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# A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5<sup>th</sup> place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19<sup>th</sup> place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7<sup>th</sup> position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14<sup>th</sup> position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14<sup>th</sup> place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8<sup>th</sup> place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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# A HISTORY OF HORSHAM FC

Records of a football club bearing the Horsham name exist as far back as 1871 but it wasn't until a decade later that regular organised football was played in the town. A founder member of both the Sussex County FA and the West Sussex Senior League, Horsham's golden era came in the 1930s when, by now playing in the Sussex County League, they won six titles and nine cup finals.

They reached the first round of the FA Cup in 1947 for the first time and, in 1952, became members of the Metropolitan League that included the 'A' sides of clubs such as Brighton & Hove Albion, West Ham United and Tottenham Hotspur, winning the title at the first attempt. In 1957 they made the switch to the Corinthian League, where their six-year stay peaked with a third placed finish in 1961/62.

Horsham found themselves in the Athenian League, formed by the merger of the Corinthian and Delphian Leagues in 1963, and experienced relegation, two title wins, and a second appearance in the FA Cup first round before joining the Isthmian League in 1973. Twice Senior Cup winners in the 1970s, they ended the decade under the threat of bankruptcy and only escaped relegation to the County League at the end of the 1980s after winning a two-legged play-off match with now defunct Letchworth Garden City. Progress was eventually made and they were crowned Division Three champions in 1996.

Former Crawley Town boss John Maggs took over as manager in January 2000, taking a struggling side to Division Two runners-up inside three seasons and a promotion play-off final appearance in 2004/05. Promotion to the Premier Division was achieved the following season and the club went on to establish itself as a consistent performer, even challenging for a place in Conference South in 2007/8, as well as making history by reaching the second round proper of the FA Cup and taking eventual League One champions Swansea City to a replay, with both matches shown live on Sky TV.

Having sold their ground for redevelopment at the end of that same season, Horsham spent a financially cautious decade groundsharing at Worthing, Horsham YMCA and Lancing, during which time they dropped down to the County League for a single season before coming straight back up as champions under the guidance of former East Preston boss Dom Di Paola. In 2019 they moved into their new stadium at Hop Oast and back in the Premier Division, having won a tight play-off match with Ashford United.

After the first two campaigns at their new home were cut short due to the Covid pandemic, 2021/22 saw the club lift the Velocity Trophy (the Isthmian League Cup) for the first time in their history, as well as reaching the first round of the FA Cup for a fourth time.

2022-23 saw the club achieve a best-ever 7th place, but that was topped in 2023-24 with a 5th-placed finish and a first-ever tilt at the play-offs, suffering a painful semi-final defeat to Chatham Town on penalties.

There were also record runs in the FA Cup and FA Trophy (to the 2nd and 4th rounds, respectively), including hosting ITV for live coverage of the home FA Cup tie against League 1 Barnsley, but the icing on the cake of the club's best-ever season came at the Amex Stadium with a 3-0 victory over Hastings United in the Sussex Senior Cup, the club's first win in the competition since 1976.

At least, it was the club's best-ever season until 2024-25 came along! Another FA Cup 1st round appearance and a run to the 3rd round of the FA Trophy were rounded off by the first League and Sussex Senior Cup double in the club's history. The nail-biting tension of the final day, when the Hornets snatched the title from Billericay Town on goal difference by a single-goal margin, will never be forgotten. The double was completed at Brighton's Amex Stadium 12 days later to set the seal on a campaign that may never be matched.

The season also marked ten years in charge for Dom Di Paola, during which time the club has remarkably achieved a higher-placed finish in every one of the eight completed seasons, a record that will automatically be extended to nine in National League South in 2025-26.

# **THREE BRIDGES 4-0 BROADBRIDGE HEATH**

## **ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST**

### **SATURDAY 3 JANUARY 2026**

Three Bridges continued their impressive march at the summit of the Isthmian South-East League with an emphatic 4–0 victory over local rivals Broadbridge Heath at Jubilee Field on Saturday afternoon.

Jamie Crellin's side were well aware of the challenge posed by the Bears, one of only three teams to have beaten Bridges this season in the reverse fixture. In freezing conditions, however, the league leaders produced a dominant and composed performance to exact revenge and further strengthen their promotion push.

Bridges started with real intent, controlling possession and dictating the tempo from the outset. Despite that dominance, it was Broadbridge Heath who carved out the first major opportunity of the match in the 28th minute. Gibson's curling free-kick appeared destined for the net, but Sam Roberts produced a superb reaction save to parry the effort away and keep the scores level.

The breakthrough arrived eight minutes later. Charlie Bennett was brought down in the penalty area, and the forward picked himself up to confidently dispatch the resulting spot-kick, sending the keeper the wrong way to give Bridges a deserved 1–0 lead.

Momentum remained firmly with the hosts, and just before the interval Bridges doubled their advantage. In the 41st minute, Bridges were awarded a second penalty after a challenge on Reece Hallard inside the area, allowing Bennett to step up once more and calmly convert to make it 2–0 at the break.

The second half followed a similar pattern, with Bridges continuing to dominate proceedings. Broadbridge Heath threatened briefly when Connell unleashed a powerful long-range strike, but Roberts was again equal to it, producing another excellent save to preserve his clean sheet.

Any lingering doubt was put to bed in the 64th minute. Recently crowned Player of the Month Ade Adeyinka showcased his quality in midfield before applying a cool, composed finish past the visiting goalkeeper to make it 3–0.

The scoring was completed in the 79th minute by the ever-reliable Reece Hallard. A swift counter-attack saw the forward round the keeper before rolling the ball into an empty net, capping off another outstanding individual display.

The loudest cheer of the afternoon, however, came in the 86th minute. Universally loved defender Tresor Difika made his long-awaited return to action after an injury that required two surgeries and kept him sidelined for 610 days. His introduction was met with a standing ovation and provided a fittingly emotional moment as Bridges' promotion charge rolled on.

The result leaves Three Bridges top of the Isthmian South-East League with 60 points from 25 games, eight points clear of nearest challengers AFC Croydon Athletic, who do have a game in hand.
