HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FC

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot-out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season. After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. Oliver Saunders remained as U23s Manager, assisted by Tom Hayward who had been involved with the U18s as both Assistant Manager and Manager over the previous four seasons, while First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. Sadly Oliver decided to move to South Park as First Team Coach in November 2019, following Martin Dynan's appointment there so Tom was appointed as U23s Manager for the remainder of the season. For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. The U23s were disbanded but we had an additional U18s (all U16s) playing in the Southern Combination Football League on Sundays but this year playing in the U17s division.

This season sees Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure and Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach.

Having conceded eleven goals in three away games, Bridges showed that home is where the heart is as they plundered their second six goal tally in two games inside five days! Three players grabbed a brace, although it seemed as though Erith keeper Jordan Perrin would be the hero as he made excellent saves from Camron Lawson, Ibrahim Jalloh, Noel Leighton and Dan Ferreira all in the first ten minutes.

But Bridges deservedly went ahead after sixteen minutes when Jalloh's inviting cross from the right was met by a well timed leap and header by KEVIN RIVERA.

Erith, despite the final score line, were no mugs though, and it needed a couple of fine blocks by Jasper Sheik to deny Josh Ajayi and Cameron Andrews.

But two minutes before half time, a lovely through ball by Jalloh gave RIVERA the chance to slide the ball past Perrin. And with the game into first half stoppage time, Harvey Woollard hit the underside of the bar with a cracking shot before being upended as he chased the loose ball. Up stepped JALLOH to net from the spot with the last kick of the half.

Erith started the second half in attacking mood, but six minutes after the restart they suffered again as Rivera played the ball wide to Lawson, whose brilliant cross was met by the head of LEIGHTON.

Ten minutes later Rivera lobbed the ball over the defence and LEIGHTON finished in style. And only two minutes after that, JALLOH, who had terrorised Erith's defence regularly, lobbed a beauty that was too much even for Perrin.

But he did make another good save from Rivera, whilst Lawson and Jalloh both had late efforts blocked. At the other end Andrews was denied by Sheik, but they did grab an 84th minute consolation when a cross was met by former Bridges striker MARCUS ELLIOTT, who showed he has lost none of his predatory instincts.

Bridges came back from a two goal half time deficit to grab another precious point in an entertaining affair at fourth placed Sevenoaks on a sunny but chilly afternoon.

Sevenoaks looked the more likely to score in the first half, yet it was two mistakes by the visitors that helped towards their lead. Jasper Sheik had already produced two excellent saves, but after nineteen minutes an under hit back pass by the normally reliable Tresor Difika bypassed Billy Irving and left KIERON CADOGAN a simple path through to goal with even Sheik not able to intervene this time.

Bryan Villavicencio, who had a very good game in midfield, saw the chance of a swift equaliser go when his cracking strike was blocked, and there were close calls from Camron Lawson and Noel Leighton too.

But Sheik was again in action to deny Roman Liburd only for more miscommunication by his defenders which led to COREY HOLDER rifling home a beauty five minutes before the break.

The half ended with Kevin Rivera having a shot saved at the near post, but overall Sevenoaks deserved their advantage at this stage. But what a turnaround as Bridges looked sharper and quicker after the break.

Ibrahim Jalloh looked to have won a penalty only to be booked for simulation, but after 58 minutes a goalmouth scramble ended with RIVERA jabbing home, and in the 70th minute more uncertainty, this time in the home defence, saw the excellent HARVEY WOOLLARD rewarded with a deflected effort.

Both sides had winning opportunities with Jalloh only just wide from a free kick and Leighton seeing a header flash wide, but a draw was a fair result for two good footballing sides.

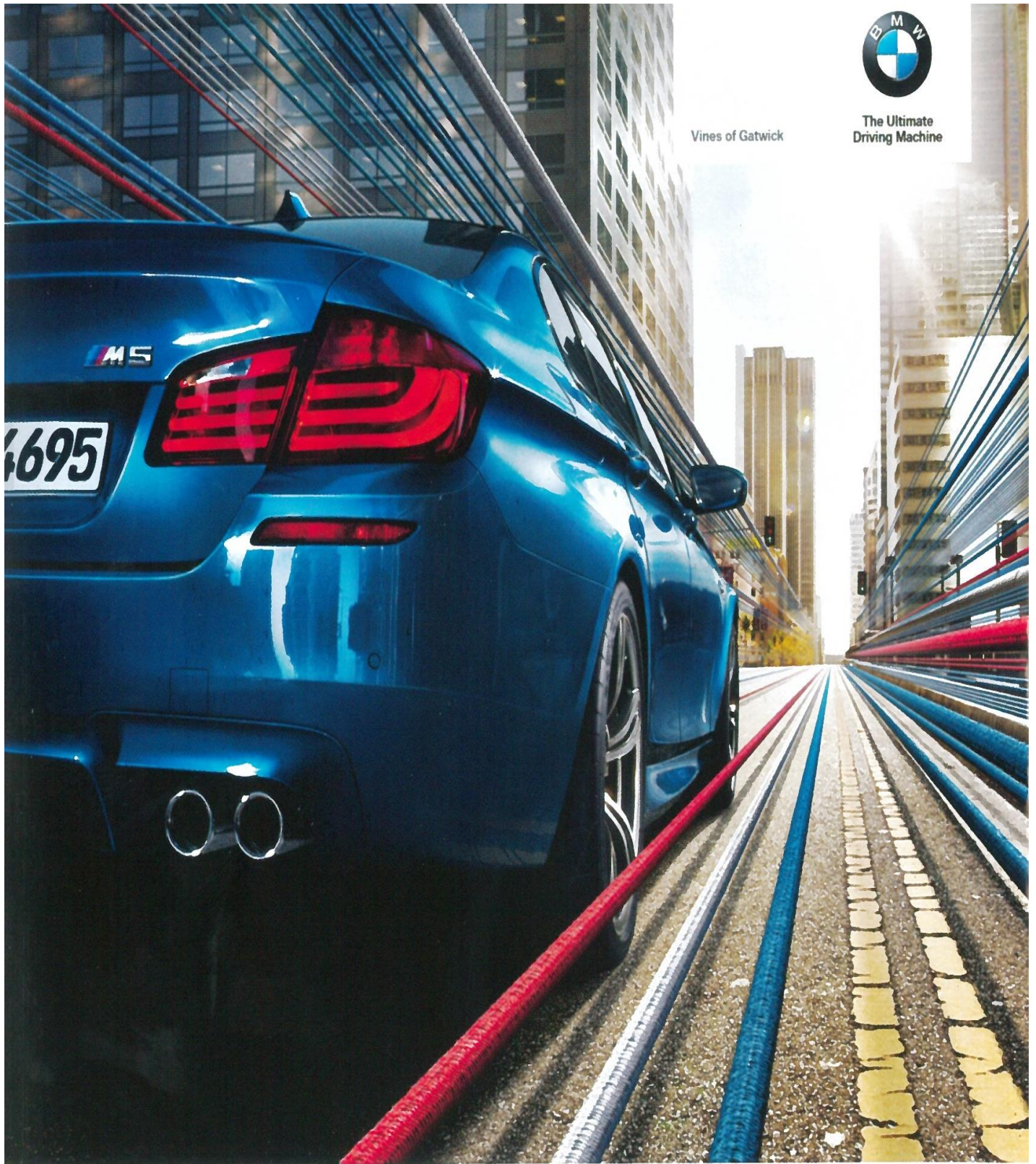

EAST GRINSTEAD TOWN

East Grinstead Town Football Club was formed on May 8, 1890, although it was another ten years before they played their first competitive matches as founder members of the Mid Sussex Football League. In those early days the club played in blue and white with the town's coat of arms on the breast pocket. It was some years before they adopted their current colours of amber and black and were nicknamed 'The Wasps,' both of which survive to this day.

They won the Mid Sussex League in 1902 and their first major honour followed seven years later when they shared the Sussex Junior Cup with Arundel. In 1909 they were awarded senior status which they have held ever since apart from two seasons when they were relegated to the intermediate third division of the Sussex County League in 1989.

In 1912 Grinstead reached the Sussex Senior Cup final for the only time in their history but lost 4-1 to St Leonards Amateurs in a ferocious snowstorm.

The Wasps were original members of the Sussex County League when it was founded in 1920, but they struggled to make any impact and after finishing bottom in 1927 they were not re-elected. Rather than returning to the Mid Sussex League, they had four successful seasons in the Brighton League before stepping up to the Southern Amateur League. A fresh challenge reinvigorated the club and they won the Division Three title in 1932 with 15 victories out of 18. Three years later they played on the Test match cricket ground at Trent Bridge in Nottingham when they defeated Nottinghamshire Amateurs 6-0 in the old FA Amateur Cup.

Determined to regain their place in the Sussex County League, they were re-elected back in 1937 after winning the Mid Sussex League again and finished fifth in their first season. In those halcyon days either side of the Second World War, four-figure crowds were the norm at their old ground in West Street, East Grinstead, which they shared with the town's cricketers. The club's record attendance is 2,006 for an FA Amateur Cup tie against Lancing in November 1947.

Success eluded Grinstead until 1952 when they won the Baldwin Cup, the forerunner of the Sussex County League Cup. That team is reckoned by many to be the finest the club has ever produced. It was certainly the most entertaining - 42 games that season in league and cup produced 222 goals! Grinstead finished third in 1955, but their fortunes began to decline along with crowd numbers after that.

They left West Street in 1959 but it wasn't until 1967 that they finally moved to their current home at East Court after a protracted battle to get the ground, which was prone to waterlogging, fit for football. In the meantime, they had a spell at King Georges Field in the town centre.

The club again finished third in 1973 in the Sussex County League but that was as good as it got for another 30 years although Grinstead did reach their first cup final since 1952 when they lost 4-1 to Haywards Heath in the RUR Cup in 1974 despite taking the lead. During the 1980s the club regularly hosted Crystal Palace and Brighton in charity fixtures watched by crowds of over 2,000.

Wasps found themselves in Division Two for the first time in 1979 and even had two seasons in Division Three before regaining senior status. They were promoted back to Division One in 1993 but lasted just two years.

Bob Smith, a former player, led Wasps back to Division One in 2003 and they also won their first trophy for 52 years, beating Three Bridges 4-0 in the final of the RUR Cup.

Unfortunately, the club were relegated back to Division Two on the final day of the 2004-05 season and in October 2006 Smith, the longest-serving manager in the club's history, was replaced by another ex-player Steve Norris.

In his second season Wasps romped to the Second Division title by a massive eighteen points, losing just twice all season. Their winning run of 14 successive league games at the start of the season meant they became the last senior non-league team in the country to drop points.

The club established itself in the top-flight over the next decade and their progress on the field has been matched off it.

Floodlights were installed in 1997 and in 2008 two new stands and a pitch perimeter barrier were erected. In 2014 with East Court already meeting the requirements of the Isthmian Football League after installing additional seating, the club began work on a new dressing room and hospitality area, turnstile block and entrance and a resurfaced car park. More than £225,000 of the cost came from external grant-aid funding.

Simon Funnell's side finished the season in second place, their highest ever County League position, and in May 2014, the club were accepted into the Isthmian League for the first time in our history. In October 2014, Simon was replaced by Tony Beckingham, who returned for a second spell having previously been in charge between February 2010-October 2011. Tony managed to keep the club in the league for a second season despite finishing in 23rd place in the table but left to join Hythe Town in September 2015. Matt Longhurst was appointed manager in October 2015 and consolidated the Wasps at Step 4 for three seasons, despite a big turnover of players. In December 2019, Matt was replaced by the former Kingstonian and Whyteleafe manager Leigh Dynan.

The suspension of the league saved the club from relegation, as they were bottom of the table when Covid-19 forced the curtailment, but Leigh rebuilt the squad and the club began the season with renewed confidence and were fourth when the 2019-20 season was abandoned because of the pandemic. Leigh had to step down at the start of 2021 due to work commitments and former Wasps' striker Tony Reid, who had enjoyed success with Westfield, was appointed in May 2021 but after a disappointing start to the season Reid left the club in November 2021 and Beckingham returned for a third spell as joint-manager alongside Drew Cooney, who has made more than 400 appearances for the club. Cooney took over as permanent manager in March 2022 and guided the club to 15th place after a strong finish to the campaign.

During the summer of 2020 the first major overhaul of the pitch since 2003 took place with new drainage and irrigation installed, most of the cost being met by grants. This project was completed in the summer of 2021.

Last season Grinstead had the better of the two results against Bridges. On 11th October 2022, they came to the Jubilee Field and won 3-2, Bridges goals coming from Camron Lawson and Kieron Pamment. The latter also scored in the reverse fixture on 14th February 2023, when the game ended in a 1-1 draw.

Our away game this season turned out better for Bridges as, on 16th September, we won 2-1 with goals from Camron Lawson and Kevin Rivera.

Former Charlton midfielder who was with us under Leigh Dynan but appearances were limited due to injuries.

Jack Kenyon

Energetic midfielder who joined Wasps in July 2023 after a successful trial in pre-season. Jack was part of Colchester's youth set up.

Kiye Martin

Highly regarded midfielder who joined the club in July 2023. Kiye's former clubs include Thatcham Town, Northwood, Bedfont Sports and Westfield after he was a youth player at Crystal Palace at the start of his career.

Ben Taylor

16-year-old goalkeeper who made his first-team bow in a pre-season game against Crawley Town in July 2023. Has all the attributes to become a top keeper.

Connor Tighe

Connor joined us in June 2023 to bring energy, creativity and goals from midfield. Previous clubs include Peacehaven, Whitehawk and Burgess Hill Town.

Max Walsh

Versatile player who can operate all over the pitch. Joined us in February 2022 and scored twice in 13 appearances in his first season. Netted four goals in our 6-0 win against Ashford in September.

Tom rejoined the Wasps in August for his second spell at the club. Both his father and grandfather played for East Grinstead.

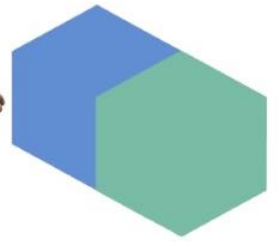

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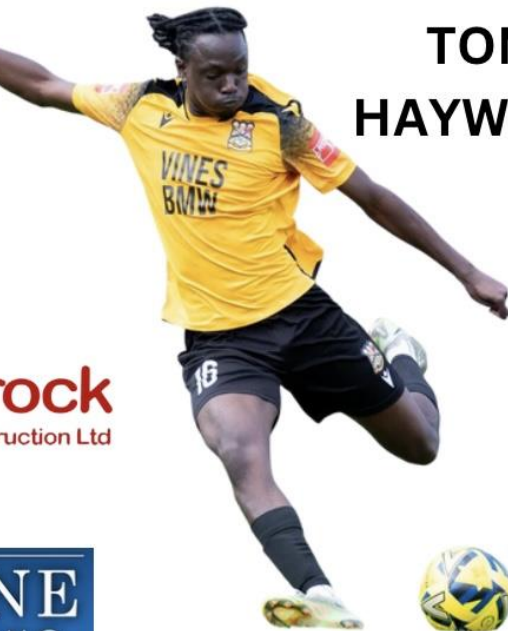
