Finally, I would like to place on record my sincere thanks to all the staff, volunteers and committee members at Three Bridges for their continued hard work and dedication to the football club. Your commitment behind the scenes keeps everything running and is hugely appreciated by everyone involved.

Today's visitors will no doubt provide a tough test, but supporters may remember the away fixture back in December when we recorded an excellent 5–0 victory over Sevenoaks Town. Let's hope the team can produce another strong performance this afternoon and give our supporters plenty to cheer about once again.

A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against-the-odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08. In season 2010/11 hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but eventually finished the season in 5th place. However, they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid-February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place. The 2014/15 season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record in conceding 67 goals in season 2015/16 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation. For the 2017/18 season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strengthened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Bridges also strengthened the management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley. That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman, and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions, the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan. However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last, and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin who played for the Club for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club. First Team player, Brannon O'Neill, was appointed as U18s Manager. 2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin take over as First Team Manager, with Danny Lee (former Academy manager) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw Brannon O'Neill appointed as Assistant Manager following Danny Lee's departure to Whitehawk and Joe Kay joined as First Team Coach. The team finished in their highest ever League position (fourth) but were beaten in the final of the Play Offs at home to Chichester City.

Brannon moved to Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2024, so Joe Kay is now Jamie's Assistant Manager with Ross Ball in the role of Goalkeeping Coach.

The 2024/25 season was a monumental year for the football club, as the long planned 3G pitch facility development took place. This meant starting the season playing home games out of Chatham Town FC, but by Boxing Day the First Team were back home and by January 2025 the 3G pitch was in full use by men's, women's and youth teams of Three Bridges FC, as well as users from the local community, schools, colleges and charities. On the pitch, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished in a respectable 8th place after making a late but unsuccessful push for the play-offs.

The majority of the 2024/25 team have remained at the club, with Dan Perry returning during pre-season and further additions made in Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka.

A HISTORY OF SEVENOAKS TOWN FC

Founded in 1883, Sevenoaks Town FC is a cornerstone of the local community. Originally a founding member of the Kent League, the club left after just one season. After a long absence of over 110 years, it re-emerged in 2006, quickly re-establishing its presence in the football world. The club played its first recorded match against Royal Arsenal in 1893, drawing a crowd of over 1,000 spectators and showcasing its early potential and connection with the community.

In 1906, Sevenoaks Town became a founding member of the Sevenoaks League, and in 1951, they merged with St John's United, winning the Kent Amateur League title on two occasions. The club achieved its first major success in 1984 when it became the inaugural champion of the reorganised Kent County League. After more than a century in amateur leagues, they ascended to the semi-professional Kent League in 2003, marking a new era in their history. Their first season saw them achieve a respectable 11th place, highlighted by a thrilling comeback victory against former Football League side Maidstone United.

The club's participation in senior leagues opened the door to prestigious FA competitions, where they made their FA Vase debut in the 2004-05 season. Their most notable FA Cup performance came in 2016-17 when they faced Chesham in a replay during the second qualifying round. They have also made strides in the FA Trophy, with their inaugural match in 2018-19 featuring a memorable victory over Grays Athletic.

Under the leadership of Micky Collins, who took charge in 2014, Sevenoaks enjoyed a period of impressive growth, culminating in the 2017-18 season when they secured the Southern Counties East League title and achieved promotion to Step 4 for the first time. Despite challenges from the COVID-19 pandemic, the club demonstrated resilience, with Harry Hudson taking over in 2021 and leading a remarkable turnaround, securing a mid-table finish and an impressive 13th place at the end of the season.

The 2022-23 season brought about the club's best-ever runs in both the Emirates FA Cup and the Isuzu FA Trophy, highlighted by a thrilling win over Bath City. As they moved into the 2023-24 season, Sevenoaks faced transitions, including managerial changes, but continued to thrive with a focus on rebuilding the squad and reintroducing a reserve team. The club remains committed to fostering talent across all ages, with a vibrant community of over 1,299 players and dedicated volunteers.

The club's women's teams continue to progress in their respective competitions as well as success for many of the club's junior teams - boys and girls - and Powerchair - Gregg Baxter selected for the England Development Squad.

Funding was confirmed to finance the long term project of redeveloping Greatness Park. In June 2025, the club confirmed they had been successful in receiving grant funding of £1.8m to build a new clubhouse.

The 24/25 Season - Marcel Nimani's first in charge - the club finished 9th, achieving the highest points tally as a Step 4 club - 62 - in a season extended to 42 games.

MATCH REPORT

BECKENHAM TOWN 1-6 THREE BRIDGES

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST

Three Bridges produced a superb attacking display to return to winning ways with a commanding 6–1 victory away at Beckenham Town on Tuesday night, extending their lead at the top of the Isthmian South-East League to eight points.

After the narrow defeat at Sittingbourne last weekend, Bridges responded emphatically with Noel Leighton leading the charge in spectacular fashion. The forward, who will miss the next two matches through suspension, made his mark early with a quickfire double to put the visitors firmly in control.

The breakthrough arrived in the 14th minute following an outstanding run from Hayden Velvick, which created the opening for Leighton to finish and give Bridges the lead. Just two minutes later the striker struck again, meeting Bryan Villavicencio's delivery inside the box and finishing confidently to make it 2–0 and hand the visitors a dream start.

Beckenham responded in the 22nd minute when Alfie Bloomfield finished off a flowing move to reduce the deficit and briefly give the hosts hope.

Carlos Richards, a brand-new signing handed an early opportunity due to injuries in the squad, almost marked his debut with a spectacular goal in the 34th minute. His powerful effort from 25 yards forced a strong save from the Beckenham goalkeeper, who managed to divert the shot behind for a corner.

Bridges restored their two-goal cushion just before the interval. In the 44th minute Richards showed superb skill to beat his defender before delivering an excellent cross for Leighton, who powered home a header to complete his hat-trick and send Bridges into the break leading 3–1.

The visitors remained firmly in control after the restart. Sam Roberts was alert early in the second half to deny Corbin with a sharp save, ensuring Beckenham were unable to build momentum.

Any lingering hopes for the hosts were ended in the 64th minute when Charlie Bennett reacted quickest after Leighton's shot had been saved, tapping into an empty net to make it 4–1.

Just two minutes later Leighton capped a remarkable individual performance with his fourth goal of the night. Pressuring Beckenham goalkeeper Sullivan, the striker forced a rushed clearance that fell kindly for him to convert into an empty net, taking his tally to 29 league goals for the season.

A perfect evening for Bridges was completed in the 74th minute when the electric Richards claimed a well-deserved debut goal, racing down the left before rounding the goalkeeper and finishing confidently to seal a 6–1 victory.

The result strengthens Bridges' position at the summit of the table, where they now sit on 81 points from 34 matches, eight clear of nearest challengers AFC Croydon Athletic with eight league fixtures remaining.
