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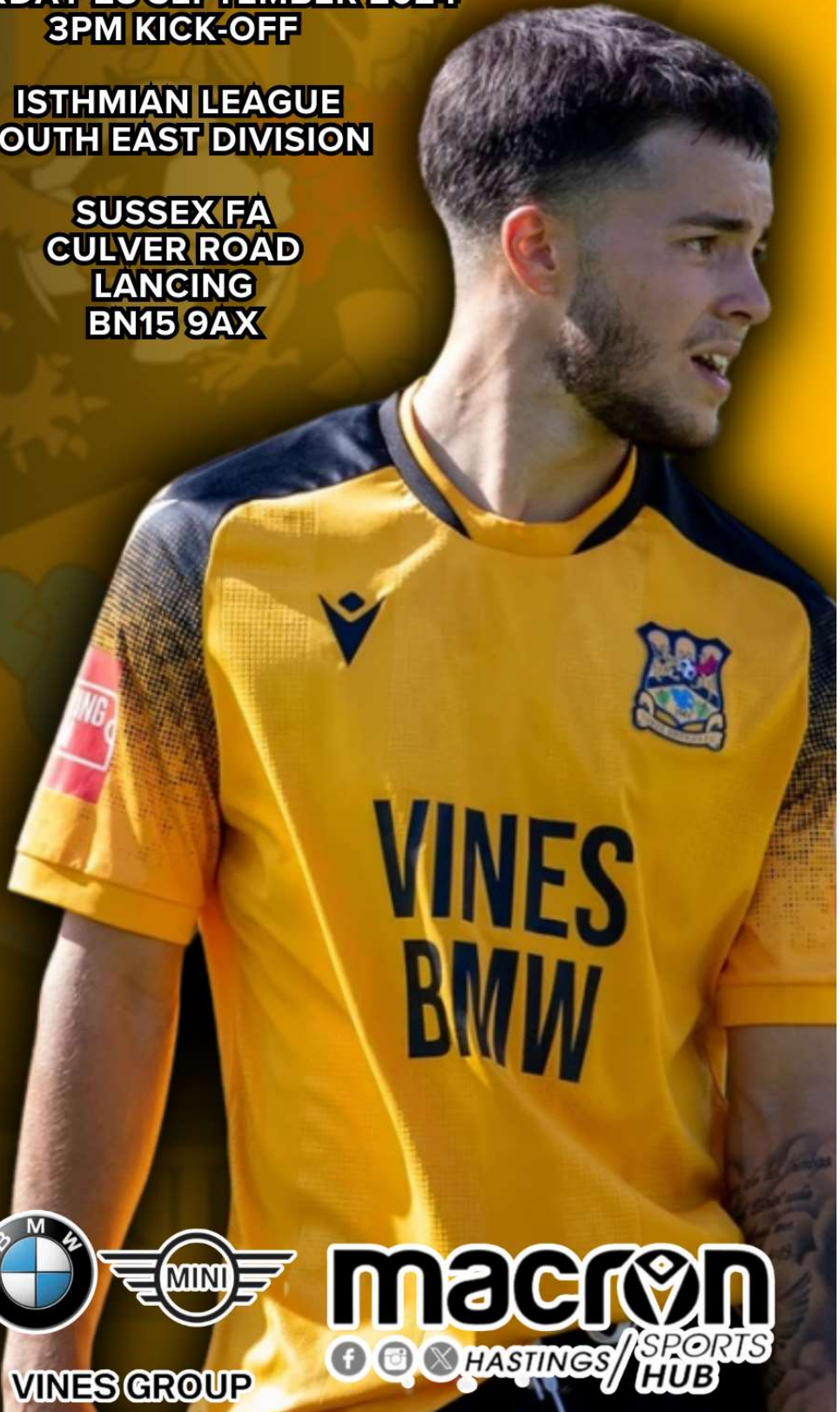

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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season. After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. Last season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure and Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the Summer, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant.

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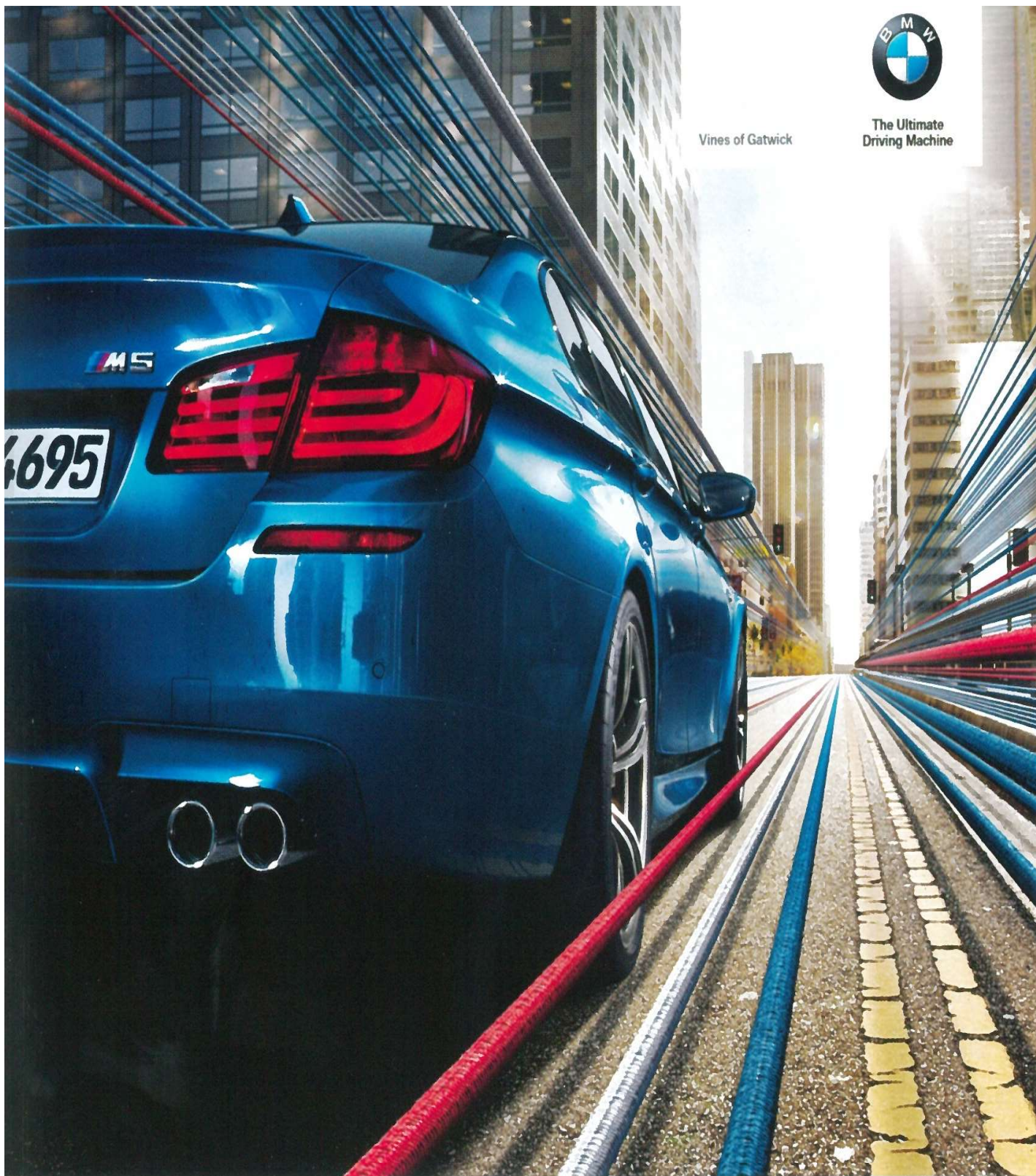

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A HISTORY OF AFC CROYDON ATHLETIC

AFC Croydon Athletic was officially born on 6th February 2012 after a group of supporters gathered at Selhurst Evangelical Church in South Norwood to form a new club. The newly appointed committee had just 7 weeks to put everything in place to convince the Football Association and the League that they were worthy of a place at Step 6 in the pyramid. Despite the challenge it was a successful journey. The need to form a new club had come about because of the demise Croydon Athletic FC who had folded playing its last game in December 2011.

A successful first season in Division One of the Combined Counties League saw a creditable 8th position. The club also won its first piece of silverware by winning the Lemon Recordings Division One cup by beating Staines Lammas 5-0 at Windsor.

The Club returned to its Spiritual home of Mayfield Stadium on 15th November 2014 with a game against Banstead Athletic. The club maintained a promotion chasing position all season and finally clinched 2nd place with a 3-0 victory over Cobham FC. The club also won its 2nd piece of silverware when winning the London Senior Trophy beating Interwood 4-3 after extra time.

With the FA having placed the club in The Southern Counties East Football League following promotion for the 2015/16 season the club then maintained their position in the league by finishing 11th. In the close season manager Antony Williams resigned as Manager and the club replaced him with Kevin Rayner. His first season saw a highest finish so far of 7th.

A move back to the Combined Counties League followed the reorganisation by the FA and two interrupted seasons due to Covid. Rayner remained at the helm throughout but the results were more of a struggle as the team finished in the lower half of the division.

In May 2023 Rayner recruited Lee Roots as his new joint Manager for the forthcoming season. Then in June 2023 it was announced that the Club had agreed to change ownership with a consortium of Danny Young, Wilfried Zaha and Stormzy taking control. The FA and the League gave their consent to that transfer just before the start of this season.

An opening day victory over Sutton Athletic in the FA Cup took place in front of a record 532 spectators. The next round at Horley Town was broadcast live on BBC Red Button and saw another victory. However, this proved to be the highlight and in September, after exiting the FA Cup and a loss to Jersey Bulls it was decided to part company with the management team.

In October Jermaine McGlashan was named Manager and he took charge of his first game away at Jersey Bulls which ended in a 1-0 victory. There followed a steady rise up the table from 17th place ultimately securing a play-off place with a 5-0 victory over Horley Town in the penultimate league game. The Playoffs involved two away fixtures first in Jersey and then at Knaphill winning both games 2-1 to secure promotion to the Isthmian League for the first time. McGlashan left the club by mutual consent in September 2024 and Michael Kamara is in temporary charge of the team.

What a contrast to last season! From being on the brink of promotion, Bridges now face a relegation battle even at this early stage as they lost at home to fellow strugglers Littlehampton.

The visitors should have taken a fourth minute lead when Charlie Pitcher fired over, but a foul by Archie Burnett three minutes later invited a free kick by Josh Short and a close range finish from SCOTT FABER. Burnett forced Taylor Seymour to a save soon after, but Bridges were struggling to deal with a number of dangerous long balls from the Marigolds.

But they were given a lifeline after 31 minutes when Kevin Rivera was fouled in the box and BURNETT saw his penalty seemingly go straight through Seymour.

Twice in three minutes, Bridges cleared off their line before a 41st minute clearance found NORDIBEK BOBOMURODOV, who sent Seymour the wrong way with a less than powerful shot to give Bridges a half time lead they'd hardly warranted.

Yet another goal line clearance early in the second half should have woken up a lethargic home side, but inevitably Town levelled after 70 minutes with a penalty of their own, calmly despatched by skipper JORDAN LAYTON. And just seven minutes later FABER took advantage of more inadequate defending to soar above everyone to head home from Scott Kirkwood's corner.

Littlehampton could have made it even worse after 84 minutes when another penalty decision went in their favour, but Kirkwood's effort was saved by the feet of Luke Glover.

Hard to select a Man of the Match for a generally woeful Bridges performance, but Dan Ferreira worked manfully in midfield along with two more of last season's successful squad, Harvey Woollard and Kevin Rivera. But some of the newcomers have plenty to do to win over the Bridges faithful.

Bridges exited from the F A Trophy, but at least they showed a few glimpses of improvement from previous losses at Ashford and at 'home' to Littlehampton.

Reece Hallard was only just over with a decent early effort, but it was Herne Bay who took the lead after only five minutes with question marks over the visiting defence. A free kick just outside the area invited Scott Heard to clip it goalwards and the unmarked KANE HAYSMAN gratefully headed past Luke Glover.

Bridges tried to respond with both Hayden Velvick and Jamie Splatt coming close, but with five of their last six games seeing them keep clean sheets, Herne Bay rarely looked alarmed.

The homesters had their own chances with an excellent overlap on the right by Jack Parter finishing with a good low save at his near post by Glover, but Bridges should have levelled before the interval. A good low ball across the face of goal from Hallard ended with Nordibek Bobomurodov being denied by keeper Harry Brooks, but it was a bad miss by Bobomurodov following another great run by Hallard two minutes before half time that proved crucial.

Instead of the sides going in level at the break, on the stroke of half time, Ethan Smith took advantage of being given time and space to lob the ball into the danger area and HEARD simply couldn't miss with no one challenging him! Bridges Manager Jamie Crellin, a top defender in his playing days, must have cringed at the simplicity of it all!

A long ball after 56 minutes ended with a good finish by ARTEM KUCHKOV for Herne Bay's third, and the game inevitably drifted into a complacent afternoon in the sun with only a decent self created low effort by Elliott Hanslow causing momentary alarm in the home defence.

EASTBOURNE TOWN 2-2 THREE BRIDGES

A point gained - or was it two points lost? Yet again, Bridges had the lead, the fifth time in as many League games, but they still couldn't hang on for that much needed win.

In fairness, Eastbourne were worthy of a share of the spoils by the final whistle after dominating long periods of the second half, but there were times when they owed much to the confident display of Chris Winterton in their goal.

He made a brilliant tip over from Reece Hallard after only five minutes and made another great stop to deny Kevin Rivera in the 34th minute. Eastbourne had sent an ambitious long range effort by JJ Walker that was comfortably held by Luke Glover, but it was probably against the run of play when the home side took a 27th minute lead.

A great deal of time and space seemed to be offered them before a low cross from the left was met by an emphatic strike by the near post from LEON GREIG, who sadly limped off shortly before the interval.

Noel Leighton, able at present to play some midweek games for Bridges, was making his presence felt for the visitors though, and two minutes before half time, he crossed from the right for REECE HALLARD to stab over the line at the far post.

And four minutes into the second half, LEIGHTON headed Bridges in front from Rivera's pinpoint cross. James Ding headed wide as Eastbourne tried to respond, but they needed Winterton on two occasions to deny Leighton on counter attacks.

Leighton himself gave way thanks to a leg injury and his replacement Elliott Romain was soon denied by Winterton. But it was Eastbourne who threatened with alarming regularity and sure enough they equalised after 81 minutes when a corner was knocked down to HARVEY GREIG to stab home. Glover made a good save to deny Freddie Warren and Marcin Ruda saw his header also saved as the game went into six added minutes.

But the last good save was inevitably made by Winterton to deny Michael Samson, although a Bridges win would have been harsh on Town.
