Back to our Three Bridges side, and after the disappointing 1-0 loss to Broadbridge Heath a fortnight ago, we have quickly found form again, picking up 4 points on the road in the last week.

This started with last weekend's 1-0 away win against East Grinstead thanks to Noel Leighton's brilliantly headed goal. In all honesty, and those from East Grinstead will be hard pushed to disagree with this, it should have been 5 or 6 goals, but the home side's goalkeeper Matte Pierson had the game of his life and denied Leighton, Hallard, Velvick, Fisher and Hanslow on numerous occasions!

During midweek we travelled to South London to take on fellow play-off contenders Beckenham Town. This was again another dominant Bridges performance, and we seemed to be coasting at half-time thanks to goals from Kevin Rivera and Harvey Woollard. The home side made subs at the break though and they quickly pulled level by the hour mark, however those who had travelled from Crawley were left in disbelief as to how we didn't still win the match with the amount of good chances we had in the final moments. Still, a point at a strong Beckenham side is not to be sniffed at and both teams remain in contention for that final play-off spot.

Looking at today's game and this is two strong teams who are bang in form and should be a spectacle for all in attendance. Let's be hoping for a home win!

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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season. After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager. Last season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure and Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the Summer, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant.

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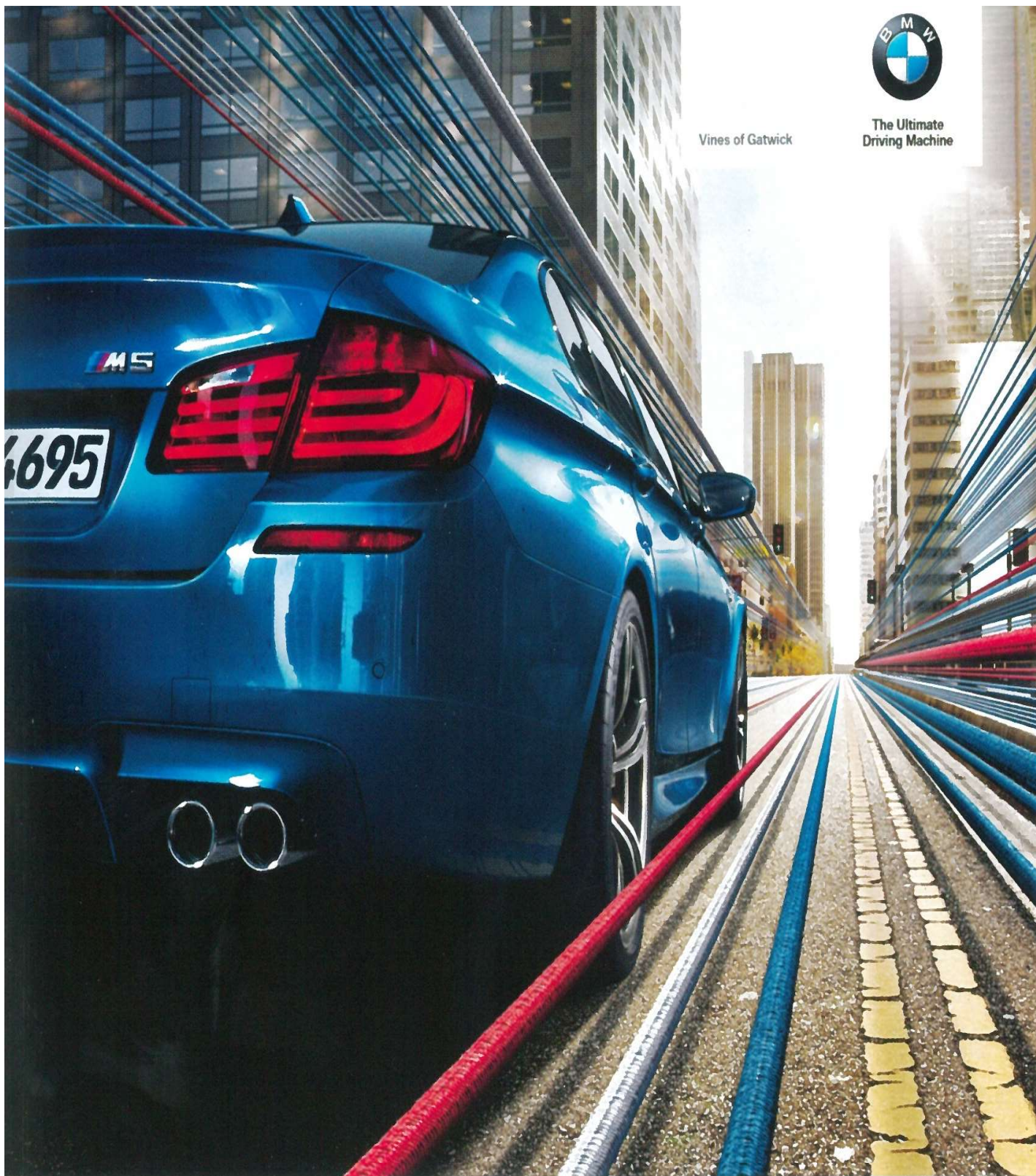
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A HISTORY OF SITTINGBOURNE FC

The club was started as Sittingbourne United back in 1881. In 1886 it became Sittingbourne Football Club and played at the Bull Ground in the centre of town. 1892 the club gained senior status. The club won its first major title in 1897/98 when it won the Kent League. The Kent Senior Cup followed in 1902.

After the First World War more senior cup and league titles followed with the club also enjoying the first of three spells in the Southern League. Success followed and in another spell in the Southern League Sittingbourne twice in succession missed promotion to the Premier Division only on goal average.

The club reached the first-round proper of the F.A Cup in 1962 but lost 3-0 at Hinckley Athletic.

Back in the Kent League Sittingbourne were one of the strongest teams throughout the 1970s and 1980s in an era - unlike the one that followed, when what happened on the field got more attention than what went on off it! In February 1990, the club decided to sell its town centre Bull Ground (now Sainsbury's supermarket) and buy a 23-acre site on the town's Eurolink estate. A magnificent stadium with a 2,000-seater stand, restaurants, bars, sumptuous dressing rooms, greyhound track and training pitches was the envy of non-league football. There was success too, on the pitch when, in their first season at Central Park, Sittingbourne won the Winstonlead Kent League without losing a game - the only senior football team throughout Europe to achieve that feat in the 1990/91 season. Promotion to the Beazer Homes Southern League followed with the championship of the Southern Division secured in 1993 followed by promotion to highest level achieved by the club since its foundation in 1891.

The ground record was broken five times during that one season with 5,951 spectators watching a friendly with Spurs and more than 3,000 at the match with local rivals Gravesend - a Beazer Homes Southern Division record.

More money flowed in with the £21,000 sale of Neil Emblen and Mickey Harle to Millwall before the bubble spectacularly burst. Debts of more than £1 million were revealed, the team got relegated, the ground was closed for a while despite the intervention of the local council in taking it over, and the club was officially wound up.

Somehow Sittingbourne have survived it all and even got back to the Southern Premier Division during this traumatic time (in Steve Lovell's first spell as manager), finishing an equal highest ever eighth before the financial problems again began to bite and relegation followed.

A new management committee headed by Andy Spice made great strides in tackling the debt problem and getting Sittingbourne Football Club back on an even keel financially.

To ensure survival of the club, the decision was made to move out of the imposing main stadium and move to another pitch on the complex.

Sittingbourne faced a number of "unknown" teams in the Ryman Isthmian League for season 2006-2007. The 2009-10 season, was one of the best since the financial problems, Sittingbourne being in playoff contention for much of the time but failing at the end. Still, a 9th place finish was no disgrace and for the first time in fifty years, Sittingbourne won the Kent Senior Cup in front of 618 at Folkstone Invicta.

For the 2013-2014 season, Sittingbourne decided to leave their home of 10 years and accept an invitation to move to Woodstock Park a 14-acre area with superb social facilities. Andy Spice, who almost single handed kept Sittingbourne as a senior club, stood down as Chairman making way for Maurice Dunk, a Director of the company that holds the leasehold for Woodstock Park. After a three year reign as manager, Nick Davis and his assistant Tony Cornwell resigned in February 2018 after the committee decided a budget cut was necessary when it became clear that Sittingbourne would be unlikely to challenge for the play offs. Coach, Aslan Odev took over and then in January 2019 Dover Athletic Academy development manager, Chris Lynch took the reins after a poor run.

After a disappointing end to the now expunged 2019-20 season Chris Lynch resigned to be replaced by his Assistant Darren Blackburn.

Because of Covid restrictions Darren's first full season was 2021-22 when the club had an early exit from both major cup competitions and finished in a mid-table position in the league. Nick Davis returned for season 2022/23 but unfortunately a run of 12 games without a win ended in Nick Davis resigning in early January 2023 and the club brought in Ryan Maxwell to take his place. Almost immediately the results improved and Sittingbourne finished clear of the relegation places.

The 2023-2024 season was the most successful season for many years with The Brickies finishing in third place. However promotion was not to be as Three Bridges defeated them at Woodstock Park in the semi-finals of the play offs.

The club became a limited company by guarantee in May 2018 and now has 7 Directors.

THREE BRIDGES 0-1 BROADBRIDGE HEATH

On what was a lovely afternoon at Jubilee Park, Three Bridges hosted a local derby against Broadbridge Heath. Bridges looked to continue their good spell across this winter while “The Bears” were desperate to make amends after the 5-1 loss at home on Tuesday night against the Isthmian South-East leaders, Ramsgate.

Three Bridges started off the game as the better side with Hayden Velvick in particular posing threats on the right wing but struggled to create any clear-cut chances and the visitors grew into the game as the half went on. A largely uneventful half was about to come to an end when a rash challenge by Elliot Hanslow on Eugene Moteane resulted in a penalty for Broadbridge Heath. Even though young Bridges keeper Will Tillman guessed correctly where the penalty will be placed, Broadbridge Heath’s captain Byron Napper made no mistake from the spot and the visitors took the lead in the 3rd minute of additional time of the 1st half.

Jamie Crellin looked to freshen up things at half time by giving a debut to the new signing Noel Fisher. Bridges started off better the 2nd half with a series of attacks but once again lacked the finishing touch. Most of Bridges best work came from Noel Fisher, the ex-Lancing player showing his skills and flair with every opportunity. In the 61st minute Reece Hallard was brought down inside the box but the referee waved play on.

Despite Bridges knocking on the door constantly, Broadbridge Heath’s gameplan worked to perfection and they never really looked in danger of conceding until the 94th minute when a Reece Hallard corner was met by Noel Leighton’s header at the edge of 6-yard box, but Alfie Hadfield made a superb save to deny him and take the 3 points back to Broadbridge Heath.

A forgettable match for the neutrals ended up in wild celebrations from the visitors who claimed the local bragging rights and secured a 1-0 win.

Bridges ground out victory away to local rivals East Grinstead, who have an impressive record against Jamie Crellin's team over the years. But the visitors will be disappointed that they didn't win by a more handsome scoreline, chances being spurned whilst home keeper Matte Pierson had a brilliant outing for his side.

Will Tillman was first to be called into action however with a good save to deny Matt Daniel, but then it became a series of near misses and splendid saves with Noel Leighton, Hayden Neathey and Hayden Velvick all finding it hard to believe they hadn't scored.

The breakthrough came after 57 minutes when a Reece Hallard corner was met by a powerful header by LEIGHTON, but Bridges just couldn't find another. Noel Fisher and Velvick brought out more saves by Pierson and Velvick was also just wide. But the homesters then staged a few decent attacking moves of their own and the likes of Hayden Neathey and Sam Bull in the heart of Bridges' defence had to be at their best to keep chances to a minimum.

The sticky uneven pitch had steadily got worse and the tireless Bryan Villavicencio suddenly pulled up with what looked to be a hamstring injury as the game edged towards its close. But there was still time for Bridges to test Pierson one more time as Elliott Hanslow set up Hallard, who could hardly believe his eyes as the home keeper made yet another excellent block.
