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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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A HISTORY OF DEAL TOWN FC

Originally known as Deal Cinque Ports FC the club was formed in the early 1900s, changing its' name in 1920 to Deal Town FC. Deals' first matches were played in the Thanet League and the East Kent League.

In 1909 they joined the Eastern section of the Kent League. Following the disbanding of the Kent League in 1959, Deal became founder members of the Aetolian League. 1963 saw Deal elected to the Southern League, but after a torrid three seasons they moved onto the Greater London League. The 71/72 season saw the club return to the Kent League. Deal's first Kent League championship came in 53/54, then after a long wait, the second was achieved in 99/00. They have been runners-up on two occasions, 88/89 and 98/99.

Another trophy was to come the way of the club was the Greater London League cup which they won in 67/68, meanwhile in 59/60 Deal finished as Aetolian League runners-up.

The club has reached the Kent League (now Southern Counties East Football League [SCEFL]) cup final on five occasions. Their first Final appearance came in 57/58 when they overcame Margate. Deal won their second League Cup in 81/82, this time defeating Erith & Belvedere. Their third appearance in the Final was 93/94, when they lost to Ramsgate. The Club lifted the cup for the third time in 98/99, defeating VCD Athletic. In 99/00, they reached the final, but did not contend it.

The club has also made five appearances in the Kent FA Senior Trophy Final. Deal were beaten finalists in 82/83, going down to Southern League Fisher Athletic. There was further heartbreak in the 90/91 final, this time having to settle for second best against Hythe Town. However, it was a case of third time lucky in 94/95 as Deal finally captured the trophy, defeating Folkestone Invicta in a penalty shoot-out following a 2-2 draw. 99/2000 saw Deal lift the trophy for the second time when they beat Chatham 5-1. The club also reached the final in 2023 but lost to Punjab United.

1997 saw the appointment of a new Chairman, in Roy Smith, whose ambitions both on and off the field lifted the Club. His decision to appoint a full-time manager in Tommy Sampson for the beginning of the 1998 season soon bore fruit. 98/99 saw the club achieve their best season. Apart from the successes of the first team, the Reserves won the League championship for the first time and were beaten finalists in both the League Cup and the Kent FA Intermediate Cup; this was, however, surpassed the following season. As well as their domestic achievements, Deal Town become the first team from Kent to lift the FA Vase, with their 1-0 victory at Wembley Stadium against Chippenham Town in front of a crowd of 20,083; the second biggest in the history of the competition. Before the start of the 00/01 season, Tommy and the Vase winning players left the club and so it was a case of rebuilding the team and consolidating under new manager Dave Dadd. Dave stepped down to become assistant manager after one year to be replaced by Simon Bryant, who led the team to creditable third & fourth placed finishes in his two seasons in charge, before moving to Herne Bay.

With the majority of players leaving the club, it was again a case of rebuilding and consolidating. This time it fell to Derek Hares, who was promoted to first team manager at the start of the 03/04 campaign, and he remained in-situ until resigning in October 2013. Albie Barker became our next manager, until he resigned in January 2014 to be replaced by Paul Murray. Paul stood down to be replaced by Darren Anslow for the

start of the 14/15 campaign, only for Darren to leave in early September. Dave Johncock then taking over until January 2015. Derek Hares took over the hotseat once more with Paul Murray as his assistant, and Steve King as coach.

After a long period of un-rest, season 15/16 saw Deal finish in ninth position in the table; a top half finish and an improvement on previous seasons. For the majority Deal had struggled as a bottom-half team for over ten years. They had a very good run in The FA Cup, finally bowing-out 2-1 to St Albans (away) in the second qualifying round. Along the way Deal had beaten Horsham and Whitstable Town. They also had a good run in The FA Vase, before losing to a strong Kidlington side in Oxfordshire.

The 16/17 season was slightly disappointing in that Deal finished in 13th place, four places lower than the previous season, although it looked as though it was going to be significantly worse. The 4-2 home defeat to Erith Town at the end of January left the Hoops in 18th position in the table and facing a relegation battle, but the players responded by losing only two of their remaining 15 league games to ensure another mid-table finish.

17/18 saw improvement and a seventh-place finish before finishing 11th in 18/19. The following season ended early due to Coronavirus pandemic but not before The Hoops were able to embark on an impressive FA Vase run that only ended at the fifth-round stage. For those that were there to see the penalty shoot-out win at Binfield, the memories will long live on.

The 20/21 campaign also ended before it really got started, as Covid once again curtailed another season. In 21/22 the Hoops finished in 4th place, but the club also began building the infrastructure. For the first time Deal introduced a women's side to the club and, ahead of the 22/23 season, our Reserve team was re-introduced. It was immediate success for the women, being promoted within the South East Counties Women's Football League. At this same time, Derek Hares then stepped aside from the first team as Steve King took over the reigns, leading the club to 3rd place in 22/23, just one point off Phoenix Sports in the second-placed play-off position; impressively we were only three points off champions Erith & Belvedere.

Not only did the 22/23 season see the re-launch of Deal's U18 side too but the Reserves boasting a League and Kent FA Intermediate Cup double, of which they retained the following season.

With an average crowd of 630 now coming through the Charles Ground in 23/24, the club experienced one of their best seasons to-date. Having started poorly, with just one point from a possible nine, Deal Town went on to clinch the SCEFL title at home to near-by neighbours Lydd Town on the 13 April 2024 with a 3-1 victory and with four games to go. The turning point, undoubtedly that season, was the 4-2 away victory over pre-season favourites Faversham Town, just before the turn of 2024. Notwithstanding an impressive FA Vase run which saw Deal defeat Bridgewater United on penalties, eventually losing to Lincon United in the next round.

The 2024/2025 season saw a return to Step 4 of the National League System, for the first time since 1963, and a settled campaign ended with a 7th place finish.



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MATCH REPORT

LITTLE COMMON 0-2 THREE BRIDGES

SUSSEX TRANSPORT SENIOR CUP

TUESDAY 7 OCTOBER 2025

Three Bridges proved too much for Little Common in the Sussex Senior Challenge Cup on Tuesday night, securing a 2–0 win in Bexhill to book their place in the next round.

Manager Jamie Crellin named a strong starting XI and his side took early control of the tie. The breakthrough came in the 7th minute when Josh Hallard's corner was nodded goalward by captain Hayden Neathey, with Kevin Rivera reacting quickest to prod home from close range.

Bridges dominated the remainder of the first half and created several chances to double their lead. Reece Hallard and Rivera both drew excellent saves from home goalkeeper Finn Holter, while Charlie Bennett missed a golden opportunity, heading wide from just three yards out.

Little Common offered little in attack but nearly drew level late in the half when James White tested Sam Roberts, though the Bridges keeper made a routine stop. Despite being second best, the hosts went into the break just one goal down.

The pattern continued after the restart, with Bridges seeing plenty of the ball but lacking a cutting edge. The best opportunity of the half fell to Reece Hallard in the 79th minute — his first effort was parried by Holter, and he fired the rebound narrowly off target.

The turning point came with the introduction of Destiny Ojo, who brought energy and threat to the forward line. In the 86th minute, Noel Fisher played him through, only for Holter to again come to the rescue with another fine save.

Two minutes later, a flicked header from Rivera sent Ojo in behind once more, but this time he was dragged down in the box by Liam Ward. The referee pointed to the spot and showed Ward a red card. Reece Hallard stepped up for the penalty, but Holter capped a brilliant individual performance with yet another save.

Bridges finally put the game to bed deep into stoppage time. Picking up the ball near the halfway line, Ojo went on a dazzling solo run before calmly finishing to seal the win.

It was a professional performance from Bridges, who now turn their focus back to league action with two home fixtures on the horizon.
