We will have our official grand opening day for the new 3G pitch facility, developed for the community and supported by The Football Foundation, Sussex County Football Association and Crawley Borough Council. More information will be released online during the week, but I look forward to seeing many in attendance, with our youth team players taking centre stage on the pitch in the early afternoon, before the 3G pitch facility is officially opened with speeches and a ribbon cutting.

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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season. After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. Last season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure and Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the Summer, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant.

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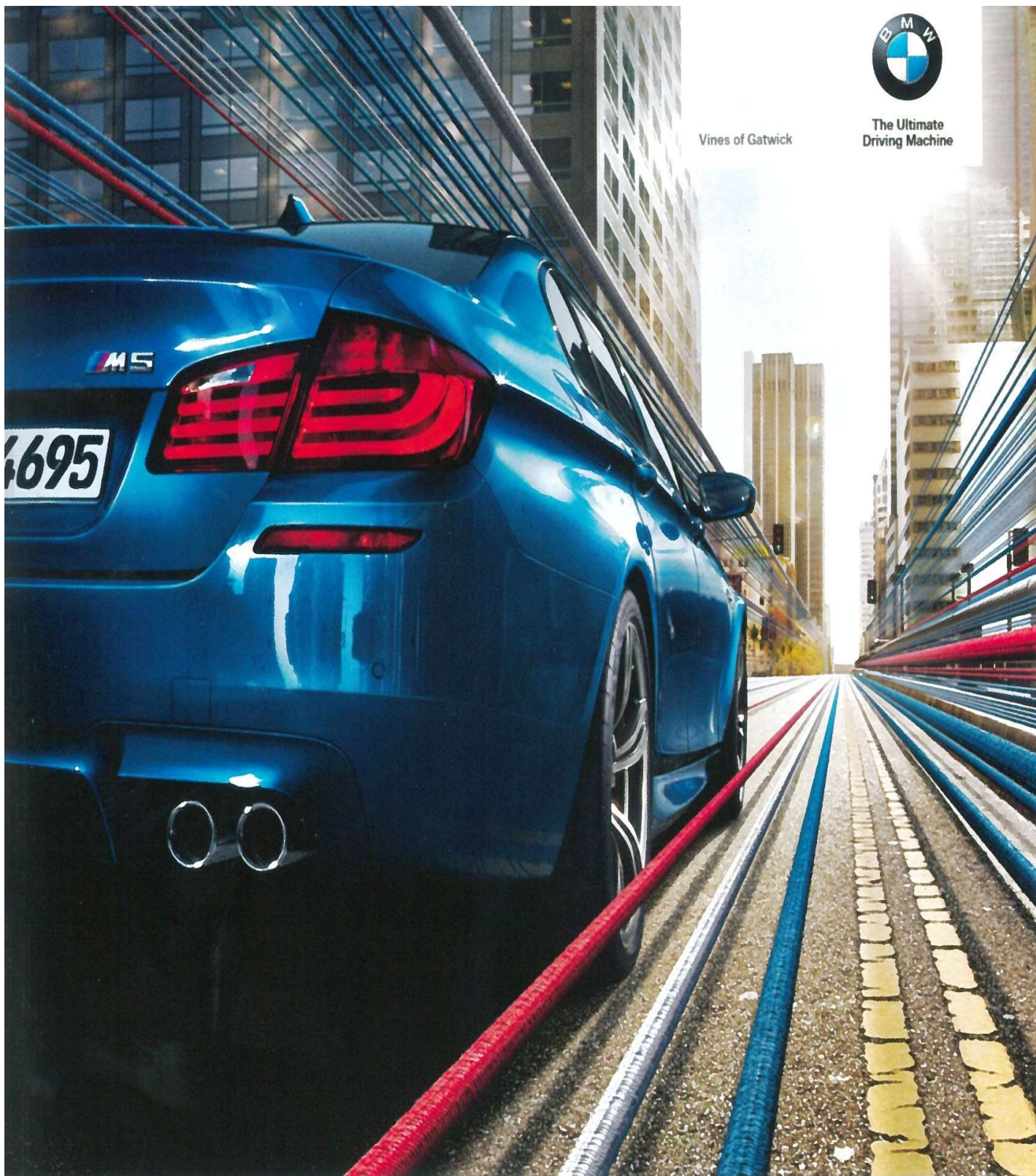
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A HISTORY OF ERITH TOWN FC

Formed in 1956 as Woolwich Town, the Dockers attained senior status in 1995-96 upon reaching the London Spartan League Premier Division in 1995-96. By then the club had already changed their name to Erith Town, reflecting a move to Erith Stadium. After one year in the Spartan Premier, the Dockers successfully applied to cross the Pyramid to the Kent League.

After struggling in the lower reaches of the League for three seasons, the Dockers celebrated the new Millennium with a then best seventh place in 1999-2000 and reached the London Senior Cup Final, losing 5-1 to Bedfont.

In the following seven seasons Erith only once reached such heights again, finishing seventh in 2003-4. The appointment of former Fisher Athletic player Mark Tompkins as player-manager midway through 2006-7 saw an upturn in fortunes and the following season he led the team to fifth in the Kent League. He also brought the club their first silverware as a senior club as record appearance maker Alan Hanlon lifted the Kent League Cup after a 1-0 win over much-fancied Hythe Town in the Final at Folkestone.

Tommo's departure on the eve of 2008-9 led to the appointment of Steve O'Boyle who took the Dockers back to the Kent League Cup Final for a second season. Despite drawing 1-1 after extra time against Croydon, the Dockers went down 3-1 on penalties.

Tony Russell took over the reins when O'Boyle departed in October 2010 guiding the club to a third successive mid table finish but bringing the Kent Senior Trophy to the club after a 3-1 win over Tunbridge Wells in the Final.

Having achieved a new best of fourth the following season, Russell departed for neighbours VCD Athletic with Erith Town top of the League in November 2012 and after a brief spell with James Collins in charge, Tompkins returned to take the Dockers to new personal best of third spot.

Tompkins repeated the feat in 2013-14 before departing and a turbulent 2014-15 saw three managers and a Houdini style escape from relegation under Martin and Joe Ford.

Two further seasons of struggle followed before Mark Deveney took over the club in the Summer of 2017, immediately appointing former owner Albert Putnam as President for his work as player, manager and Chairman in over 50 years with the club.

On the 26th August the club took part in the last ever game at Brentford's Griffin Park ground, losing 6-3 to the Bees' B team in the London Senior Cup semi-final.

After a fourth placed finish in 2022-23, their best for ten years, the Dockers moved to share with Sporting Club Thamesmead at Bayliss Avenue as they bid to progress on and off the field.

With this in mind the Dockers appointed Kay Deveney as their first female Chair in the Summer of 2023, with Mark Deveney continuing as CEO.

Under their stewardship the club has just experienced the most successful season in their history, finishing with two trophies – the SCEFL Challenge Cup and the Kent Senior Trophy – and winning the SCEFL Play-Off Final which saw The Dockers promoted to the Isthmian League South-East to play football at Step 4 for the first time.

BECKENHAM TOWN 2-2 THREE BRIDGES

On a clear but chilly Tuesday night, Three Bridges travelled to South London for an exhilarating Isthmian South-East clash against Beckenham Town, with both teams positioned closely in the league table, 7th and 5th respectively.

The match started with purpose, and Three Bridges wasted no time in asserting their dominance. In the 8th minute, Reece Hallard made a powerful run down the right, his shot being blocked by a Beckenham defender. However, the ball fell to Kevin Rivera, who unleashed an unstoppable 25-yard strike with his left foot, giving Three Bridges the lead.

Just five minutes later, Beckenham had a chance to level the score. Sam Bull launched a long ball forward, and Noel Leighton's dummy allowed Hayden Velvick to break through one-on-one with Beckenham's goalkeeper, Mitchell Beeney. The keeper, however, produced an outstanding save to deny the visitors a second.

Bridges continued to press forward, with both Reece Hallard and Hayden Velvick testing Beeney with powerful shots, all saved by the alert keeper. In the 30th minute, Noel Fischer produced an incredible solo run down the right, evading multiple defenders before being brought down in the box. The referee pointed to the spot without hesitation. Hallard took the penalty but was unlucky, crashing the ball against the crossbar. Beckenham had yet another lucky escape.

Three Bridges' dominance continued, and in the 42nd minute, the inevitable finally happened. Noel Leighton slipped a perfectly timed pass through to Harvey Woollard, who was thwarted by a fantastic save from Beeney. Hallard fired the rebound against the crossbar, but Woollard was alert to head the ball into the net from just two yards out to double the lead.

In the final action of the first half, a fast counterattack saw Kevin Rivera put a golden opportunity wide of the target before the referee blew for halftime. Despite their commanding 2-0 lead, Bridges were left wondering how they weren't further ahead after such a dominant first half.

Beckenham came out stronger in the second half, making three substitutions at the break. Their response was swift, and in the 52nd minute, Bridges' defence switched off for a throw-in. Louie Theophanous took advantage, racing clear of the defenders to slot the ball calmly past Will Tillman, pulling Beckenham back into the game.

Just four minutes later, a Reece Hallard free-kick failed to beat the first man, and within seconds, Abel Vendrells delivered a perfect ball to Theophanous, who made no mistake in levelling the scores at 2-2. Despite the setback, Bridges refused to let their heads drop and immediately sought to regain the lead. In the 72nd minute, they came agonizingly close when Noel Leighton's header was cleared off the line by a Beckenham defender.

The final 20 minutes saw Bridges pour forward relentlessly, throwing everything they had at Beckenham's resolute defence. Despite numerous chances, including one where the ball seemed to be on the verge of crossing the line, Three Bridges just couldn't find the breakthrough.

As the final whistle blew, the match ended 2-2, leaving both sets of fans bewildered. Bridges had been so dominant in the first half that a point felt bitter, as a win had seemed a certainty on another day. Nonetheless, the result earned Three Bridges a valuable away point.

THREE BRIDGES 3-2 SITTINGBOURNE

A great win for Bridges against a side that had only lost one previous League game all season and who had not conceded more than two in their previous 31 League matches.

The first move of note was all down to one man really as Kevin Rivera collected the ball midway inside his own half and held off challenges in a great run that finished sadly with a shot that was just wide of the far post.

But Sittingbourne then stepped up a gear and earned a 20th minute corner following a goal line clearance. The corner, one of many dangerous dead ball deliveries by Richie Hamill, was met at the far post by a solid header from captain LIAM SMITH.

Good defending stopped the visitors from extending their lead before Bridges responded after 36 minutes with Hayden Velvick feeding Reece Hallard on the left, and his resulting cross being met by a great header from NOEL LEIGHTON, who looked sharp throughout.

The second half started disastrously for Bridges as within six minutes a mix up between Harvey Woollard and Will Tillman gifted RYAN KINGSFORD with the simplest of finishes. But the lead lasted only a minute when Woollard brilliantly won possession and played the ball wide to Reece Hallard, who delivered another inch perfect cross for LEIGHTON to head home his second.

Although Bridges looked the better side in the second half, Sittingbourne could not be discounted. Roared on by a robust away support, Troy Howard dragged a good chance wide and the post was hit and a clearance off the line followed.

But just as the game entered the four additional minutes of play, more good play by Velvick ended in him being brought down in the box and BEN HOLDEN, who had been one of many solid defenders in the game, slammed home the winner from the penalty spot.
