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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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A HISTORY OF BROADBRIDGE HEATH FC

Broadbridge Heath Football Club was founded in 1919 by local ex-members of the armed forces who had just returned from the 1914-18 Great War. In the very first season of competitive football, with only 12 registered players, the club won the Horsham and District Championship and Challenge Cup.

In 1970-71 the Horsham League amalgamated with the West Sussex Football League and Heath joined Division Three. Promotion was won to Division Two the following season. In 1978-79 following promotion from the Premier Division of the WSFL, Broadbridge Heath joined the Southern Counties Combination League which at that time was a feeder to the Sussex County Football League. The SCCL amalgamated with the County League in 1983-84 with Heath becoming founder members of Division 3.

The club moved to the Broadbridge Heath Leisure Centre in Wickhurst Lane in 1987 where we had exclusive use of the stadium pitch, bar and social area. At the end of the 1987-88 season the Club were promoted to senior football in Division 2 for the very first time. Heath remained in senior football for 20 years, with one season (1998-99) in Division One. Despite succeeding on the pitch off the field events deteriorated when the Clubs Landlord decided not to renew the clubs lease to run the bar and social area and for several years with no home and no assets, the Club struggled to survive.

At the end of the 2007-08 season Heath were relegated to Division 3, things got even worse for the Club when the team finished second from bottom 2 years later and only avoided demotion because there were not enough clubs in the feeder leagues with facilities to satisfy County League requirements.

Season 2010-11 saw an improvement in the clubs fortunes with the team finishing in sixth position and a year later they finished one place higher behind some very good intermediate sides. As a result of restructuring in the leagues above and despite finishing fifth, Broadbridge Heath were promoted back to senior football in Division 2 at the end of the 2011-12 season.

Back in Div 2 after a 5 year break the team finished in 6th position and reached the final of the SCFA RUR Cup where they narrowly lost 1-0 to Div One runners up East Preston. A year later the team went even better by finishing the season as runners up to Eastbourne United and with that promotion back to Division One for only the second time in the clubs history.

In the first two seasons back in Div One (now renamed the Premier Division) the club finished 9th and a year later went even better finishing 8th. In 2017-2018 a slight dip saw the team finish in 15th position but they bounced back a year later to end in 6th place which at the time was our highest ever finish.

Things also improved off the field when, on the 2nd August 2019, the club took possession of their new purpose built facilities, a stadium to satisfy the ground grading requirements for Step 5 football with two further pitches for use by our adult and youth teams for matches and training.

In January 2020 former Heath player Chris Simmons took over as Manager, initially on an interim basis but with performances improving he was offered the position on a permanent basis three months later. COVID then struck and two seasons became null and void, after his first full season in charge the team finished in 7th place. In 2023/24 they were crowned Southern Combination League Champions with promotion to the Isthmian League South East and in their first two seasons at Step 4 they finished 9th & 13th.



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MATCH REPORT

HASSOCKS 1-5 THREE BRIDGES

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST

SATURDAY 27 DECEMBER 2025

Three Bridges extended their lead at the top of the Isthmian South East League with an emphatic 5–1 victory away at Hassocks, rounding off the calendar year in superb fashion in front of a crowd of 526, bolstered by a large and vocal travelling support.

The hosts made a dream start in the fifth minute when Bridges failed to fully clear a long throw into the box. The ball dropped kindly for Matthew Daniel, who reacted quickest to produce an acrobatic finish and put Hassocks 1–0 ahead.

Bridges responded well to the early setback and soon took control of the contest. Kevin Rivera was denied on several occasions by an excellent James Shaw in the Hassocks goal, while Reece Hallard also went close as the visitors piled on the pressure. The equaliser finally arrived in the 32nd minute when **HALLARD** produced a trademark moment of quality, cutting in from the left before unleashing an unstoppable strike past Shaw to level the scores.

Hassocks nearly regained the lead moments later, but Sam Roberts was equal to the task, producing a superb save to deny Liam Benson. The sides went in level at the break, with everything still to play for.

Bridges came out for the second half with renewed authority and were rewarded in the 53rd minute. A delightful cross from Hayden Velvick was met by an outstanding header from **RIVERA**, who powered the ball into the top corner to make it 2–1. The goal also marked Bridges' 100th in all competitions this season — a remarkable milestone and a reflection of their attacking prowess.

Hassocks came agonisingly close to an equaliser in the 66th minute when Lewis Finney beat Roberts, only to see his effort strike the post and roll along the goal line before being gathered by the relieved Bridges goalkeeper.

That proved to be a pivotal moment. Just two minutes later, Ade Adeyinka's excellent work in midfield released **HALLARD** through on goal, and the forward showed great composure to finish clinically for his second of the afternoon and a 3–1 lead. It was Hallard's 20th league goal of the season, a strike that saw him overtake teammate Noel Leighton at the top of the Isthmian South East goalscoring charts, with the pair now sitting first and second respectively.

With confidence flowing, Bridges began to enjoy themselves. Adeyinka then produced a moment of brilliance, dribbling past several defenders — including the goalkeeper — before being brought down in the box by James Shaw. **CHARLIE BENNETT** stepped up and dispatched the resulting penalty with conviction to make it 4–1.

The scoring was completed deep into stoppage time when under-18 player and exciting young talent Connor Hayden-Pickering showed great awareness to slip **ADE ADEYINKA** through on goal. The midfielder calmly finished to cap a dominant display and seal a resounding 5–1 win.

The result sees Three Bridges finish the year top of the league on 57 points, with 18 wins from 24 games and an astonishing +48 goal difference. They sit five points clear of nearest challengers AFC Croydon Athletic
