With the Chairman being absent for a few days, it's a long time since 'Jubilee Jottings' was a feature in our programme, but we'll be hoping it's only a brief stop before normal service is resumed!

Welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Sheppey United FC for this rearranged fixture, rearranged of course due to their successes in the Emirates F.A.Cup, where they were one of three teams in our division (Cray Valley PM and Ramsgate) to reach the First Round Proper before going out 1-4 at home to Walsall. But they did have the excitement of going one up before the League Two side made their status count.

They are now intent on catching up with their League programme, although their most recent result was a 2-3 loss away to Ashford United last Saturday.

Honours were shared between us last season. On 28th February, we won 4-1 here thanks to a brace from Noel Leighton, a penalty by Brannon O'Neill and that rarer spotted strike from Michael Wilson. The return game on 8th April saw Sheppey win 3-2, our goals coming from Curtis Gayler and Kevin Rivera.

Our form has dipped in the last few weeks, and Saturday's game at Sittingbourne was frustrating as we managed to get back into the contest just before half time but then couldn't get the rub of the green with one contentious incident and luck not being on the side of, particularly, keeper Jasper Sheik, who really doesn't deserve to have conceded so many goals!

We now embark on a number of home games, five of the next six (tonight included) being here at the Jubilee Field. But, as well as Sheppey, those fixtures include games against the other two F.A.Cup heroes, Cray Valley PM and Ramsgate, the latter of course still being involved in that illustrious competition with a Second Round tie at AFC Wimbledon to look forward to.

Ramsgate have meanwhile taken over the leadership of the South East Division from us, and they look pretty ominous at the moment, Saturday's 9-1 win over Phoenix Sports showing their intentions.

But we hope that our supporters will continue to 'keep the faith' and let's get back to winning ways quickly.

Tonight's Match Ball Sponsor is Gateman Supremo Simon Rollings, and we thank him for his continued support.

Enjoy tonight's game and hope to see you here again on Saturday, when we host Erith & Belvedere.

HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season. After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. The U23s were disbanded but we had an additional U18s (all U16s) playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays but this year playing in the U17s division.

This season sees Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure and Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach.

A team second in the Premier Division of the Isthmian League finally proved too big a hurdle as Bridges took their exit from the Velocity League Cup at the Third Round stage. But Bridges could hardly have wished for a better start when Ibrahim Jalloh was felled in the box in less than a minute. Brannon O'Neill's spot kick was brilliantly parried by Ben Bridle Card, but **CAMRON LAWSON** tucked in the loose ball to put his side one up.

O'Neill had a header well held before Chatham gained a 14th minute corner, which was met by the head of an unmarked **DEAN BECKWITH** to level the scores. And five minutes later they were ahead when the excellent **BEN ALLEN** drove home a stunning free kick from the edge of the goal area.

Bridges weren't phased however and a great run by **JALLOH** ended with a stunning drive that even Bridle Card couldn't stop. But both goalkeepers were in good form with the Chatham keeper denying Jalloh either side of two fine stops by Jasper Sheik to deny Ashley Nzala.

Sheik pushed away a decent effort by Danny Kedwell just after the interval, whilst Bridle Card wasn't to be outdone as he made an equally good block to frustrate Noel Leighton. But after 64 minutes Allen's free kick to the near post was gleefully headed in by **KEDWELL**.

Jalloh fired just over after another exhilarating run, but Chatham at last put daylight between themselves and Bridges as a ball was headed on in the box for **KAREEM ISIAKA** to net from close range with the Assistant Referee not interested in Bridges' pleas for an offside flag.

Twelve minutes of added time failed to produce any more goals, and while Bridges were not disgraced, they had to accept that the better team won on the night.

A game that Bridges seemed to have comfortably won almost became a defeat, and but for a fantastic last minute save by Jasper Sheik, this could so easily have been a nightmare end for the side.

The two sides seemed content to test each other out in the opening quarter of the game with only Sheik pushing away an effort from Theo Osinfolarin being worthy of note. But after 26 minutes the two players Bridges have sorely missed recently helped to create the opener for the visitors.

Tresor Difika showed remarkable coolness as he broke up a home attack and then delivered the perfect ball for Kevin Rivera, who broke away despite a couple of challenges and was unselfish with the final ball as he set up IBRAHIM JALLOH for a smart opening goal.

Noel Leighton came close with a couple of headers and Jalloh caused problems with his pace, but the first half ended with Michael Salako headed wide from a good cross. Both full backs, Tom Hanfrey and Sam German, delivered a string of tempting balls into the box, but a mixture of Bridges stubbornness and some indifferent finishing had let Herne Bay down at this point.

Camron Lawson and Jalloh both tested Harry Brooks as the second half began, and Leighton headed just over from Ridwan Euba's delightful cross before Bridges doubled their lead after 55 minutes with Lawson and Leighton being blocked before RIVERA finished with aplomb.

And three minutes later, just after Mo Kamara was wide when decently placed, a quick clearance out of defence found JALLOH, who beat the last defender and the keeper to guide the ball into an empty net.

Three goals clear but suddenly Bridges resorted to long hopeful balls instead of calming the play, and on the hour Sheik managed to parry Jacob Gilbert's shot only for SALAKO to jab in the loose ball from a yard out.

It was now Herne Bay in the ascendancy and after 68 minutes a Hanfrey cross from the left was the perfect invitation for SALAKO to head home. And almost inevitably another identical cross by Hanfrey was met by another SALAKO header for his hat trick in the 78th minute.

Bridges were now firmly on the back foot with just a few sporadic attacks, and twice there were last gasp clearances by Sheik and his defence as the game shifted into six added minutes. With the referee also determined to let the game flow, albeit that both sides felt they should have had a few free kicks, this proved to be a thoroughly entertaining match and a credit to the League, but Bridges will feel less happier with the final result than their hosts.

This is not a good spell for Bridges with fifteen goals conceded in the last four games, eleven of those conceded coming in three away games with only one point gained. So, their spell at the top of the League was good while it lasted, but there needs to be a rapid change of fortune to get back in the promotion chase.

Sittingbourne certainly had their visitors on the ropes in the early stages, looking unlucky to have an offside decision go against them in the tenth minute after lovely interplay involving Donvieve Jones, Jean Baptiste Fischer and Harry Hopes, but five minutes later they deservedly went ahead when a free kick was only half cleared and Jones set up **Joe Tyrie** for the opening goal.

But Bridges gradually got back into contention and drew level six minutes before the interval when Camron Lawson laid the ball into the path of **IBRAHIM JALLOH**, who slammed it past Bobby Mason. And Bridges really should have gone into the break with a lead as Callum Donaghey headed wide of an open goal from Brannon O'Neill's corner, Jalloh saw a drive pushed away and an inviting cross by Jalloh was spurned by Lawson.

A definite turning point came after 56 minutes when Jalloh was pulled back by Chris Arthur, and there were more than a few calls for a red card as he seemed to be the last defender, but a yellow card was shown and this and the introduction soon after of Chris Harris gave the momentum back to the hosts.

After 66 minutes a corner was only half cleared and **Fischer** stabbed home the loose ball. A minute later it was Sittingbourne's bench who earned a yellow card for insisting that Donaghey's challenge by the centre circle should have been further punished!

In the 74th minute, a good cross from the left by Bagasan Graham was blocked by Jasper Sheik but quickly followed up by **Fischer**, and three minutes from the end of the ninety, Sheik did brilliantly to race out and clear only for **Harris** to lob back into a now empty net.

A couple of late half chances for Kevin Rivera and Noel Leighton were hopeful of making the scoreline more respectable, but this was a major blow after such an impressive start to the season by Jamie Crellin's team.

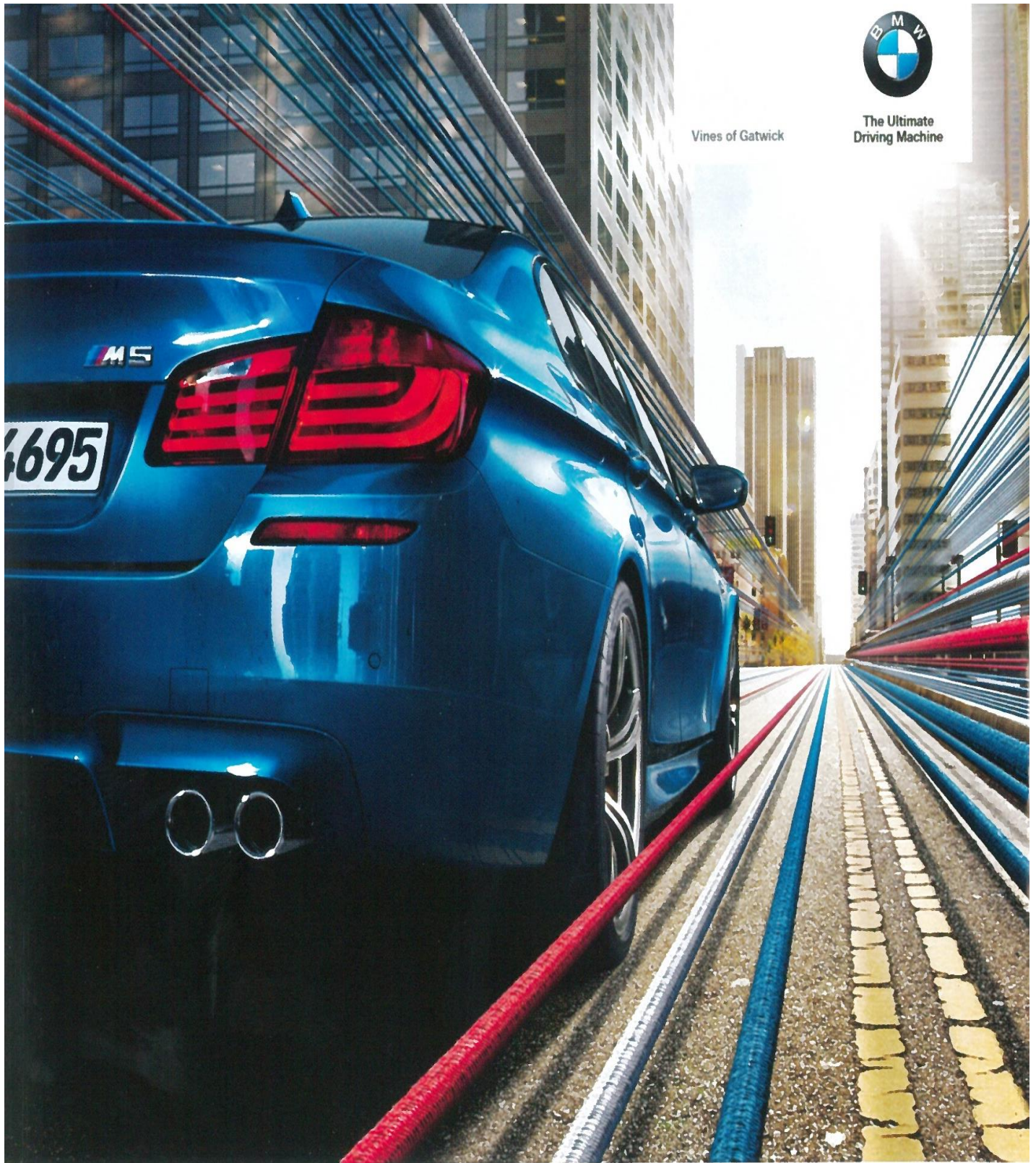

SHEPPEY UNITED

Sheppey United FC was formed in 1890 by a merger of Sheerness Victoria and Invicta, and initially played at the Sheppey United Cricket Club ground at Botany Road. The first match was at Sittingbourne on 20 September 1890, with Sheppey running out 3-1 winners despite turning up with only ten players. The match report referred to us as 'the Sheppeyites', hence the club nickname 'The Ites', which remains to this day.

They were founder members of both the Southern League and the Kent League in 1894. In the Southern League they were placed in Division Two, in which they finished as runners-up in the first season, before losing the promotion/relegation test match against Clapton 5-1.

The following season they finished second again, and this time won the test match, defeating Royal Ordnance Factories 4-2 to earn promotion to Division One. At the end of the season they left the Kent League. The season also saw the club make their debut in the FA Cup when they played Millwall Athletic, but lost 4-0.

In their first season in Division One they finished second bottom of the table, but avoided relegation by defeating RETB Chatham 2-1 in the test matches. In 1898-99 they again finished second bottom of the table but retained their Division One status after drawing the test match against Thames Ironworks 1-1. However, the following season they finished bottom of the table and lost the test match against Watford 2-1, resulting in relegation back to Division Two.

The club re-joined the Kent League prior to the start of the 1900-01 season, as well as remaining in the Southern League. However, after a single season back in Division Two, the club withdrew from the Southern League. In 1905-06 they won the Kent League and repeated the feat the following season. A third title was won in 1927-28, by the reserve team as the first team had re-joined the Southern League for that season and were placed in the English Section. However, after finishing bottom of the league in both 1930-31 and 1931-32 they resigned, and returned to the Kent League in Division One.

At the end of the 1938-39 season Sheppey finished bottom of the league and should have been relegated, but the league was suspended due to the Second World War. After the war Sheppey were placed back in the top division of the Kent league for the 1945-46 season. The club then remained in Division one until the 1958-59 season when the Kent league stopped.

In 1959 they were founder members of the Aetolian League, which they played in until it merged with the London League to form the Greater London League in 1964. After winning Section B of the Greater London League in 1964-65, the club joined the Metropolitan League. They had a single season in the Metropolitan-London League in 1971-72 after it was formed by a merger of the Metropolitan League and the Greater London, before re-joining the new Kent League in 1972. They won the title in their first season back in the league and were league champions again in 1974-75 and 1978-79, as well as winning the League Cup in 1975-76 and 1978-79. After finishing second in 1983-84, the club re-joined the Southern League for a third spell. However, after finishing bottom of Division One South in 1989-90 they returned to the Kent League. They finished bottom of the table in their first season back, but a gradual improvement saw them win the league in 1994-95.

Sheppey United sold the much-loved Botany Round ground to developers in 1992 to clear a massive overdraft, and this started a long and slow death for the club.

Initially this did not appear to present too many problems as Sheppey romped away with the Kent League title, whilst ground-sharing with Faversham Town, losing only two out of forty games. Ultimately however, as the club spent most of the 1990s trying in vain to find a new home on the Island, years of playing away from Sheppey began to take its toll, as the club moved from Faversham, to Canterbury, and then to Sittingbourne. Attendances fell sharply as supporters increasingly became disenchanted with traveling off the Island for 'home' games, and the club could no longer afford the rents involved.

In March 2001 the club resigned from the Kent League and their record was expunged. The senior team was disbanded until being reformed in 2003, when they joined Division Two East of the Kent County League. They

finished second in their first season and were promoted to Division One East. The club was renamed AFC Sheppey in 2007, but was disbanded and reformed under their original name prior to the 2010–11 season.

In June 2013 the club merged with Sheerness East FC to become Sheppey & Sheerness United FC competing in the Kent County League Premier Division with the club playing their home games at Holm Park formerly Canning Town Gasworks and then Sheerness Steel Sports Ground. The season saw the club win the Kent FA Intermediate Challenge Shield and finish runners up in the league and were promoted to the Kent Invicta League.

In the summer of 2014 the club was renamed back to Sheppey United FC.

Major investment has been injected into Holm Park including: perimeter fencing, new dressing rooms, club house refurbishments, floodlights, stands, levelling the main pitch including installing drainage and sprinkler system.

A second place finish in the Kent Invicta League was achieved at the end of the 2015/16 season gaining promotion to the Southern Counties East Football League Premier Division. The Kent Invicta League merged into the Southern Counties East Football League that summer forming Division One.

2016 was a remarkable season for the club winning the Kent Senior Trophy, beating Ashford United on penalties at Maidstone United's Gallagher Stadium in front of a crowd of 870, whilst Holm Park's ground regeneration saw 715 fans flock to the stadium for a home match against Glebe.

A sixth-place finish in the SCEFL Premier Division was a great achievement in the club's return to Step 5 of the Non-League pyramid and a SCEFL League Cup Final appearance at Tonbridge Angels losing 2-0 to Sevenoaks Town. In the 2017-18 Season the team finished in a disappointing 11th place in the SCEFL Premier Division but did reach the Kent Senior Trophy Final again at The Gallagher in front of 917 spectators eventually losing 2-1 in Extra time to newly promoted Whitstable Town.

The 2018-19 Season saw an improvement on the previous season with an eventual 7th place finish in the Premier Division but the points were mainly gained before Christmas and the 2019 form was very inconsistent. The positives were the announcement that we run an U23s team in the coming season to fill the gap between the U18's and Senior side and the opening of the new covered Queenborough Road end stand behind the goal so we now have covered viewing from three sides of the ground.

The club went into the 2019/20 season with high hopes as many new, experienced players were added to the squad, and by 14 March 2020 the team had certainly not disappointed. Unbeaten in the whole of 2020 with only nine league games remaining they were one of four clubs fighting for promotion, and having already played every team in the top half of the table, on paper at least, had by far the easiest run-in. They had also fought their way to the final of the Kent Senior Trophy. Things were looking very bright at Holm Park.....but then this happened on 21 March. Because of the outbreak of COVID 19 the FA announced that the season would end from this date for all leagues at Step 3 and below, all results were expunged, making the season null and void. The Trophy final against Corinthian was also cancelled.

Nobody knew when, or even if, the 2020/21 season would start, but it eventually began on 1 September, and in November, after nine unbeaten games, Sheppey were once again amongst the front runners, five points behind top club Chatham, but with two games in hand. This is when, once again, the leagues were postponed because of a re-emergence of the virus. As there was no improvement by January 2021 it was decided to bring this season to an end. However, because of a re-structure to the Step 4 level, the FA announced one club from the Step 5 SCEFL league would be promoted. This was to be decided by combining the last two seasons' final league tables and promote the top club on a points per game system. Corinthian were top with an average of 2.38 ppg with Sheppey second on 2.22 ppg, therefore Sheppey lost out on promotion to the Isthmian League by just 0.16 of a point. The lack of football at this time gave the directors the opportunity to further upgrade Holm Park. An all-weather 3G pitch was laid, new LED floodlights installed, an improvement to the walkways around the pitch, new dugouts and ground fencing and an upgrade to the pitch-side hospitalities. This now gave the club a ground grading criteria way above its current step 5. The 2021/22 season was one we will never forget not only was it our first on the newly installed 3G pitch but we won a never to be equalled four trophies. The Kent FA finally arranged the postponed 2019/20 Kent Senior Trophy final for 1st February where we would face Corinthians who now played at Step 4 in the Isthmian League. We won the match 3-1 to lift the cup for the second time in 5 years. In April we competed for the 2021/22 Kent Senior Trophy Final at the Gallagher against Hollands & Blair and won a tight match 2-1 to lift the same trophy twice in the same season. The SCEFL Premier Division title was finally sealed on the final day of the season 23rd April with a points tally of 102 compared to Runners Up Chatham Town with 100. Then in May we would face Crowborough Athletic in the SCEFL League Cup and won 5-1.

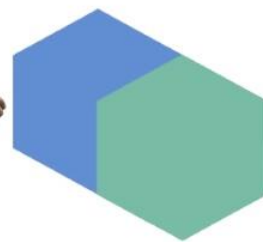
