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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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A HISTORY OF CROWBOROUGH ATHLETIC

Crowborough Athletic FC, established in 1894 as a sporting extension of the local athletics club, has a fascinating history intertwined with the community. Initially sharing their name with a cricketing section, the club soon found its footballing identity and joined the Crowborough & District League (CDL) and the Sussex County FA in 1896.

Over the years, Crowborough Athletic FC showcased impressive performances in local leagues and competitions like the Humble-Crofts Cup and the George Dodd Memorial Trophy. They moved from various locations within the town before settling at the Alderbrook Playing Fields in 1953, thanks to the generous land contribution of Mr. George Watson.

The 1970s brought the club to the prestigious Sussex County Football League (SCFL), where they experienced ups and downs but consistently displayed determination. The 2003/04 season marked a turning point, with a promotion to Division 2 and a Division 3 Cup victory. The subsequent years saw continuous growth, culminating in a historic promotion to the Ryman Isthmian League, Division 1, in the 2007/08 season.

Despite challenges, Crowborough Athletic FC's resilience remained steadfast, but they eventually returned to the SCFL Division 1 after one season in the Ryman Isthmian League.

Their transition to the Southern Counties East Football League (SCEFL) in 2014 introduced new competition, where the club continued to progress.

The 2016/17 season saw an outstanding 32-game unbeaten run, nearly earning promotion back to the Ryman Isthmian League. Though they missed out on promotion, the Crows continued their upward trajectory, finishing third in the 2017/18 season.

Amidst challenges in subsequent seasons, including the impact of the global pandemic in 2019/20, the club remained proactive in ensuring the sustainability of football at the Crowborough Community Stadium. Major groundworks and new LED floodlights were installed through grants from the Football Foundation.

In the 2021/22 season, Crowborough Athletic FC focused on developing pathways from youth to senior football, achieving a commendable 10th place finish in the league and reaching the League Cup final. At the end of the season, they were moved back to the Southern Combination Football League (SCFL) by the FA.

In the 2022/23 season, the club continued its progress, finishing 6th and reaching the Peter Bentley Challenge Cup final, and in the 2023/24 season, further progress resulted in a play-off place (finishing 3rd in league) and again reaching the Peter Bentley Challenge Cup final (losing to a 94th minute winner from the League Champions).

After a slow start to the 2024/25 season, The Crows improved on 23/24, winning the Peter Bentley Challenge Cup, and finishing 2nd in the League, gaining promotion through the Play-Offs this time to return to the Isthmian South East League at Step 4. The season ended with an appearance in the League Cup Final for an unlikely "treble" but they were beaten by the newly-crowned Champions.

2025/26 will see the First Team compete at Step 4 for only the second time in its history, while the club as a whole continues to develop new initiatives in the community, ready to face the new challenges ahead.



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MATCH REPORT

HERNE BAY 1-4 THREE BRIDGES

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST

SATURDAY 18 OCTOBER 2025

Three Bridges bounced back emphatically from the frustrating 2–2 draw with Jersey Bulls by dismantling high-flying Herne Bay 4–1 on the Kent coast, reaffirming their promotion credentials and closing the gap at the top of the Isthmian South-East table.

Facing a Herne Bay side who had won four on the bounce and sat 5th in the table, Jamie Crellin's men were tasked with producing a performance of real quality — and they delivered one of their finest first halves of the season.

The tone was set just two minutes in, as Reece Hallard produced a moment of individual brilliance, cutting in from the left and curling a stunning strike into the far corner — reminiscent of Arjen Robben at his peak. The early pressure continued and Bridges thought they had doubled their lead minutes later when Sam Bull turned in Ade Adeyinka's rebound, only to be denied by the offside flag.

There was no stopping the visitors, though. On 10 minutes, Charlie Bennett unlocked the defence with a perfectly timed slide-rule pass, and Hallard made no mistake, lifting the ball delicately over the onrushing keeper for his second goal.

By the 15th minute, it was 3–0 — this time Ade Adeyinka took matters into his own hands, surging forward from midfield and unleashing a 25-yard rocket that flew past the helpless Joe Coleman.

Herne Bay's first real threat came on 33 minutes when Rhys Wyborn fizzed a long-range effort narrowly wide, but Bridges weren't done yet. In the 41st minute, Reece Hallard completed his hat-trick in ruthless fashion. Noel Leighton held the ball up smartly before releasing Charlie Bennett, whose pinpoint pass sent Hallard clear again. The finish was emphatic — blasted past the keeper to make it four.

But the hosts responded almost immediately, grabbing a goal back in the 42nd minute. Harvey Brand drove through the middle of the park virtually unchallenged before placing a low finish past Sam Roberts to make it 4–1 heading into the break.

Bridges managed the second half with maturity and calm. After withstanding early pressure, the introductions of Rivera and Ghannam gave the visitors renewed energy and attacking threat. Ghannam in particular came close on several occasions, and Bridges finished the stronger of the two sides.

In truth, the 4–1 scoreline flattered Herne Bay, with home goalkeeper Joe Coleman named their man of the match after making several key saves to prevent a more damaging result.
