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HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. The U23s were disbanded but we had an additional U18s (all U16s) playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays but this year playing in the U17s division.

This season sees Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure and Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach.

Bridges remained top of the League after this game, but they started poorly and at times needed keeper Jasper Sheik to be on top form.

Broadbridge Heath started far better than their hosts and deservedly went ahead after ten minutes when Mario Quiassaca showed his strength before laying the ball to **LOUIS EVANS**, who finished in style. And they could have doubled their tally but for a fine save by Sheik from Sam Lemon.

Bridges responded at last after 21 minutes, a fine ball down the line by Ridwan Euba being gathered and crossed by Ibrahim Jalloh for **NOEL LEIGHTON** to head home. Brannon O'Neill and Jalloh had further efforts saved, but shortly before half time a frantic twenty second spell saw Sheik deny the visiting side on four separate occasions!

Roshan Greensall tipped over a Leighton effort shortly after the restart, but a nudge on Tresor Difika led to **O'NEILL** netting from the spot after 54 minutes. The penalty decision looked a generous one, but Bridges seemed to have a better shout for one five minutes later!

The best move of the match after 65 minutes saw Ethon Archer guide the perfect pass to the overlapping **DAN FERRERIA** to increase the lead, and three minutes from time an O'Neill corner was headed home again by **LEIGHTON**.

Jalloh was just wide as Bridges suddenly threatened to net with every attack, but in added time lack of communication between Sheik and Difika gave former Bridges man **MASON DOUGHTY** the easy chance for a consolation goal.

Out of the Senior Cup but certainly not disgraced as our young much changed side gave their Premier League hosts a scare with some fine performances all round. These included Conner Collcutt in an unfamiliar left back role and Harvey Woollard, who often bossed the midfield and only marred his performance with a silly comment to one of the Assistant Referees in the last moments of added time to earn an unnecessary second yellow card.

Not that it started well for Bridges as they found themselves two down inside eleven minutes. A simple attack down the right led to **Davide Rodari** slotting home easily after five minutes, and after Hastings hit the woodwork for the first time (they also hit it twice more during the game), **Rodari** was on hand to add his second.

But Bridges quickly hit back, a 15th minute Woollard corner being met by a solid header in the centre by **Billy Irving**, who could probably call himself a veteran of the side (aged 23) in this line up! And just six minutes later, Bridges were on level terms when good work by Ethon Archer created havoc in the Hastings defence with **Noel Leighton**, captaining the side in the absence of Brannon O'Neill, applying the decisive touch.

Just three minutes into the second half, another good quick move down the right saw **Elliott Hanslow** finish in style, and there were chances at both ends before former Bridges player John Ufuah came on and boosted his side's attacking flair. When he was felled in the box after 79 minutes, **Rodari** gratefully accepted the chance to seal his hat trick from the spot, but Hastings – desperate for the game not to go to a penalty shoot out – were given another opportunity three minutes from the end of normal time when Ufuah was fouled again on the edge of the box. The free kick came in hard and low and then reared up for **Karl Obafemi Akinwande** to bundle over the line at the near post.

Cruel on Bridges, who deserved at least a chance of glory in a penalty shoot out, but credit to all the team for showing their skills against a side who sat in fifth place in the Isthmian League Premier Division at the start of this game.

Three Bridges continued their unbeaten run in the league to seven games as they won for the second time this season against newly promoted Phoenix Sports to keep them top of the Isthmian South East Division. Bridges started the season as odds on favourites to finish bottom of the league but some of the football they are playing this season is a delight to watch and the team confidence that they are showing in their play is beginning to turn some heads.

Bridges started brightly with a couple of dangerous threats but it took a goalkeeper fumble on 28 minutes to get Bridges off the mark with Noel Leighton tapping home from four yards out. Phoenix had an opportunity to level shortly after when everyone expected the offside flag to go up but they failed to capitalise. Bridges then went straight up the other end and Kevin Rivera finished off a cushioned header down from Noel Leighton following a glorious cross from the dangerous Ibbby Jalloh to extend Bridges lead to 2-0. Bridges then had a third goal disallowed for offside and this appeared to spur Phoenix Sports into action. Phoenix got a goal back almost immediately through a long range Alfie Evans effort on 34 minutes and a header from Matt Bourne in the third minute of added time in the first half brought things level at 2-2 going into the half time break.

The half time team talk from Bridges manager, Jamie Crellin, provided the necessary adjustment and inspiration for Bridges to reaffirm their hold on the game and just six minutes into the second half Bridges took the lead with a header from Kevin Rivera who rose highest from a Brannon O'Neill corner. Bridges then went on the rampage with Noel Leighton capitalising on another goalkeeper error to make it 4-2 in the 52nd minute. Ibbby Jalloh scored his first and Bridges fifth goal on 66 minutes beating five Phoenix players before despatching with a delightful finish into the top corner. Noel Leighton completed his hat-trick on 70 minutes when Jalloh crossed from the right hand side for Leighton to control on his chest and volley into the far corner for Bridges sixth of the game. Bridges had a couple more half chances to extend their lead further but the game was won with four Bridges goals in 19 second half minutes to register their third away win of the season which is more than Bridges managed in all of the previous season.

Bridges extended their lead at the top of the table to six points, albeit having played more games than most, but their latest win came against a side who started the evening in second place and having not conceded a goal in their five League games. But Bridges felt they should have had an early opportunity to spoil that record when Ibrahim Jalloh looked to have been sent tumbling to the ground inside the penalty box with only three minutes on the clock!

Noel Leighton was unlucky with a couple of close chances but Chichester responded with a stinging effort by Emmett Dunn that Jasper Sheik dealt with at the second time of asking. Ethan Prichard also fired just wide, but at the other end there was a goal line clearance.

With the game finely in the balance, City were awarded a penalty after 36 minutes for a clumsy challenge, but Steve Hutchings' crisply hit spot kick was brilliantly pushed away by Sheik, and the sides duly went in on deserved level terms.

What turned out to be the winning goal came ten minutes into the second half as Bridges exerted pressure in a crowded goalmouth. Harvey Woollard, who along with the equally diminutive Bryan Villavicencio bossed the centre of midfield, hit goalwards from the edge of the box, and the defensive block saw the ball rear up towards **Leighton**, whose header looped over keeper Kieran Magee. It was Leighton's fifteenth of the season to date, and whilst it is unlikely to feature in any Goal of the Season nominations, it certainly proved vital as Bridges held on for their first 'clean sheet' of the season!

Much of this can be attributed to excellent performances at the back by the likes of Taylor Curran and Ridwan Euba, but the visitors also showed plenty of flair going forward with Jalloh and Kevin Rivera both unlucky not to get on the scoresheet. Camron Lawson had two half chances to give Bridges breathing space, especially as Chichester threw everything at them in the final stages with Sheik having to brilliantly tip over a cracker from Conrad Honore in the third of six added minutes.

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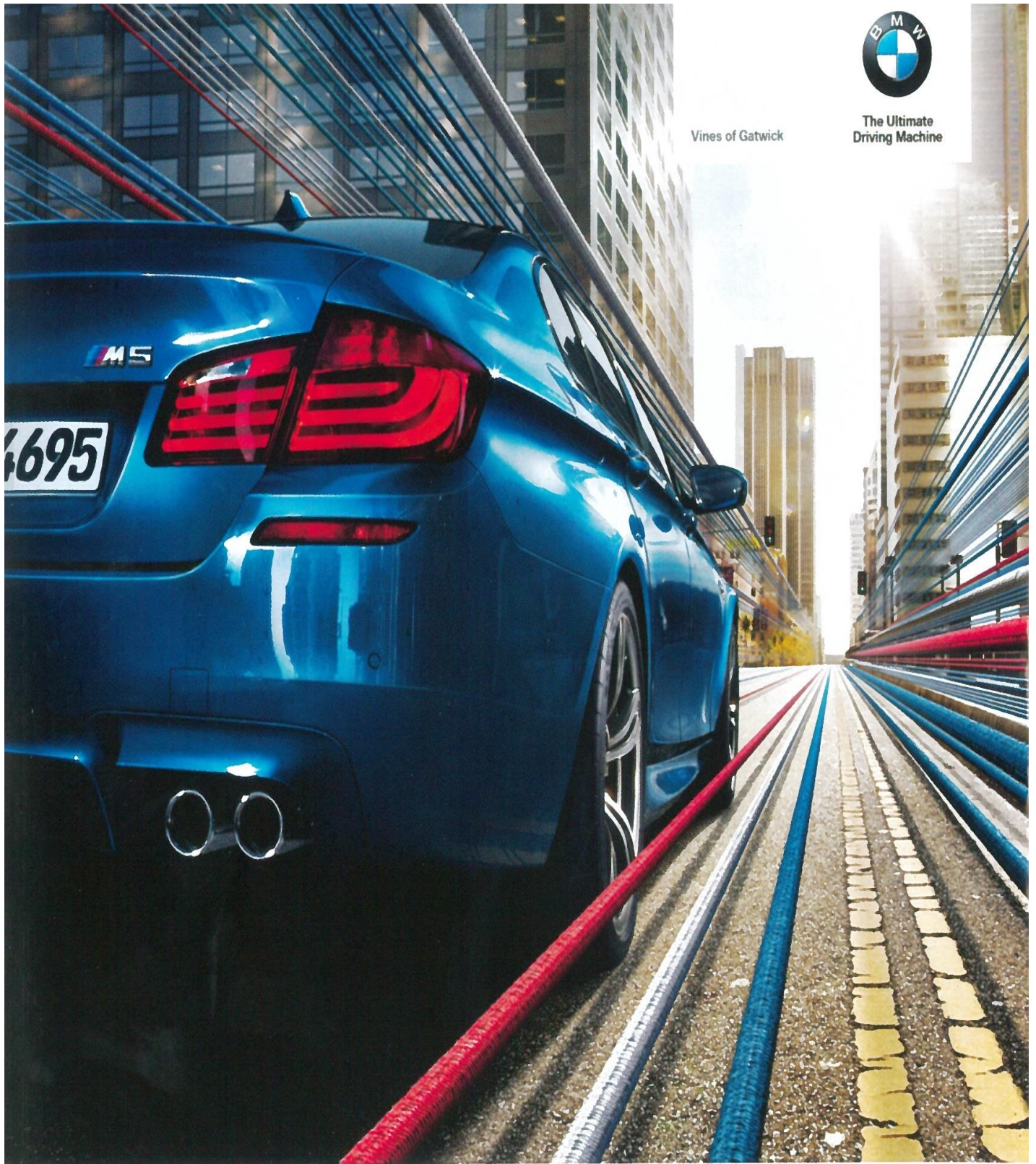

LITTLEHAMPTON TOWN

Littlehampton Town Football Club was officially founded in 1896, but evidence suggests football was played in the town as early as 1891 and the club started in 1893. In the early years games were played at Selborne Road but in the early 1900s sport moved to The Sportsfield on St Flora's Road where matches continue to be played today.

Back then the team's colours were dark green and the club were known as the 'Greenbacks.' The colours were changed in 1911 to blue and then in 1931 to white. In 1923 Tottenham Hotspur came to town for a friendly and won 7-1.

Littlehampton Town joined the Sussex County Football League in 1928 and the club stayed in Division 1 for 67 years. The first match in the new league was against Haywards Heath and the team won 5-1. In 1949 they won the Royal Ulster Rifles (RUR) Charity Cup and the Sussex Senior Challenge Cup.

The team changed to a gold strip in 1953 and the first reference to their nickname 'The Marigolds' was in the Littlehampton Gazette on 13th November 1953.

Under the guidance of Terry Gill the team were successful in the late 1960s and they won the Sussex Senior Challenge Cup again in 1970. Littlehampton Town were Division 1 runners-up eight times until they finally won the title in 1991. That year will never be forgotten.

A draw at Peacehaven & Telscombe in front of 1,400 fans meant Golds won the title on goal difference. The same year the club won through to the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. The highlight was a home match against Northampton Town, staged at The Sportsfield in front of 4,000 fans.

The Golds also reached the semi final of the FA Vase, losing to Gresley Rovers over two legs. That year the team played more cup matches than league games and won the Sussex League Challenge Cup and reached the final of the Sussex Senior Cup too. Littlehampton Town dropped to Division 2 in 1995 and Carl Stabler came back as manager and took them back up in 1997, where they were again runners-up in the division.

In 2003 they were relegated once more, but made a swift return with a Division 2 league and cup double success. They fell out of the top flight again in 2008 and spent six years in Division 2.

Mark Bennett, a former player from the 1991 season joined as manager and oversaw the Division 2 title in 2013, where they only lost four league games all season and were finalists in the John O'Hara Cup. In 2015 they recaptured the Division 1 title - for the first time in 23 years - on the final day and the last year of the Sussex County Football League.

With Mark Bennett's departure, player George Gaskin took over management of the club and guided the team to a mid-table finish. A year later the team dropped out of the top flight and into Division 1. In 2018, Littlehampton Town welcomed back both Mark Bennett as manager and George Gaskin as striker to help rebuild the club and return them to former glories.

The next two seasons were unfortunately curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. In 2020, the Marigolds were unbeaten in the league, but no promotion was allowed. After a repeat performance in 2021, we did secure promotion on points-per-game. With George Gaskin joined at the managerial helm by Mitchell Hand, the first year back in the Southern Combination Football League Premier Division was arguably the best in the team's 126-year history to date. The Marigolds won the title, again on the final day of the season in front of 1,000 fans.

But it was also in the cups that brought them so much glory. As winners of both the League Cup and the RUR Charity Cup, a historic treble was nearly a quadruple as the team reached Wembley to play in the FA Vase final. As the first non-league team from Sussex to reach Wembley, it was an extraordinary achievement.

And despite losing 3-0 in the end to Newport Pagnell Town, the amazing home crowds in the quarter and semi-finals — of over 3,000 — ensured the entire town was behind the team in an incredible season. The club finished a respectable 12th in their first-ever season at Step 4 in the Pitching In Isthmian Football League South East Division last year.

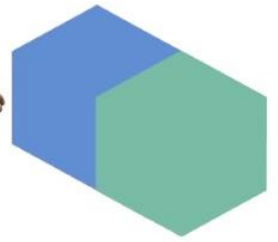
