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Good Afternoon everyone and Happy New Year. I'd like to welcome all players, management, committee members and supporters of Ramsgate to Jubilee Field ahead of this afternoon's Isthmian League South-East Division clash. As we start 2025, I can't help but look back on 2024 with such pride at what our football club achieved.

For starters, the job that Jamie Crellin, Joe Kay and the squad of players have done over the last 12 months. Accomplishing our highest ever league position with a 4th place finish at the end of the 2023/24 season, THAT Tuesday evening in April away to Sittingbourne and then hosting a play-off final. Although it was Chichester who came out on top and achieved promotion over us, it was still against all odds at the start of that season that the play-off final would take place at Jubilee Field and in front over 1000+ supporters.

Of course, with success comes opportunity, and this happened during the summer with many of our talented players from last season's squad moving on to play at a higher level. Jamie and Joe have therefore had the tough task of having to rebuild more than half of the squad, and although it has had it's struggles in the first few months of the season, we are now seeing better performances and better results and I have great faith that this will continue moving forward during the second half of the season.

As part of our squad, we have many talented youngsters, and during the year of 2024 there was at least one player from the youth setup in the first team matchday squad for every game. On Boxing Day, three were involved in Elliot Hanslow, Connor Hayden-Pickering and George Falzon. This again shows the trust that Jamie and Joe have in the youth setup and the player pathway that is available at Three Bridges for young players.

During the summer, we expanded our youth section, welcoming new players and teams from the ages of 7 to 12, as well as welcoming a Women's team to Three Bridges as Crawley AFC transitioned to amber and black with Courtney Bartlett taking charge.

And to finish my 2024 look back, the completion of our new 3G pitch facility. In August, dreams became reality as work begun, with handover eventually taking place on 19 December, and the first game on the new pitch being played on Boxing Day against Burgess Hill Town in front of 339 in attendance. A hugely proud moment for the football club and a facility that will be game changer for not just every team at Three Bridges but also the local community of Crawley.

2024 gave us so much to be proud, and I know 2025 will be more of the same, if not better!

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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season. After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. Last season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure and Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the Summer, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant.

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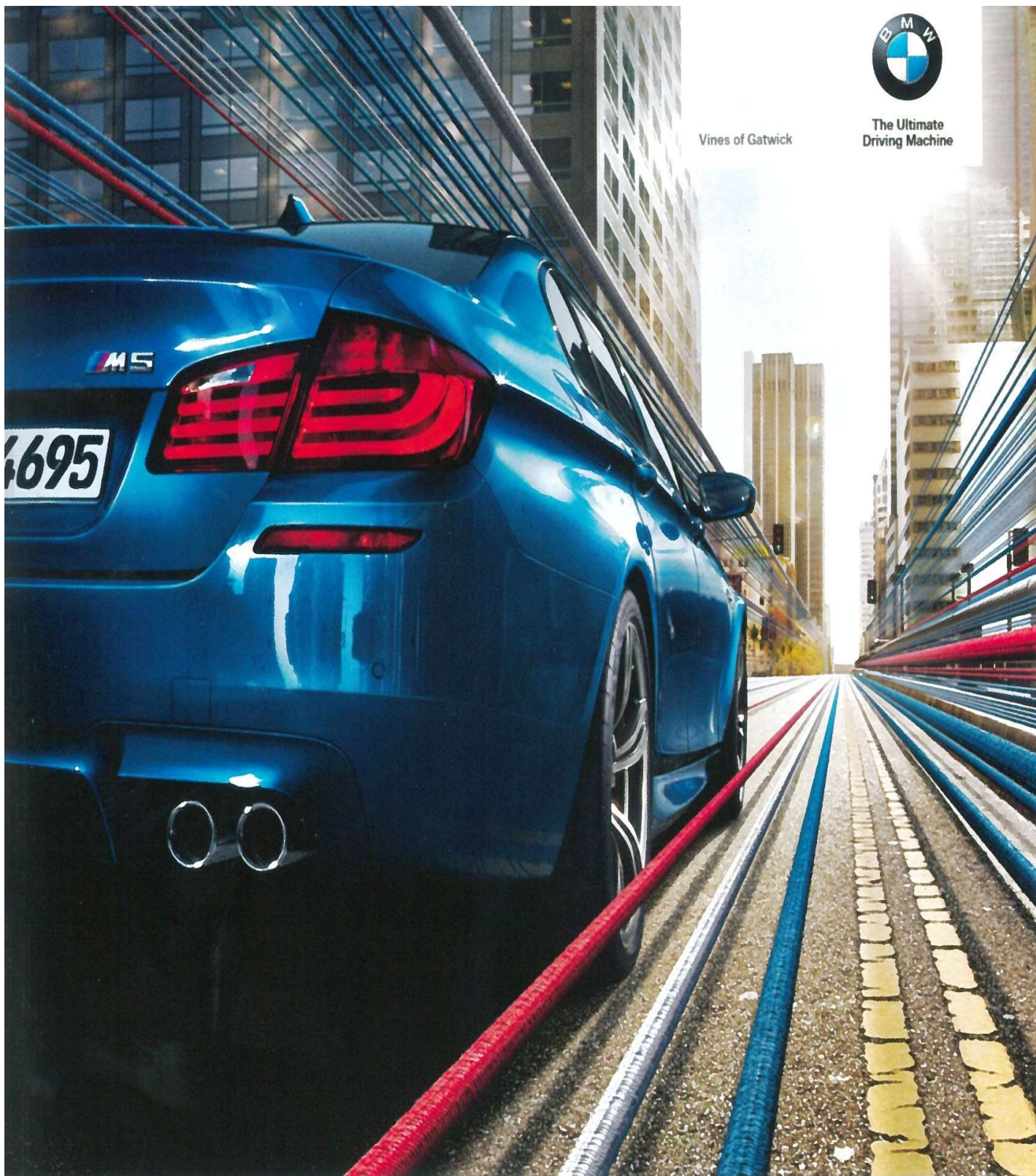
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A HISTORY OF RAMSGATE FOOTBALL CLUB

Ramsgate is one of the largest non-League clubs in Kent, and last season fielded 78 senior and youth teams, and for 2023/24 again includes 3 for women and 10 for girls as well as 2 senior men's teams comprising the 1st Team and Under 23s. The club continues to grow and following the installation of the first fixed Panna cages at an English football stadium in 2020 replaced the pitch at Southwood with a new all-weather surface that was opened with a visit from Spurs' U23s in July 2021. The current club restarted in 1945, after the ban on football in east Kent during World War 2 was lifted, and originally called Ramsgate Athletic have played at the Southwood Stadium continuously ever since.

Ramsgate has had senior football teams within the town since the late 1800s, and despite the paucity of newspaper coverage of football on the Channel side of the Isle of Thanet in the late 19th century there are reports of Ramsgate Athletic playing at Southwood along with the principal side, Ramsgate Town, who started about 1886 (and team photos of whom exist from 1898). At this time matches were played on several pitches around the town, including the Rams' current home – Southwood. Football in east Kent closed down during the Great War and in 1919 the Southwood ground was provided for Ramsgate Town by Henry Weigall JP and Lady Rose Weigall, the club by then known as Ramsgate. In their first season they finished 3rd in the Kent FA League and reached the Kent Senior Cup final but lost to Northfleet at Maidstone 1-0 before a crowd of 10,000. In 1924 Ramsgate Town folded and Ramsgate Grenville moved to Southwood and, apart from the rise and fall of the more successful Dumpton-based Ramsgate (Press Wanderers) in the 1930s, Grenville became the senior Ramsgate side until another World War cancelled football.

Post-World War 2 honours have been many, especially in the late 1940s and through the 1950s, and again in the late 1960s and 1980s (and not forgetting the mid-2000s), Some say the 'golden period' was from 1954 to 1957, when former Scottish international Jimmy Blair was player/manager, and the Rams were back-to-back League Champions in 1955/56 and 1956/57, with a new attendance record being set in 1955/56 when 5,083 watched the derby against Margate. They also made Club history when they reached the 1st Round Proper of the FA for the first time in 1955, narrowly losing 5-3 at Watford (a record that stood for 50 years before reaching that round again). With the demise of the Kent FA League in 1959 the Club joined the Southern League, as well as the Thames & Medway Combination, and a new stand was erected on the southern side of the pitch. In 1971/72 the Club were promoted to the Southern League and changed its name to just Ramsgate, but after a decline in fortunes off the pitch the Club was relegated to Division 1 and then resigned from the League in 1976, with the 1st team taking the Reserves' place in the new Kent League. In 1998/99 the Club was eligible for promotion back to the Southern League after winning the Kent Premier League championship and the Kent FA Senior Trophy, but decided the time was not right. This was followed with more silverware in 2000/01, winning the Kent Premier Division League Cup.

The 2004/05 season saw the Rams playing (and defeating) 4 sides from higher leagues pre-season, including old rivals Margate. In competitive football they made good progress in the FA Cup, winning at Kingstorian (2 leagues higher) before falling in the 2nd half to Dulwich Hamlet (1 league higher), whilst in the FA Vase they again reached the 3rd Round Proper. The best form was saved for the domestic season where the Rams again did the double winning both the Kent League Premier Cup and League Championship by a clear margin, and after extensive ground improvements entered Ryman 1 South in 2005. Summer 2005 saw the Rams start the new era with 2 more pieces of silverware, beating Herne Bay in

the Kent League Challenge Shield and Margate in the Kent Messenger Challenge Cup. The Club reached the 1st Round Proper of the FA Cup, the only Step 4 club in the country to do so that season, equalling the Club record set 50 years earlier, but were defeated at Nuneaton. They won the League at their first attempt however, securing back-to-back promotions to the Ryman Premier Division for 2006/07. For most of their inaugural season in the Premier the Rams were settled in the 'play-off spots' and for several weeks in 2nd place, but the toll on the small squad was noticeable and they slipped to 9th place in the run-in. This meant another new record, as the Club had only managed to stay in the Southern League Premier for a single season in 1972. The 2007/08 season saw more club records being set, winning the Isthmian League Cup as well as reaching the play-offs for the Conference South. In 2008/09 an average performance dipped in the last months with relegation back to Division 1 South. Key players left to remain at the higher level, although a much younger local side avoided another drop in 2009/10 as some predicted.

Back in Division 1 the Rams usually finished around the play-offs until, after five managers in 14 months, they ended up in 21st place in 2013/14. This saw the return of Jim Ward for his 3rd spell in charge, and though the Rams were in 2nd place at Christmas the form dropped and they finished mid-table. A good start in 2016/17 didn't last and with only 1 point from 3 games over Christmas coach Lloyd Blackman replaced 'Wardie' as manager. A 10-match unbeaten run saw a mid-table finish reprieve, with Blackman confirmed as gaffer for 2017/18. In 2018/19 there were changes in chairman and despite a good run in the FA Cup (ending at NLS Hemel Hempstead in the 3rd Qualifying Round) and an 8-game unbeaten run ending in October, Blackman stepped down and ex-Sittingbourne boss and former Rams' captain Nick Davis took over. Indifferent results saw by ex-Herne Bay boss Jason Lillis appointed in October 2019, who in turn was replaced by Matt Longhurst in January 2020. After 2 years in charge, 4 losses in a row saw Longhurst replaced by former Gills coach Steve Lovell in April 2022 for the last 4 games. Although a turn around in form saw the Rams just fail to return to the play-off places, they had been in for the first 8 months of the season, Lovell was retained for 2022/23, with the Rams topping the table or sitting in 2nd for the majority of the season until after Christmas. With a dip in form Lovell was released in March, and despite improved results and the Rams finishing as runners-up, disappointment in the play-offs resulted in a 15th season at Level 4 for 2023/24.

The 2023-24 season proved to be an historic one both on and off the pitch for the Rams. We reached the 2nd round proper of the FA Cup for the first time in our history, with historic wins over AFC Totton away (1-0) and a 2-1 home win against Woking in the first-round proper, as well as local hero TJ Jadama winning goal of the round in the process.

Despite over 100 league goals scored and 53 goals overall scored by forward Joe Taylor, the Rams agonisingly fell short of promotion, losing in the playoffs to Chichester City. The future looks brighter than ever though, with average attendances exceeding 1000, the club has now become a community hub that provides for underprivileged children across the area.

THREE BRIDGES 1-2 BURGESS HILL TOWN

Bridges, celebrating the first game on their new 3G pitch with a crowd of over 300, found themselves on the wrong end of a result as visitors Burgess Hill proved tough opponents, particularly in a first half in which Bridges were reduced to ten men!

The loss of the ball in midfield after 17 minutes led to a close range finish by JOSEPH OVERY, who then added a second six minutes later when he was left completely unmarked on the left side of the pitch.

Bridges tried to respond with Kevin Rivera setting up Hayden Velvick, whose decent effort was well saved by Slav Huk in the Hillians goal. But Bridges were hardly helped after 34 minutes when Hayden Neathey, one of three new signings in the Bridges squad, received a straight red card for a late challenge that effectively halted a goal scoring opportunity. But the expected onslaught failed to materialise as Burgess Hill seemed satisfied with the scoreline and were thwarted by Luke Glover whenever they did make it past the home defence.

A raft of changed by both sides upset the rhythm of the game, but praise has to go to Bridges for not only keeping the visitors at bay but even coming up with the goal of the game in the first minute of added time when a corner fell to BILLY IRVING, who rifled an unstoppable volley into the far top corner of the net.

SHEPPEY UNITED 2-3 THREE BRIDGES

Billy Irving scored his second goal in three days before embarking on a trip to Asia and Australia to help his side to a welcome three points away to promotion chasing Sheppey.

It came after a fairly turgid opening half hour in which a shot by Reece Hallard was the only noteworthy effort. But when Francis Junior Ze's 33rd minute drive was pushed away by Aiden Prall, the resulting corner saw Harvey Woollard knock the ball into the path of IRVING, who rifled the ball home.

Sheppey had a chance of a quick equaliser as James Taylor's cross was met by a tame header by Eitel Moumi Goueth. But it was Bridges who looked more likely to score with Ze being denied by the offside flag and Reece Hallard seeing his drive held.

Sheppey had to respond and they did so with the help of some indifferent defending a VICTOR AIYE applied a 55th minute finish. But Bridges wasted little time in regaining the lead. Prall made a good save from Dan Ferreira before the ball seemed to bounce around a packed goalmouth before HAYDEN VELVICK guided a lovely low shot home just three minutes after Sheppey's equaliser.

It got even better after 64 minutes as a good counter attack ended with Ze providing an inviting pass for REECE HALLARD to score his fifteenth goal of the season. He also hit the post, but after 85 minutes a decent cross from the right was turned in by DANIEL BRADSHAW to give Bridges a late scare.

As it happened, Bradley Campbell Francis had a good late chance for the visitors but was denied by Prall. But a good way to end 2024 for Bridges.

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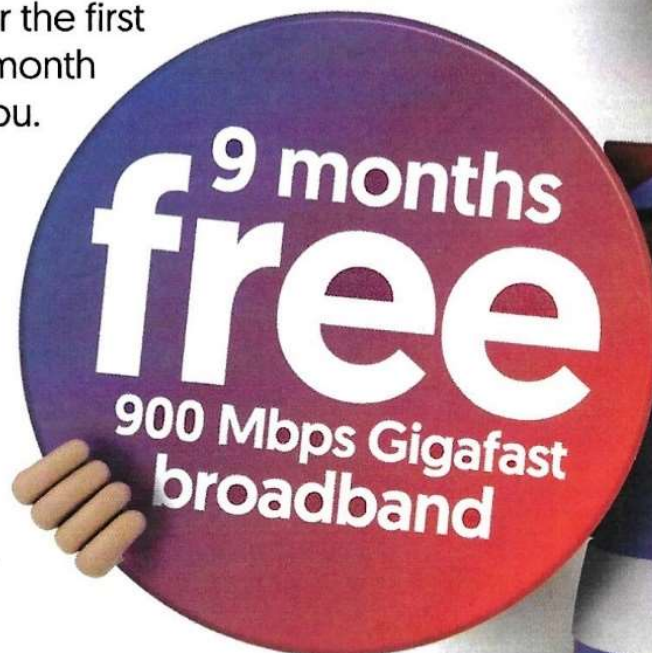
