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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

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A HISTORY OF BECKENHAM TOWN FC

Beckenham Town Football Club is one of the oldest surviving non-league football clubs in England, with a proud and enduring history that dates back well over a century. The club was first officially affiliated with the Kent Football Association in 1887, marking the beginning of its long-standing involvement in organised football.

Throughout the early and mid-20th century, the club competed across a number of regional leagues, reflecting both its ambition and adaptability within the evolving structure of English non-league football. Records indicate that Beckenham Town participated in the London League during two separate spells, from 1923 to 1933 and again from 1951 to 1961. Following this, the club moved into the Aetolian League between 1961 and 1964, before progressing to the Greater London League, where it competed from 1964 until 1969.

In addition to its league commitments, the club has maintained a consistent presence in national competitions. Alongside its current participation in the FA Cup and FA Vase, Beckenham Town also took part in the FA Amateur Cup for over four decades, from 1926 through to 1967, demonstrating its long-standing role within the amateur game.

Beckenham Town's history is enriched by its association with several notable figures from both the sporting and political worlds. Among its past Presidents is former UK Prime Minister Harold Macmillan, whose involvement reflects the club's standing within the community.

The club has also benefited from the support of distinguished Vice Presidents, including Sydney Wooderson, widely regarded as one of Britain's greatest middle-distance runners and a record-breaking athlete in his era.

On the playing side, Beckenham Town has been home to several footballers who went on to achieve success at higher levels of the game. Goalkeeper Ray Potter made over 220 appearances for West Bromwich Albion, while Frank "Dot" Morris featured more than 70 times for Crystal Palace. Another notable name is Pat Saward, who played for Aston Villa in the 1950s and captained the Republic of Ireland national team.

In more recent years, the club has also seen former Charlton Athletic forward Jason Euell don the Beckenham Town shirt, further highlighting the club's continued relevance and appeal.

Beckenham Town has enjoyed a number of notable successes throughout its history. Among its early achievements was winning the London League Championship in the 1927–28 season, followed by a strong runners-up finish in 1930–31.

However, the club faced a significant setback in 1969 when it folded and merged with Bromley FC. Despite this, the spirit of Beckenham Town endured, and the club was re-formed in 1975, joining the London Spartan League. Success soon followed, with the team finishing as runners-up to Fisher Athletic in the Spartan League Senior Division during the 1977–78 season.

The club also reached two Spartan League Cup Finals, though they narrowly missed out on silverware, finishing as runners-up to Welling United and Farnham Town.

In later years, Beckenham Town continued to compete strongly, reaching the Kent League Cup Final on two occasions—in the 1984–85 and 1992–93 seasons. A particularly notable league achievement came in 2005–06, when the club finished as runners-up in the Kent League Premier Division, just behind Maidstone United.

After several near misses in 1981/82, 2004/05, and 2007/08, Beckenham Town finally secured victory in the Kent Senior Trophy with an emphatic 4–0 win over Ashford United, marking a memorable milestone in the club's modern history.

More recently, in 2021, the club made a lateral move into the Combined Counties League. This transition proved highly successful, as Beckenham Town went on to win the Premier Division South title in the 2021–22 season, earning promotion to the Isthmian League and signalling a new and exciting chapter in the club's long and storied journey.



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MATCH REPORT

THREE BRIDGES 4-2 WORTHING

SUSSEX TRANSPORT SENIOR CUP

TUESDAY 17 MARCH 2026

Three Bridges produced one of the greatest performances in their 125-year history, defeating National League South high-flyers Worthing 4–2 in Lancing to secure a place in the Sussex Transport Cup Final for the very first time.

In what has already been a record-breaking season, this was a night that will live long in the memory. Having overcome Little Common, dismantled Wick 10–0, and edged past Horsham on penalties, Bridges knew they would need something extraordinary against opponents two divisions above them. What followed was exactly that—90 minutes of relentless energy, quality, and belief that saw them outplay and outwork their full-time opposition.

It could not have started any better. Just four minutes in, Bryan Villavicencio won possession deep inside his own half before feeding Ade Adeyinka, who threaded a superb pass through to Hayden Velvick. The winger showed great composure to slot the ball through the Worthing goalkeeper's legs and give Bridges a dream start.

Three minutes later, the advantage was doubled. A quick-thinking free kick from Villavicencio found R. Hallard, who combined neatly with Velvick down the right. Velvick's pinpoint cross was met by Charlie Bennett, who guided a beautiful volley into the net to make it 2–0.

Bridges were in full flow—and by the 17th minute, they were in dreamland. Another outstanding delivery from Velvick found Bennett once again, and his powerful header made it 3–0, sparking scenes of disbelief among Worthing supporters and neutrals alike, and sheer joy from the travelling Bridges contingent.

To their credit, Worthing responded in the 35th minute when Morton capitalised on an interception to race through on goal and reduce the deficit to 3–1. However, Bridges refused to let their levels drop, continuing to dominate the remainder of the half with both Bennett and Velvick going close again before the break.

Any questions about whether Bridges could maintain their intensity in the second half against full-time opposition were emphatically answered. Rather than sitting back, they came out with the same attacking intent—a testament to their fitness, mindset, and the tactical approach of manager Jamie Crellin.

Their boldness was rewarded in the 52nd minute. Noel Leighton, outstanding throughout, delivered a dangerous cross from the right that looked destined for Bennett. In attempting to deny the striker his hat-trick, Worthing's Joe Cook could only divert the ball into his own net, extending the lead to 4–1.

Worthing threw everything forward in response but were repeatedly denied by an inspired Sam Roberts in goal, who produced two crucial one-on-one saves to preserve Bridges' advantage. Although Brad Dolaghan reduced the deficit to 4–2 in the 70th minute, Bridges stood firm.

The final stages were managed superbly, with every tackle, block, and clearance roared on by a passionate travelling support. When the final whistle blew, it confirmed a famous 4–2 victory—one that will be remembered as a defining moment in the club's history.

Bridges now look ahead to a historic Sussex Transport Cup Final at the Amex Stadium in early May, where they will face either Eastbourne Borough or Brighton.
