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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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A HISTORY OF SHOREHAM FC

Shoreham FC, nicknamed The Musselmen, was founded in 1892 and gained its first major honour in 1902, winning the Sussex Senior Cup, a feat that was repeated four years later. In 1920 Shoreham became founder members of the Sussex County League, only to resign seven years later after picking up just five points over the entire season and finishing bottom of the twelve club League.

In 1932 however the club re-joined and ended the 1934/35 season as runners up to Horsham. After a difficult period during the 1940's, Shoreham took the County League title for the first time in 1951/52 and retained it the following year. In 1960/61 Shoreham were relegated but made an immediate return as Division Two champions the very next season. The Musselmen were relegated once more in 1966/67 to Division Two, where they spent six seasons before finishing as runners up to Portfield in 1972/73. Unfortunately, they survived just one season before being relegated again. True to form, Shoreham bounced back, winning the Division Two title in 1976/77, and adding the Division One championship in 1977/78.

Over the past twenty years Shoreham have continued to alternate between the top two divisions of the County League, with frequent relegation and promotion seasons at Middle Road. The best season in recent years came in the mid-1990's, when they twice finished in the top four of Division One and won the League Cup in 1996. Shoreham were promoted back to Division One as runners up in 2001/02 following relegation two seasons earlier. However, a now familiar pattern followed as, after narrowly avoiding relegation in 2002/03, the club finished bottom in 2003/04 and returned to Division Two.

In the 2004/05 season Shoreham finished third in Division Two to gain promotion at the first time of asking, so for joint managers Fred Proto and Jason Rutherford to gain promotion in their first season in charge was an extraordinary effort.

Given the previous history of moving back between the divisions, everyone at the club were very pleased to consolidate in 2005/06. That season saw Middle Road continue to be favoured as a neutral venue for cup ties, and The Musselmen were to collect some silverware of their own, defeating Whitehawk 2-1 in the final of the John O'Hara Challenge Cup.

Shoreham won the SCFL Premier League in 2016/17 and were promoted to the Bostik South League for the first time in their history, only to be relegated the same season back to

the SCFL Premier, and then straight through to Division One.

The 2021/2022 was much more successful for the club, finishing in 5th position and progressing to the divisional play-offs. A semi-final victory at Seaford Town was followed by a single goal defeat at Midhurst & Easebourne. Shortly after this final game, manager Mark Pulling left the club by mutual consent after three seasons in charge.

Prior to the start of the 2022–23 season, Shoreham appointed their former player Michael Death as first team manager. This proved to be a very successful decision as the club went on to dominate the league and became champions, comfortably clinching promotion back to the Premier Division but also achieving the notable title of being the last unbeaten team in England in all levels of football that season, having not lost a league game until the end of February. However, once season 2023-24 started the team then did not win a single game in its initial 11 league matches, suffering some dispiriting defeats in the process. Due to this, Michael Death parted company with the club, and head coach Paul Ettridge was appointed as his successor in mid September. The team's form improved satisfactorily, and they were able to climb out of the relegation zone, eventually finishing the season in 15th place.

In late May 2024, Ettridge moved on and the club welcomed back Michael Death as manager prior to the start of the new season. Unfortunately, Death could find the form needed and was released by the club 6 games before the end of the season, of which allowed the club to stay in the SCFL premier. Season 2025-26 saw a complete change of management team and players. Lawrence Edwards joined the Musselmen.
