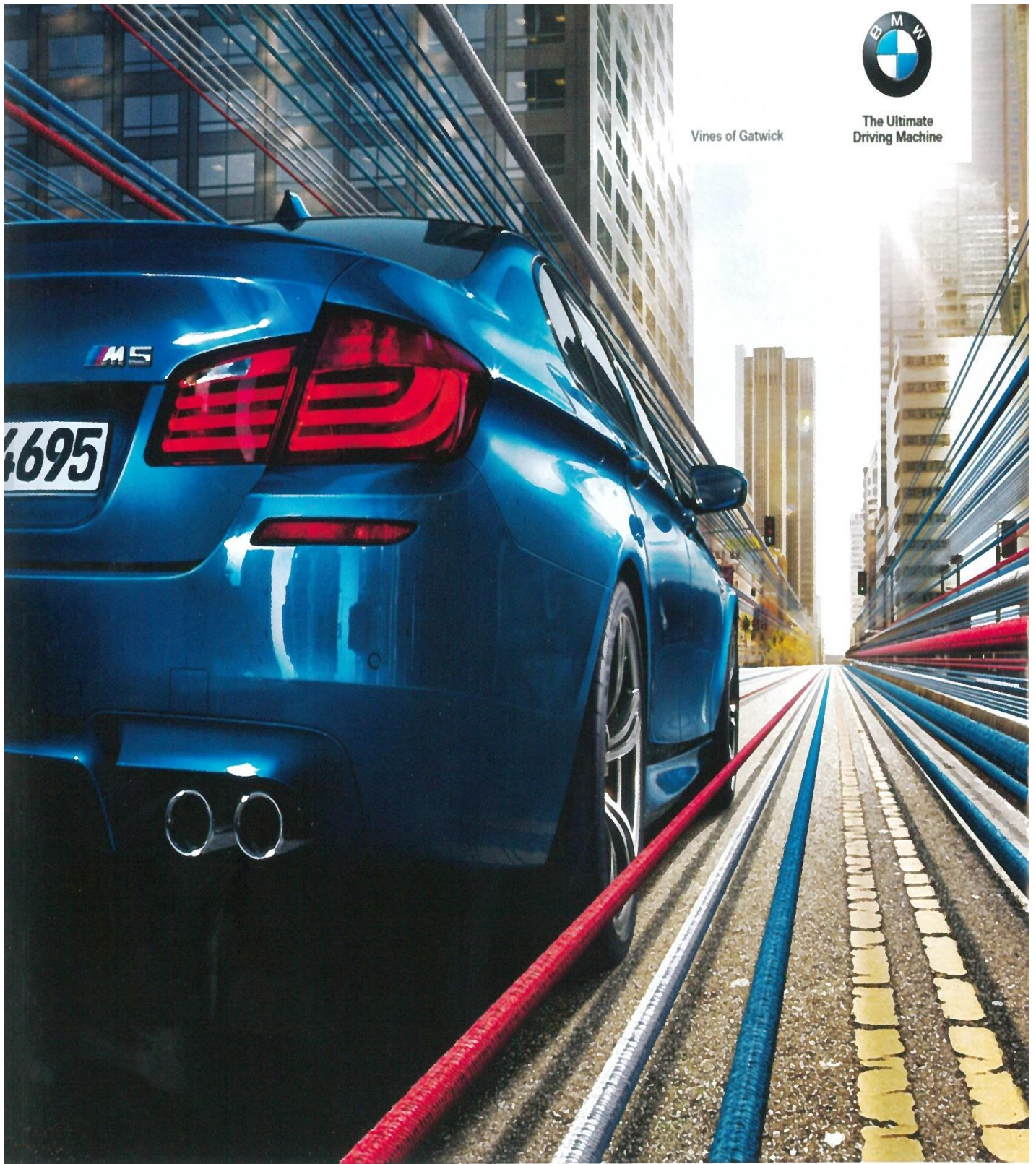

BURGESS HILL TOWN

Dean Cox (Manager) - Took over the management reins at Burgess Hill Town in the summer following a short but successful stint as Lancing Manager where he guided them to safety and achieved their highest ever league finish. Former professional who enjoyed an excellent career in the Football League with Brighton & Hove Albion (just under 150 appearances), Leyton Orient (over 200 appearances), where he was a fan favourite and Crawley Town as well as successful non league spells with Eastbourne Borough and Worthing. Dean, a tricky winger/attacking midfielder, also had two spells on loan at Burgess Hill firstly in 2004 and then again in 2017.

Taylor Seymour - Goalkeeper who re-joined Burgess Hill Town this Summer. Originally joined the Hillians at the beginning of the 2021/22 season but left in the January transfer window to join League 2 side Crawley Town. Has since played for Eastbourne Borough, Corinthian Casuals and Horsham before recently returning to Leylands Park. An excellent shot stopper who has also played for Portsmouth for whom he made his debut in an EFL Trophy tie against Peterborough United in 2020 and has also represented Sussex at Under 18 level.

James Shaw - Re-joined the Hillians in the close season from neighbours Hassocks FC. Much travelled player who includes Tooting & Mitcham, Tonbridge Angels, Hayes & Yeading, Haywards Heath, Horsham, Eastbourne Borough, Dorking Wanderers and Three Bridges amongst his former Clubs. James originally came through the youth system with the Club and has enjoyed two other spells with the Hillians in 2008/09 under Jamie Howell and also helped the Hillians avoid relegation in 2018. Vocal goalkeeper who dominates his box and is an excellent shot stopper.

Martyn Box - Full back who joined the Hillians originally on loan from Barnet in the 2019/2020 season and was made into a permanent move soon after. Local lad and a favourite amongst the Hillians faithful, Martyn loves to get forward and is a fantastic crosser of the ball with a knack of scoring some important goals. Alongside his playing role with the Club he also coaches BHTFC Junior Under 11 Girls team.

Reggie Ward - Full back who likes to get forward and is now in his third season with the Club. He was previously on the books at Brighton & Hove Albion. Reggie is related to former Hillians manager and Brighton legend Ian Chapman.

Joe Shelley - Veteran defender who joined the Hillians in the close season from Whitehawk where he helped them gain promotion via the play offs last season. A commanding presence at the back and reliable penalty taker Joe has also played for Horsham, where he helped them climb back up the leagues to the Isthmian Premier, Hastings United, Horsham YMCA, Pagham, East Preston and Worthing United and adds a great amount of experience to the Hillians.

Josh Spinks - Signed in the summer of 2020/2021 season from Haywards Heath Town and has now made close to 100 appearances for the Hillians. Dominant and classy central defender who was voted manager and supporters player of the year two seasons ago. Josh has also played for Lancing.

Nic D'Arienzo - Defender who is back in the Green and Black Hillians shirt after a short loan spell at the end of the last season from Hill to Haywards Heath during what was an injury hit season. Big strong defender who was previously with Lewes where he came through their successful youth system.

Marcus Allen - Summer signing from Lancing where he won a trio of awards - players player, managers player and young player of the year award last season and was Dean Cox's first Hill signing. Commanding central defender who has previously played for Saltdean United, Peacehaven and Haywards Heath. Was appointed club captain on joining the Hill.

Callaghan Stobbart - Young left back who was a summer recruit from Lancing where he had a breakthrough season under now Hillians manager Dean Cox.

Zack Lawrence - Broke into the first team last season following some impressive performance with the under 18's. Young left back. Zack holds the honour of being the first player to progress from BHTFC Juniors to reach the first team.

Finn Daniels-Yeomans - Summer recruit who followed manager Dean Cox from Lancing where he spent the last three seasons helping the Lancers win and retain promotion into the Isthmian South East Division. Prior to that he had a long stint with Edinburgh University AFC playing over 200 games in the Scottish Lowland League and also captained the side for his final three seasons there. During his time in Scotland he also represented and captained the side for his final three seasons there. During his time in Scotland he also represented and captained the Scottish Universities Rep side between 2018-2020. Finn is a tough tackling, dominant central midfielder who will bring his height and physicality to the Hill.

BURGESS HILL TOWN

Kieran Rowe - In his second season with the Hillians having joined from Haywards Heath Town where he had made over 100 appearances. Picked up last seasons Managers Player of the Year after many impressive performances in the Hill's midfield playing 47 out of 48 games. Versatile player who can also operate in defence. Never say die attitude and always gives 100%, Kieran has also played for Bognor Regis Town and is the second generation to wear the Hillians green and black after his dad Adie who played for the Club in the 1980's.

Darren Budd - Fans favourite and a legend of Leylands Park. Captained the Hillians to the Isthmian South title winning side of 2015 also being picked in the league's team of the year that season. Returned to the Hillians in the summer from Worthing and has previously played for Bognor Regis, Eastbourne Borough, Horsham, Whitehawk and Brighton & Hove Albion. Buddy originally joined the Hillians in 2012 and won player of the season that year. His first spell lasted four seasons and he made nearly 200 appearances in that time. Midfielder with a never say die attitude and has the knack of chipping in with some important strikes.

Reece Hallard - Last season's supporters player of the season at Lancing who joined the Hillians in the summer. Formerly with Haywards Heath, Saltdean United, Whitehawk and Worthing at youth level. Respected Sussex at youth level and had trials with Barnet. Strong forward with a good eye for goal.

Tyrese Mthunzi - Recruited in the summer from Lancing and has previously played for Whitehawk, Saltdean United and Worthing whilst also playing for the Hillians Youth team in 2017 under Paul Dollner. A skillful, box to box midfielder, Tyrese will bring some flair and keen eye for goal to the Hill.

Lewis Finney - An exciting talent who joined the club from Lancing ahead of the 2021/22 season. Finney hit a mind-blowing 49 goals in 42 appearances for the Lancers during the curtailed 2019-20 SCFL Premier Division campaign. He also finished as our top goalscorer in his first season at Leylands Park. Lewis has previously played for Haywards Heath Town, Hassocks and Eastbourne Town.

Rob O'Toole - Re-joined the Hillians in the summer for a second spell in green and black from Whitehawk where he captained them to promotion via the playoffs last season. Very popular person around Leylands Park who enjoyed an excellent season at the Club playing a big role in the title winning team of 2014/15 scoring 20 goals. Rob has also played for Horsham, Saltdean United, Peacehaven, Haywards Heath Town, East Preston and Shoreham. Strong attacking player who has the ability to score spectacular goals.

Kieron Pamment - Returned to the Hillians in the close season from Three Bridges where he ended up as top scorer last season. Very quick attacker who's played for a host of Sussex clubs including Lewes, Horsham, Shoreham, Littlehampton, Pagham, Saltdean United, East Grinstead and Worthing where he was a big favourite amongst the Rebels supporters. Dead ball specialist and pacy forward Kieron's first spell with the Hillians was in the Isthmian Premier Division in 2018 where he scored twice in 15 appearances.

Marcel Powell - Marcel signs for the Hill after shining throughout pre-season. A speedy winger with a keen eye for goal, Marcel reunites with Coxy after spending 22/23 at neighbours Lancing where he won their young player of the year award. An exciting player who is sure to light up Leylands Park this season, he has also played for Eastbourne Borough.

Dan Perry - Returned to the Hillians last season and finished as top scorer and was also the league's golden boot winner as well as featuring in the league's team of the year. Came through from the Youth Team where he was top scorer in Ashley Carr's title winning side and soon broke into the first team. A strong prolific fox in the box striker who has also played for Eastbourne Town, Haywards Heath, Saltdean United, Crowborough and Lewes. Supporters and Players player of the season last year. In the 2021/22 season he played at Three Bridges and was top scorer there too as well as winning the Supporters Player of the Year title.

Burgess Hill Town FC Club History

Burgess Hill Football Club was founded in 1882 and was a founder member of the Sussex County Football Association. The club attained the unique achievement of winning the Sussex Senior Cup three years running thus retaining it permanently in the process. The cup is on display in the trophy cabinet in the club boardroom. The current trophy was presented to the S.C.F.A. by Burgess Hill Town Football Club. In 1998 the club reached the Senior Cup final for the first time in 110 years but were narrowly beaten 2-1 by Hastings Town. In the club's formative years they were also founder members of the Mid-Sussex Football League, and won the League Championship in its inaugural season. Following several successful seasons, the club joined the Sussex

County League for the 1958–59 season, and stayed until attaining promotion to the Southern Football League in 2003. In 1969 the club amalgamated with Worlds End F.C. and with the help of Burgess Hill Town Council were able to move to Leylands Park, the club's current home. In 1971, the club gained promotion to Division One, only to be relegated two seasons later. 1974 saw the 'Hillians' reach another landmark achievement by becoming the only club ever to have won both the League Challenge Cup and the Division Two Cup in the same season. In 1976 a hat trick of achievements were completed by winning the Division One Championship by six points, having secured the Division Two title the previous season.

During the ensuing twenty years in the top flight of the County League success was modest. In 1980 the League Challenge Cup was secured and in 1992 the RUR Cup was added. However, all this changed in season 96–97 under the guidance of club manager, Alan Pook. The club became Division One champions by twelve points, won the Floodlight Cup, and were runners up in the League Challenge Cup. The 2nd XI finished runners up in the Reserve Premier and won the Mid-Sussex Charity Cup, while the Youth XI won their overall championship. In 1997–98, the club 1st XI attained even more success by again winning the League Championship and the League Challenge Cup, also reaching the last sixteen in the F.A. Vase. Additionally they reached the Sussex Senior Cup Final and were top of the county's merit table. The Youth XI also finished as 'Double Champions' in the sector. 1998–99 season saw the Hillians achieve a unique treble in winning the Championship for a post war record third time and again securing a league and cup double, back to back. The 2nd XI won their cup and were runners up in the league, missing out by a single point. Not to be out done, the Youth XI won their league and only missed out on a double by goal difference. All in all an historic season.

The club then welcomed new manager, Gary Croydon for season 1999–2000. He led the Hillians to take runners' up spot in the league and to a record fourth qualifying round FA Cup tie against Hereford United. Again, a last 16 place was achieved in the FA Vase as well as winning the RUR Cup and the Floodlit Cup.

The new millennium season saw Hillians take the league championship with the team remaining unbeaten in the league until April; the Club also had its best ever run in the FA Vase only being beaten after extra time by eventual finalists Tiptree United in the last eight, before a then club record attendance of 1598. With plans being laid for Southern League football, club directors, Gary Croydon and Eddie Benson appointed Danny Bloor as manager for season 2002–2003. The club was rewarded with yet another championship crown, the fifth in seven seasons.

Gary Croydon took over the Hillians again as the club entered the Southern League for the first ever time. After just missing out on the play offs, Burgess Hill Town moved over to the Isthmian League due to the restructuring of the non-league pyramid. For the next few years the Club established itself as a Ryman League club with a few mid table finishes and twice just avoiding relegation.

In 2012/2013 there was an upturn in the Hillians fortunes. The Club returned to their original green and black colours. Former Brighton & Hove Albion player and coach Ian Chapman was appointed as Manager and he guided the Hillians to eighth place in the table.

2013/14 saw the Hillians achieve their highest ever finish in the Football pyramid, finishing sixth in the table and just missing out on the play offs by one point. The newly formed Under 21 side finished third in the Ryman U21 League whilst the Youth Team, under former favourite Ashley Carr, had their most successful season ever. They won the Ryman Youth League and the Ryman Youth Champion of Champions whilst also lifting the Sussex County Youth Cup. Two Ladies teams were also introduced as part of Burgess Hill Town FC and they enjoyed mid table finishes in their first season.

2014/15 saw the Club enjoy the greatest season in the Club's History. Ian Chapman's side were unbeaten in the league until mid - March and went on to win Ryman League Division One South title by 11 points and gain promotion to the Ryman Premier League for the first ever time. They also equalled their best - ever FA Cup run, eventually losing away to Dartford in the 4th qualifying round but having gained a memorable 3-1 victory at Sutton United in the previous round. In the FA Trophy, the club reached the 2nd round, finally losing at home to Dartford FC. In the previous round the team had beaten Aldershot Town of the National League 1-0 away.

A confident start to the Hillians first season in the Isthmian Premier Division before Christmas saw the team 8th in the league, but a disappointing second half saw them finish in 20th position. The club avoided relegation due to Farnborough FC being relegated for financial irregularities. The following two seasons saw the Hillians avoid relegation on the last day of the season to keep its Isthmian Premier status although the next season the Club were relegated and returned to the Isthmian League Division One South where after a few covid hit years have remained since.

This season there is a feeling of optimism around the Club. Former Brighton & Hove Albion and Leyton Orient fan favourite Dean Cox was appointed as the Club's new manager as the Hillians look to improve on recent seasons. Off the pitch Vince Alfiei has taken over as Chairman and improvements all over the ground can be seen already as the Club looks to adopt a more community feel about it.

We wish the Hillians all the best in their F.A.Cup Second Qualifying Round tie away to Sheppey United this coming Saturday.

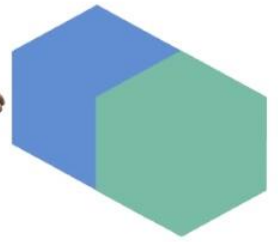
