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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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A HISTORY OF ASHFORD UNITED FC

Ashford Town's home ground was at the back of the Victoria Hotel on Beaver Road. The club were founding members of the Kent Premier League in 1894–95, with a reserve side playing in Kent League 2. The club relocated to an enclosed ground with a timber-built stand at Godinton Road, where the 1899 KCFA Cup final was staged. Team colours at the time were black and white striped shirts.

The team appeared in the Kent Cup final for two successive years, 1902 and 1903, but were unsuccessful on both occasions — losing a replay 1–4 to Sittingbourne (after a last-minute penalty equaliser forced the replay) and then to Maidstone. In 1907, owing to a lack of support at their Godinton Road ground — which, being beyond the railway bridge, was a fair distance from the town — the club, suffering from heavy debts, was unable to fulfil its fixtures and ceased playing mid-season.

Shortly afterward, however, a new club was formed, playing as Ashford Railway Works. The club's home ground was relocated back to Newtown on land believed to have been provided rent-free by the South Eastern & Chatham Railway.

Playing in the Eastern Section of the Kent League and wearing red and green quartered colours, the team enjoyed considerable success, winning the league in four successive seasons: 1912, 1913, 1914, and 1920 (the latter following the break caused by the war).

It was around this time that the club acquired its nickname, the 'Nuts and Bolts,' as many of its members were skilled engineers from the railway. The club became more commonly known as 'Ashford' upon the post-war resumption of the Kent League competition. However, once again, fate intervened, and in 1928 the club folded, leaving the town without a football team.

The decision to found Ashford Town was taken at a meeting in April 1930, chaired by Sir Charles Iggledon, the editor of the Kentish Express. Ashford Town was elected to the Kent League and played its first match on August 30th of the same year at the railway works ground, with Canterbury Waverley as the visitors. The result was a 4–2 victory.

The following year, the club moved to Essella Park. The sale of this ground in the mid-1980s enabled the purchase and development of the present ground at The Homelands, named after the farm that originally occupied the site.

Despite being champions of the Kent League in the 1948–49 season, it was cup football that brought the greatest success. Town reached the first round proper of the FA Cup as a Kent League side in 1959, losing 1–0 to Crystal Palace in front of a ground record crowd of 6,525.

In the 1960s, Town reached the first round of the FA Cup on four occasions, falling to league opposition each time. Further honours arrived with victories in the Kent Senior Cup in 1959 and 1963.

In the 1972–73 season, Town reached the semi-finals of the FA Trophy, losing to Scarborough by a penalty goal. The following year, they finished third in the league, with Alan Morton setting the club's scoring record of 46 goals from 69 games — a record that still stands today.



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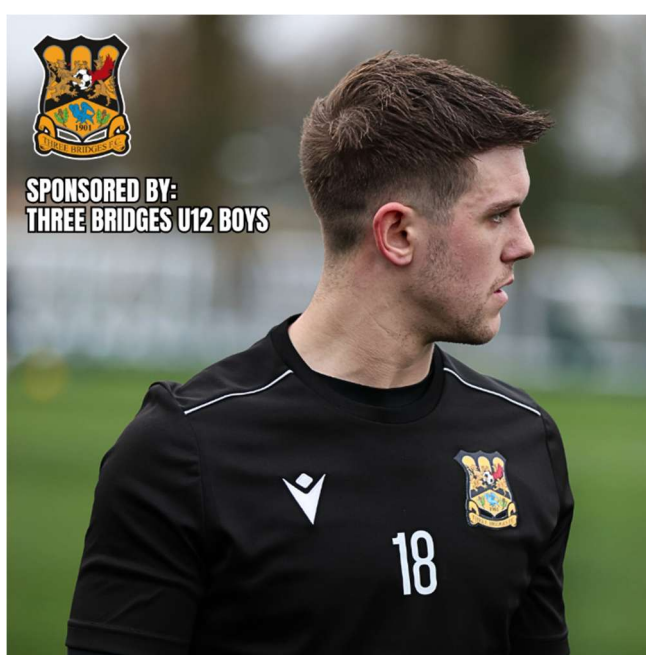
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MATCH REPORT

SEVENOAKS TOWN 0-5 THREE BRIDGES

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST

SATURDAY 13 DECEMBER 2025

Three Bridges continued their march at the top of the Isthmian South East League with a dominant 5–0 victory away at Sevenoaks Town, extending their fine run of form at the summit of the table.

A high-flying Bridges side made the trip across the M25 to face a struggling Sevenoaks Town outfit desperate for points, with the two teams starting the day at opposite ends of the league standings. Bridges were almost handed the perfect start when Noel Leighton was brought down inside the penalty area early on. However, Ben Holden — who had previously boasted a 100% record from the spot — dragged his effort wide, giving the hosts a much-needed reprieve.

Undeterred, Bridges continued to dominate possession and probe for an opener. The breakthrough finally arrived in the 36th minute. **REECE HALLARD** raced through one-on-one with Perrin in the Sevenoaks goal, whose initial save looked to have denied Bridges. Harvey Woollard reacted quickest to collect the rebound, dribbled around the goalkeeper and selflessly squared for Hallard, who smashed the ball home past two defenders on the line to make it 1–0.

The lead was doubled just four minutes later when Josh Hallard delivered a pinpoint corner that was met by a powerful header from **HAYDEN NEATHEY**, sending Bridges into the break with a deserved 2–0 advantage.

Sevenoaks emerged from the interval with renewed energy and enjoyed a brief spell of pressure, but without seriously testing Sam Roberts in the Bridges goal. Any hopes of a comeback were extinguished in the 53rd minute when Josh Hallard's cross was deflected into the path of **NOEL LEIGHTON**, who reacted instinctively to fire home and make it 3–0.

Bridges' appetite for goals showed no sign of easing. In the 61st minute, a superb interchange between Ade Adeyinka and Leighton released **HAYDEN VELVICK**, who produced a stunning left-footed strike into the top corner to extend the lead to four.

The scoring was completed in the 70th minute as **ADE ADEYINKA** capped an outstanding midfield display with a composed finish at the back post, following advantage played by the referee, to make it 5–0.

The final whistle confirmed a comprehensive victory for the league leaders, who recorded a third consecutive clean sheet and have now scored 13 goals in their last three matches.

The result means Three Bridges remain top of the Isthmian South East League, sitting on 51 points from 22 matches, four points clear of AFC Whyteleafe in second place, who still have a game in hand.
