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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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A HISTORY OF FAVERSHAM TOWN FC

Faversham Town F.C. are a semi-professional football club competing in the Southern Counties East Football League (SCEFL), with U23s development, FTFC post 16 Football Academy and with youth teams at all ages. We also run girls' teams, disability teams and a power chair team. Faversham Town are the only club in the country other than England to boast a Three Lions badge, proudly representing the town crest.

Faversham Town's origins go back to 1884, initially playing friendlies before entering the Kent League around the turn of the century. The club disbanded for the Second World War but reformed in 1947 as the Faversham Town we know today with their 'lilywhite' shirts. The following year, the club moved to their current Salters Lane home.

Growing success in the 1970s, '80s and '90s culminated in a 2000 Kent League Challenge Cup victory, but in 2003 the club collapsed amid financial difficulties. The stadium became derelict and vandalised, but a strong desire by supporters and businessmen in the town to save their local team led to its revival in 2005. Volunteers hacked back shoulder-high grass and renovated the stands, and the club rose from the ashes.

Town won promotion to the Kent League in the first season back in 2005/06. In 2010 they were crowned champions and took the massive step up to the semi-professional Isthmian League, the highest level in the club's long history, where they have competed until relegation in 2022/23 season.

Season 2023-24 saw manager Sammy Moore get off to a solid start but a change in management came in January '24 when Tommy Warrilow was appointed Manager, under Tommy's guidance the club finished with an in creditable 13 match unbeaten run to finish second but regrettably lost out on promotion via the playoff system.

Season 2024-25 was Tommy Warrilow's first full season and it saw the club win the Southern Counties East FL Premier Division and promotion back to step 4 Pitch In Isthmian League, South East Division.

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The 2025-25 Season was without doubt one of the clubs most successful winning their League 8 points clear of runners-up VCD Athletic, who themselves won promotion via the playoff system. The Lilywhites lost only 2 league matches, 1 at home and 1 away.



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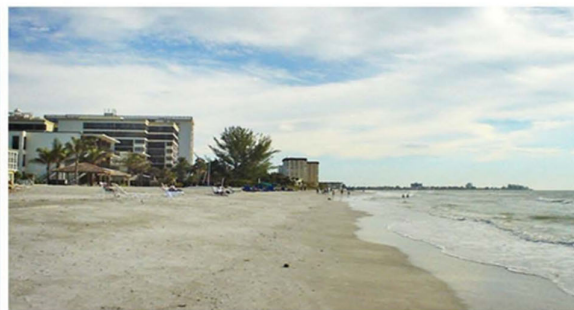
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MATCH REPORT

CROYDON ATHLETIC 0-2 THREE BRIDGES

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST

SATURDAY 15 NOVEMBER 2025

Three Bridges strengthened their grip on top spot in the Isthmian South-East with a disciplined and decisive 2–0 victory away at AFC Croydon Athletic on Saturday afternoon — a heavyweight clash between third and first that lived up to its billing.

Coming into the match, Bridges knew the significance of the occasion: a direct promotion rival, a challenging surface, and a chance to create real daylight at the summit. They wasted no time seizing the moment.

In the 4th minute, goalkeeper Sam Roberts turned provider with a pinpoint long pass over the Croydon back line. **NOEL LEIGHTON** muscled past his marker, rounded the advancing keeper, and coolly rolled the ball home to give Bridges the perfect start.

Croydon responded immediately. Former Beckenham star Louie Theophanous cracked an effort against the post, and from the rebound Sam Roberts produced a sharp low save to deny Pierrick. It was a warning, but Bridges remained composed.

The visitors struck again with a move of real quality in the 26th minute. The ever-influential Bryan Villavicencio split the defence with a superb through ball to Hayden Velvick, who selflessly squared across goal for **LEIGHTON** to tap in his second of the afternoon. Clinical, controlled, and exactly what Bridges needed.

The remainder of the half saw Bridges manage the tempo intelligently, taking a deserved two-goal advantage into the break.

With the pitch deteriorating and Croydon sending numbers forward, the second half demanded discipline — and Bridges delivered a resolute defensive display. Leighton had a golden chance to claim his hat-trick in the 55th minute, bursting through once more, but couldn't apply the finishing touch.

As Croydon pushed, Bridges' back line rose to every challenge. Their only major scare came in the 83rd minute, when Brenang met a loose ball with a fierce volley that flashed narrowly wide.

From there, Bridges managed the closing stages professionally, showing maturity and unity as they protected a precious clean sheet and secured a victory that felt as much psychological as it was mathematical.
