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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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A HISTORY OF JERSEY BULLS FC

Founded in late 2018, Jersey Bulls is the most southerly football club in the English football league system. Following the footsteps of Guernsey F.C., the Bulls was conceived by Chairman Russell Le Feuvre to give Island players an opportunity to test their abilities in a more competitive environment on the mainland. It also gives islanders an opportunity to support a club side in Jersey that competes nationally like the Jersey Reds and Team Jets do in rugby and netball respectively.

On 30th November 2018 the Bulls received F.A. approval for their bid to join the English football leagues and a month later the Combined Counties League approved their membership bid to join Division One for the 2019-20 season. The Bulls announced ex-Island representative player Gary Freeman as manager and signed up 32 local players.

On 6th July 2019, the Bulls played their first match in a friendly at their home ground at Springfield Stadium against E.F.L. League Two team Stevenage, losing 3-4. Striker Fraser Barlow made history when he put the Bulls in the lead to be the clubs first goal scorer. Another friendly ten days later saw a 0-3 reverse against Leicester City U23 before a further leap into history was made when Bulls hosted their first league match against Ash United, winning 3-0. Barlow once again opened the scoring, followed by goals from Karl Hinds (penalty) and Harry Cardwell.

That win began an unexpected and sensational run of 27 league wins out of 27 matches, with Bulls sealing 'promotion' to the Premier Division with their 27th victory, a 2-0 win at home to British Airways, their amazing achievements bringing the attention of the national media. Then the world went into lockdown due to the global pandemic, all league football was suspended before the F.A. made the decision to cancel the remainder of the non-league football season and render all of it null and void, in effect expunging Bulls' record-breaking season as if it never happened. 2020-21 meant Bulls had it all to do again in Division One of the Combined Counties League but after four league wins and an opening round victory in their first F.A. Vase match it was another lockdown.

However, promotion was eventually gained to the newly formed Combined Counties Premier Division South under the F.A. re-structure of the "non-league pyramid". This was based on the points per game average gained in league matches over the two abandoned seasons and with the only 100% record the Bulls were ranked first nationwide.

Continued restrictions meant that Jersey entered the 2021-22 season without having played any pre-season friendlies. Those that had been arranged having had to be cancelled. Early league fixtures were all played away and some difficult opponents met early on. In contrast early success came in the F.A. Cup and the F.A. Vase, notably the former. A 10-1 win over Horsham Y.M.C.A. was the best debut match win in the competition since 1945. Further victories over Newhaven and the higher division V.C.D. Athletic led to a trip to Sutton Common Rovers, also senior in status to Jersey. A commendable draw led to an expensive return trip to the same venue a few days later as per the competition rules for offshore clubs. A 3-2 victory was inspired by a spectacular goal from Sol Solomon that featured on national television and was later celebrated in the local stamp issue celebrating 150 years of the F.A. Cup. Chertsey Town put an end to the run with a solitary goal in the Third Qualifying Round in front of a record home attendance of 1,611.

Only four league games had been played by the time of the F.A. Cup exit and three more league games would have to be fitted in on midweek dates later in the season. Nevertheless, the league campaign was then tackled in earnest and by the beginning of March Jersey were in a three-way tussle for the two promotion places. However, just when it was hoped that the season would end with a string of home fixtures it was announced that Springfield would be closed for its long-delayed re-development. That meant that three "home" fixtures would have to be played in England so there would be a run of seven fixtures "on the road". Only one of them was won and with their rivals

maintaining their momentum any promotion chance was gone. Regrouping the team won their last four matches back at Springfield to finish the season in fourth place after their first season at the higher level.

A review of the season led to the heart wrenching decision to withdraw the club's entry to the F.A. Cup for 2022-23 partly due to the restrictions placed on offshore clubs. It was hoped this would enable them to concentrate on their league and F.A. Vase campaigns. Continued success in the latter would also add to fixture re-arrangements, but as the rounds are about a month apart it was felt that these can be more readily accommodated.

The season promised much but the two main goals proved to be beyond them. In the league they spent the season chasing Raynes Park Vale and Badshot Lea but lost at home to both of them as well as to three other teams. On the other hand they did not lose on their travels until their final trip, to Raynes Park Vale. Technically they also "lost" one other when they conceded to Colliers Wood United after they were twice fog bound at their home airport in late April. In the F.A. Vase Jersey won six matches before going down to the only goal of the game to the holders Newton Pagnell Town in the last sixteen.

The 2023-24 season began, or the last one ended, with Jersey winning the men's football tournament at the Island Games in Guernsey. 14 current and 4 former Bulls formed the squad that won all five their matches, the last of them on 14th July. That restricted the pre-season club build up to just one pre-season friendly, a fortnight later versus Scottish Second Division side Stenhousemuir. The Scots ran out 4-1 winners and went on to win the first league title in their 100+ year history in early April.

Jersey had decided to re-enter the F.A. Cup and away at Sittingbourne was the first competitive fixture. Sittingbourne play at the level above and have just clinched a play-off place in the Isthmian Division 1 South-East Division. Therefore, a goalless draw in a hard-fought battle was no mean feat but it could have been better as Jersey blasted a penalty over the bar. Under F.A. rules Jersey had to travel back to England three days later for the replay which they won 2-0.

In the league, the Bulls battled to a second-placed finish in the league, behind Farnham Town, which saw them enter the play-off's. However, 5th placed AFC Croydon Athletic won at the Springfield Stadium before going on to win at Knaphill in the play-off final to gain promotion to Step 4.

Following that play-off defeat came confirmation of the widely rumoured resignation of the complete management team, most of whom had been involved throughout the club's five-year existence. They were duly thanked wholeheartedly for their efforts, much of it unseen by the wider audience.

And so happened the 2024/25 season, one of the strangest in non-league history. Having finished 4th, 3rd and then 2nd the mathematicians were hoping that this progression would continue in order to guarantee automatic promotion. If so it would occur under a different manager, Elliot Powell.

After a three-way battle throughout the season between the Bulls, Redhill and AFC Whyteleafe, a record crowd of 1,862 gathered on the last day of the season hopeful of seeing Jersey crowned champions with a win against Sandhurst Town. However, late the night before came confirmation that the Combined Counties League had deducted the club three points for playing Toby Ritzema against Tooting & Mitcham United on 29th March when he was suspended.

Redhill thought they had won the league on the last day of the season, but they too were later deducted points for fielding an ineligible player. Both the Bulls and Redhill were unsuccessful in their (long, drawn out) appeals, which meant AFC Whyteleafe went up at Champions.

Jersey, at the fourth time of asking, did however achieve promotion, defeating both Fleet Town and Cobham in the play-off's and will be playing Step 4 football in 2025/2026.

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MATCH REPORT **THREE BRIDGES 3-1 DEAL TOWN** **ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST** **SATURDAY 11 OCTOBER 2025**

Three Bridges extended their unbeaten run to eight matches with a well-earned 3–1 win at home to Deal Town on Saturday, keeping up the pressure at the top of the Isthmian League South East Division.

Manager Jamie Crellin named an unchanged starting line-up from the midweek cup win over Little Common, and the consistency paid off as Bridges capitalised on key moments in an otherwise competitive contest.

The hosts started cautiously but took the lead in the 13th minute. Hayden Neathey spotted the run of **HAYDEN VELVICK** and picked him out with a pinpoint pass. Velvick's initial shot was parried onto the post, but he reacted quickest to bury the rebound.

Twelve minutes later, Bridges doubled their advantage. A clever free-kick routine saw Reece Hallard fire from 25 yards; Deal Town's keeper could only parry it into danger, and **VELVICK** again showed his predatory instincts to tuck away the rebound for his second of the match.

Velvick came agonisingly close to a first-half hat-trick in the 41st minute, lifting a golden chance over the bar from close range. That miss proved costly just before the break, when a defensive lapse allowed Deal Town's **JACOB STROUTS** to pull one back with a tidy finish after Bridges failed to clear a routine cross. The hosts went into half-time with a 2–1 lead.

Deal Town came out strong after the break and dominated the opening stages of the second half. Strouts, now pushed up into a striker's role, forced Sam Roberts into an excellent save on 54 minutes with a powerful effort.

But Bridges weathered the pressure and found a third goal in the 73rd minute. A defensive error from Alfie Foster handed **CHARLIE BENNETT** a clear run at goal, and the striker produced a superb curling finish into the far corner - à la Thierry Henry - as he later described it.

Bridges managed the remainder of the match well to secure all three points and stay second in the table with 22 points from nine matches — just one behind leaders AFC Croydon, who have played a game more
