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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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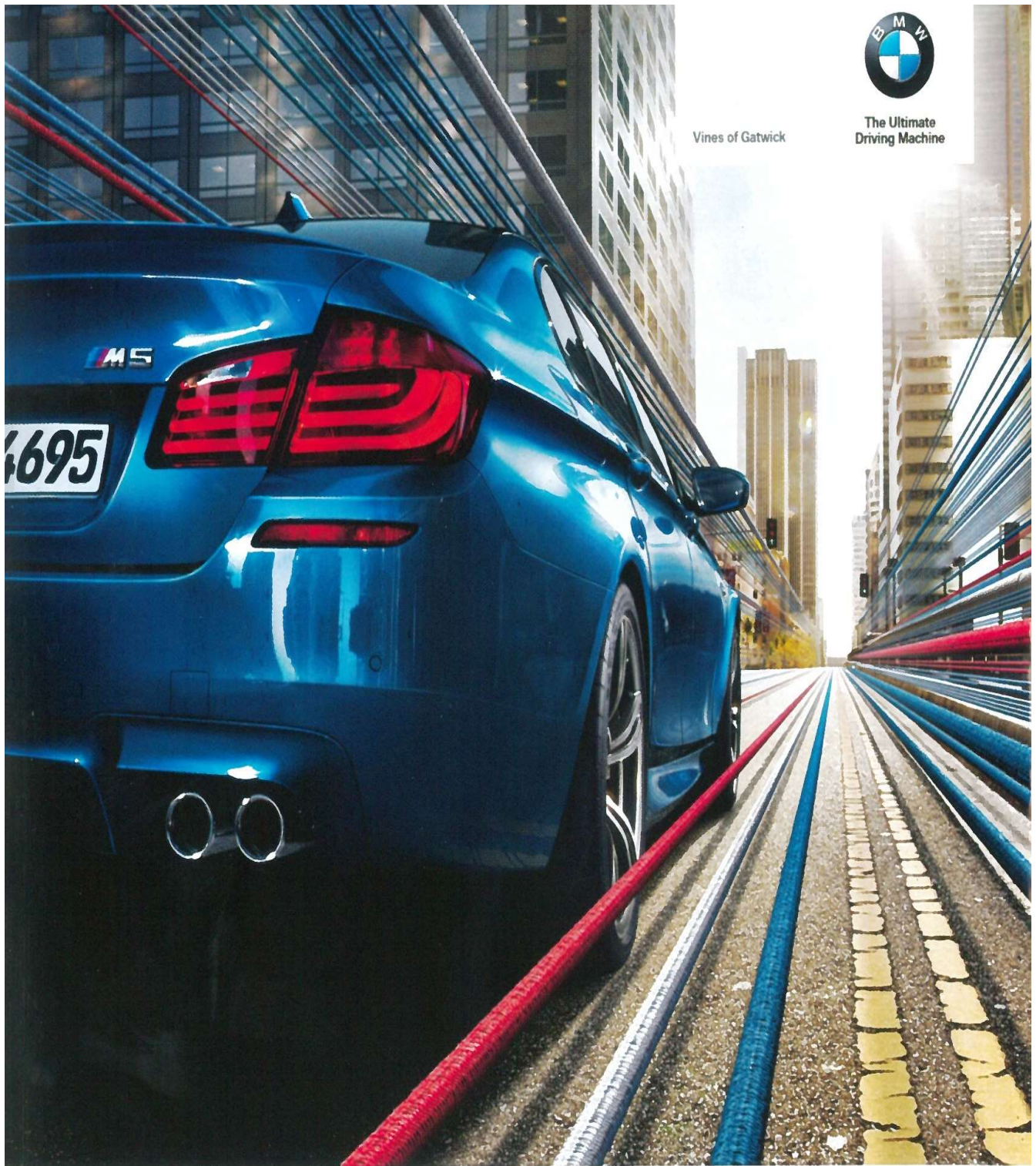
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A HISTORY OF HORSHAM YM FC

Horsham YMCA Football Club was formed in 1898. During the first 31 years of the club's existence they played at Lyons Field, the name of which is derived from the Bowes-Lyons family who owned a substantial amount of land around Horsham at one time. In 1929 the club moved to its present ground at Gorings Mead for which they were able to secure the freehold at a later date. In the early years 'YM' played in the Horsham District League before moving to the Crawley League and subsequently to the Mid Sussex League. Their rise through the later two leagues was swift and facilitated the club's entry into the Sussex County League in 1959.

In that first season, YM finished twelfth out of fifteen teams and then began a gradual improvement. They spent seven years in Division 2 before gaining promotion in 1966 as Champions, two points ahead of Newhaven. During that season they dropped just four points from 34 matches, scoring 141 goals in the process - a superb performance. The club gained Division 1 status along with Newhaven and remained there for sixteen seasons until the end of the 1981-82 season, when unfortunately they were relegated. The best performances during that period were two consecutive third place finishes in 1977-78 and 1978-79. Despite relegation, the club bounced straight back as Division 2 champions in the following season.

This time, YM spent five seasons in the top division before being relegated for the second time at the end of the 1987-88 season. Promotion back to Division 1 for the third time was achieved by finishing third in 1994-95. The past six seasons have seen YM consolidate their Division 1 status by finishing twelfth, eighth, thirteenth, a very creditable third in our Centenary Season and fifth in the last two seasons. During the past two seasons, all of YM's previous achievements were put into the shade and despite their league positions being disappointing, this was probably due to the enormous number of cup matches played.

In the 1999-00 season, YM had their best ever results in both the FA Cup and the FA Vase, and it was only dubious decisions by match officials that halted progress in both competitions. In their FA Cup Fourth Qualifying Round tie at home to Chelmsford City, the winning goal was scored by a player who was so far offside, the linesman probably did not notice him before it was too late, whilst in their Fourth Round FA Vase tie away at AFC Totton, a dubious penalty late in the second half ended YM's dreams of reaching Wembley. During that season the club also reached the semi-finals of the Sussex Senior Cup, losing a close fought tie to Hastings Town, but beating near neighbours and 'friends over the fence' Horsham FC 4-0 in a Third Round home tie in front of over 400 spectators. In September 1999 the club's attendance record was smashed when a crowd of over 940 people crammed into 'The Mead' for the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup against Chelmsford City.

During the 2000-01 season, YM graciously bowed out of the FA Cup at Whyteleafe, and at Cowes Sports in the FA Vase, but reached the semi-finals of the Sussex Senior Cup before losing to Bognor Regis. Despite these three cup defeats, YM did manage to add some silverware to their trophy cabinet by winning the Sussex RUR Cup, with an emphatic 3-0 victory over Burgess Hill Town, whilst the Reserve Team achieved a League and Cup double.

A rather disappointing 2001-02 season saw a mid-table league finish but another piece of silverware brought back to the Mead, courtesy of an excellent 2-0 Good Friday defeat of Ringmer in the John O'Hara Cup Final at Wick.

The 2002-03 season saw the re-establishment of a Youth side at YM, with the aim being to grow new players over the following few years in order to participate in the senior teams. YM cruised high in the league all season, recording a record 22-1 victory over Littlehampton Town, before finally being pipped into third position at the end of the season. The Reserves finished mid-table and the new Youth team finished second in Division One of the Arun & Chichester League, losing out only on goal difference, although they beat the League Champions 1-0 in the League Cup.

Despite slightly increased attendances, YM's thirteenth placed finish the following season was disappointing by comparison, and few were prepared for the improvement shown in 2004-05 that saw John Suter's side bring the League title to Goring's Mead for

the first time. Having looked in an unassailable position for most of the campaign, there were a few wobbles in the final months, but fortunately the team recovered to ultimately romp home fifteen points clear of runners-up Rye & Idon United. The season was tinged with disappointment when Gorings Mead failed grading requirements for entry into the Isthmian League, and many pundits wondered whether YM might have missed the boat.

With YM trailing Ringmer by twelve points as the 2005-06 season reached its climax, and struggling to find the money for the required work on the ground, it looked like that might have been it for YM. But remarkably, however, the players maintained their resolve as their rivals buckled, and YM not only over-turned the deficit, but romped home by nine points to achieve back-to-back League titles. Gorings Mead was deemed fit by FA inspectors to allow the club to take its place in the newly created Isthmian Division One South for the 2006-07 season, completing a fantastic year for the town, with neighbours Horsham also winning promotion to the Premier Division. After competing for two seasons in Division One South, the club finished second from bottom in the 2007-08 season and were relegated back to Sussex County League Division One.

Returning to the County League saw YM go through a number of changes on and off the field. Manager of nineteen years, John Suter, left the club, as did most of the players. John was quickly replaced by the very capable Chris White, who built a new YM team from scratch and steered them to promotion back into the Ryman League at the end of his first season in charge. The 2009-10 season saw another change at Gorings Mead, with YM becoming landlords of former neighbours, Horsham FC. This highlighted the challenges of ground shares across the country, but both teams did well, YM achieving eleventh place and their highest ever points total in the Ryman League. Sadly, at the end of the season Chris White left the club for Worthing.

The following two seasons saw the club in a state of flux, with a number of managers (Colin Jenkinson, John Cumberbatch and Sammy Donnelly) coming and going, and even more players doing the same. At the end of the 2011-12 season, Peter Buckland stepped in to steady the YM ship, saving the club from relegation by winning the last game of the season. Buckland then built a squad for the 2012-13 season, which produced a very respectable mid-table finish. The nucleus of this same squad then pushed on in the 2013-14 season to be real promotion contenders - though finally losing out on that accolade thanks to an 89th minute Littlehampton Town winner on the final day of the season. Nonetheless 2013-14 was an impressive season, with YM reaching the semi-finals of the Sussex Senior Cup and winning the RUR Cup on penalties in their final game of the season.

In comparison to 2013-14's fourth placed Sussex County League finish, RUR Charity Cup triumph and Sussex Senior Challenge Cup semi-final appearance, YM must view the 2014-15 campaign as a huge underachievement. A 4-2 win over Chichester City on the final day of the season secured a respectable fifth placed Division 1 finish for Peter Buckland's side, but this was one spot lower and eight points worse off than the prior year, and with double the number of defeats. Perhaps even more disappointing was YM's poor record in the season's cup competitions, with runs in the FA Cup and FA Vase, Sussex Senior Cup, RUR Charity Cup and Peter Bentley League Challenge Cup all over by December.

2015-16 season saw the Sussex County Football League renamed the Southern Combination Football League and the top division renamed as the Premier Division. YM finished in fourth place in that season and in 10th position in 2016-17 season. However, the club did not distinguish itself in cup competitions in either campaign. Non-league league restructuring meant that there were two promotion places available for season 2017-18 and in a determined effort to gain promotion YM led the division for several months before falling away to a fourth-place finish.

However, significant progress was made in cup competitions as YM bowed out of the FA Vase at the First-Round stage away at the eventual Vase winners Thatcham Town. The club also reached the final of the Peter Bentley League Challenge Cup for the first time in many years. However, YM were defeated by league champions Haywards Heath Town.

Season 2018-19 saw YM put in a strong challenge in the league. However, disappointing results in the final quarter of the campaign saw YM finish as runners-up by nine points to champions Chichester City. 2019-20 season saw YM in 12th place in the league before the season was curtailed, and results were expunged.

The 2020/21 season saw YM struggle following the restart of the SCFL after the relaxation of covid19 regulations before the season once again was curtailed and ultimately voided early in 2021 with the club sitting in the bottom end of the division. The 2021-22 season led to a 13th place in the league, and this was followed by a 12th place finish last season.



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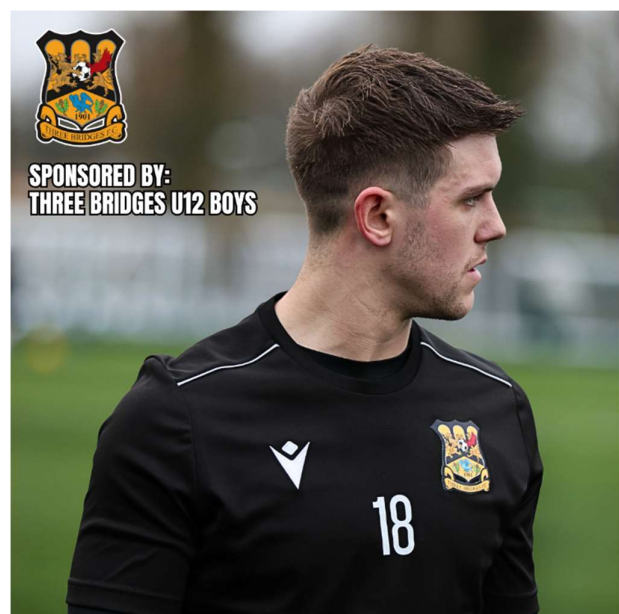
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MATCH REPORT

EAST GRINSTEAD 1-4 THREE BRIDGES

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST

TUESDAY 12 AUGUST 2025

Three Bridges arrived at East Grinstead's East Court in confident mood and by full-time, they had secured another impressive victory. Fresh from a 5–0 opening-day win over Eastbourne Town, Bridges made the short trip to face their local rivals with high expectations.

Those hopes were tested early when, in the 11th minute, a defensive lapse gave Grinstead's Matthew Daniel space to strike from the edge of the box. Goalkeeper Sam Roberts managed to get a glove to the shot but could not keep it out, giving the hosts an early lead.

That was as good as it got for the home side. The goal sparked Bridges into action, and just six minutes later Hayden Velvick's speculative effort took a helpful deflection before finding the net. Two minutes after that, captain Harvey Woollard unleashed a superb 20-yard left-foot strike that arrowed into the top corner to put the visitors ahead.

Kevin Rivera came close to adding a third before the break, rattling the crossbar, while Noel Fisher's mazy runs were causing constant problems for the Grinstead defence. One such run ended with Fisher being brought down in the area, and Reece Hallard converted the penalty with composure to make it 3–1 at half-time.

Bridges continued to control the game in the second half, with Fisher again at the heart of the action. His 58th-minute solo goal was a fine individual effort, weaving through defenders before calmly finishing for 4–1.

The visitors created a host of further chances, with Rivera in particular denied by the woodwork and some last-ditch defending. On another day, the scoreline could have been even more emphatic, but Bridges were more than satisfied with a comprehensive victory.

Two wins from two, nine goals scored, and a place at the top of the Isthmian South East Division table represent a perfect start to the season. Next up is an FA Cup tie at Jubilee Field against Horsham YM on Saturday, 16th August, with a 3pm kick-off.
