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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and claimed their first league championship in the 1907/08 season. Their first significant triumph came in 1933/34 with a Sussex Junior Cup victory, followed by a series of minor honours before they entered the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53. Two years later, they were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63, they won the Division Two Invitation Cup, and were Second Division runners-up in 1968/69, 1973/74, and 1979/80. A notable achievement came in 1970/71 when they defied expectations to win the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s saw a string of successes, beginning with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase in 1981/82, narrowly losing to Molesey (1-2). The following season, they reached the last 32 and captured the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, defeating Hastings Town 3-2. They finished runners-up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament the next year, earning a set of floodlights.

The mid-to-late 1980s were particularly strong: Division One runners-up in 1985/86, repeating the feat in 1987/88 (also winning the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993, which refocused club priorities and led to relegation in 1996/97. They bounced back by winning the Division 2 League Cup in 1997/98 and finishing as Division 2 runners-up to regain Division 1 status. RUR Cup runners-up in 2003/04, they claimed the trophy in 2007/08.

The 2010/11 season started strongly with nine consecutive league wins, though they ultimately finished 5th. However, they won the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time, defeating Rye United 2-1—a feat repeated in 2011/12 with a 2-1 victory over AFC Uckfield. After a rocky start in one season losing four of the first nine matches, they went on a 29-game stretch with just a single defeat, finishing as Sussex County Football League Champions after a decisive 1-0 win over rivals Rye United.

Their debut season in the Ryman Isthmian League South Division was challenging, but an 11-match run late in the season, including seven wins, secured survival and earned Team of the Month Awards in March and April. Subsequent seasons saw fluctuating results, with mid-season signings helping them avoid relegation and later achieving 7th place in 2014/15, though defensive issues remained. The 2015/16 season saw improved defence but fewer goals scored, leading to a 14th-place finish with 66 points—only six fewer than the previous season.

The 2016/17 campaign was hit hard by injuries, forcing reliance on U21, Academy, and U18 players. Despite squad reinforcements later, relegation could not be avoided. In 2017/18, a strengthened squad and management team, including ex-player Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach Marc Wardley, helped Three Bridges finish second in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, earning promotion back to the Isthmian League.

After 25 years as manager, Paul Faili stepped down in 2018/19 to focus on his role as Club Chairman, handing management to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins and Keith George. Despite a poor start, a brief unbeaten run earned Dynan Manager of the Month, but he departed after continued struggles. Paul Faili returned for the final nine games, securing a 14th-place finish, 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul continued as manager, assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crellin, who retired after 164 appearances due to injury. Brannon O'Neill became U18s Manager. In 2021/22, Jamie Crellin became First Team Manager with Danny Lee as Assistant. For 2022/23, Brannon O'Neill moved to Assistant Manager with Joe Kay joining as First Team Coach. That season, Three Bridges achieved their highest league finish (fourth) but lost in the playoff final to Chichester City.

Brannon O'Neill moved to Burgess Hill Town in 2024, leaving Joe Kay as Jamie Crellin's Assistant Manager and Ross Ball as Goalkeeping Coach. The 2024/25 season marked a milestone with the opening of the club's new 3G pitch, temporarily requiring home games at Chatham Town FC. By January 2025, the 3G facility was fully operational, benefiting men's, women's, youth teams, and the wider community. On the field, after being in the relegation zone in November, the team finished 8th following a late push for the playoffs.

The majority of the 2024/25 squad remains, with Dan Perry returning and new signings including Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett, and Ade Adeyinka.

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A HISTORY OF HASSOCKS FC

Hassocks Football Club was founded in 1902 and spent its first eight decades competing in the Mid Sussex Football League and the Brighton & Hove and District Football League, playing at Adastra Park in the heart of the village. The club, known as the Robins, lifted its first trophy in 1928, winning the prestigious Mowatt Cup. In 1960, they added the Montgomery Cup to their honours.

A move to the Brighton & Hove League in the mid-1960s marked a turning point for Hassocks. The Robins achieved back-to-back promotions from Division Three to Division One in 1965 and 1966, eventually claiming the Brighton League title in 1972, following a runners-up finish the previous season. The Sussex Intermediate Cup followed in 1975, completing a golden era for the club.

Hassocks' ambitions for senior football were realised in 1981–82 when the club joined Division One of the Southern Combination Football League. They finished 12th in their debut season and maintained a series of top-half finishes until new ground grading rules saw them relegated to Division Two, returning to intermediate football.

Major changes came in 1991. Former player and manager Jim Goodrum became chairman, Dave John joined as general manager from Haywards Heath Town, and a new coaching team—Nick Greenwood and Peter Liddell—took over the first team. Their recruitment drive immediately paid off, with Hassocks winning the Division Two title by ten points in their first season together. Off the pitch, John established a youth system that has since become one of Sussex's finest in non-league football, producing over 100 players who progressed from Under-18s to senior football.

In 1992, Hassocks moved from Adastra Park to their own purpose-built ground at The Beacon. The upgraded facilities enabled promotion to Division One and a return to senior football. Three years later, Greenwood and Liddell guided Hassocks into the Premier Division of the Southern Combination League for the first time, finishing as Division One runners-up. To meet ground grading requirements, floodlights were installed at The Beacon, funded by a combination of fundraising efforts and a generous donation from Chelsea vice-chairman Matthew Harding, whose sons Pat and Joel would go on to make over 600 appearances for the club. The floodlights were inaugurated with a Chelsea XI featuring Graham Rix and Liam Brady.

Hassocks made their FA Vase debut in 1995–96 and entered the FA Cup the following year. Their best FA Cup run came under Dave John, reaching the third qualifying round in 2001–02, where they were defeated by Lewes, who themselves progressed to the first round proper against Stoke City. The club celebrated its centenary in 2002 with a match against an ex-Arsenal and Celebrity XI. Later that year, Brighton & Hove Albion, managed by Steve Coppell, opened the 237-seat Maurice Boxall Stand at The Beacon, partly funded by the previous season's FA Cup run. In 2007, a new clubhouse was completed, further enhancing The Beacon, which has since hosted numerous Southern Combination League cup finals.

The 2011–12 season saw Mickey Jewell lead Hassocks to their highest-ever finish at the time, fourth in the Premier Division, while also reaching the semi-final of the RUR Cup. Jewell stepped down in 2014, and club legend Dave John returned for a brief third spell as manager alongside his chairman duties. He was succeeded by Mark Dalglish and Phil Wickwar, who orchestrated a dramatic escape from relegation in the 2014–15 season. Despite financial challenges and being one of the few Premier Division clubs not paying players, Hassocks continued to avoid relegation until the 2017–18 season, when they finished in the bottom three but were spared due to league circumstances.

Dalglish left after the curtailed 2019–20 season due to Covid-19, and John returned for the 2020–21 season, which was again shortened by the pandemic. Ahead of 2021–22, John became technical director, promoting Brad Sweetman from the Under-18s to first team head coach. Sweetman, who had guided the Under-18s to an historic treble in 2017–18, steadily integrated youth players into the senior squad. Despite a challenging first half of the season, Hassocks finished 16th and reached the RUR Cup semi-finals.

Sweetman was replaced by fan-favourite James Westlake, who rebuilt the squad with a mix of new signings and returning players. In 2022–23, Hassocks finished 10th, their first top-half finish in nine years. The following season, 2023–24, the Robins achieved a club-record 78 points to finish fifth and qualified for the promotion playoffs for the first time, narrowly losing to eventual winners Eastbourne Town.

In the summer of 2024, Dave John retired as chairman after over 33 years of service and was named club president. The Beacon's clubhouse bar was renamed the Dave John Lounge. Pat Harding, Hassocks' second-highest scorer, succeeded him as chairman, immediately introducing ambitious plans.

The 2024–25 season became the greatest in club history. James Westlake led Hassocks to their first-ever Southern Combination League title with 97 points, 16 clear of runners-up Crowborough Athletic, also defeating them 3–1 in the Peter Bentley League Cup final to secure a double. The Under-23s completed a treble, winning the Southern Combination North Division, League Cup, and County Cup. The Under-18s mirrored this feat, lifting the Central Division, League Cup, and Sussex Dennis Probee Youth Cup.

Winning the Southern Combination League promoted Hassocks into the Isthmian League South East Division for 2025–26, bringing step-four football to the village for the first time.



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MATCH REPORT

THREE BRIDGES 1-1 BECKENHAM TOWN

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST

SATURDAY 28 MARCH 2026

Three Bridges were forced to settle for a 1–1 draw against Beckenham Town in a game that will be remembered far more for the referee's performance than the football itself. Incredibly, nine yellow cards and two red cards were shown in a match that featured little in the way of bad challenges, with the constant interruptions destroying any chance of rhythm and ultimately overshadowing the contest.

Bridges, knowing the importance of three points with just six games remaining, made the perfect start. Hayden Velvick fired home clinically at the near post to give the hosts an early lead and settle any nerves. But the game took a dramatic turn in the 9th minute when Dan Ferreira was sent off after being adjudged to have pulled back his opponent following a loss of possession. The decision left Bridges with a mountain to climb for over 80 minutes.

Still adjusting to the setback, Bridges were inevitably pegged back in the 21st minute when Joe Chalker equalised, despite Sam Bull producing a superb goal-line clearance just minutes earlier to briefly preserve the lead.

Beckenham had the better of the remainder of the first half and squandered a huge opportunity to go ahead when Tyler Anderson somehow missed from close range, allowing Bridges to reach half-time level.

Despite their disadvantage, Bridges came out strongly after the break. Velvick should have doubled his tally in the 48th minute but dragged his effort wide after being played through by Leighton.

The biggest moment of controversy came in the 56th minute. Charlie Bennett beat the goalkeeper to the ball and finished what looked a perfectly legitimate goal—only for the referee to disallow it for a foul, a decision that left players, officials, and supporters in disbelief. From there, the match descended further into chaos, with the referee repeatedly halting play and issuing bookings, preventing either side from building any meaningful momentum.

Even so, Bridges continued to push. Beckenham nearly turned the ball into their own net in the 68th minute when it struck the post, while Ade Adeyinka was denied late on by Sullivan as the hosts searched for a winner.

At the other end, Sam Roberts produced an outstanding save in the 84th minute to keep Bridges in the contest before Beckenham were reduced to ten men themselves in the 86th minute after Wanogho received a second yellow card—finally levelling the numbers.

There was still time for one final flashpoint deep into stoppage time. Rivera appeared to be brought down inside the box, with the ball falling kindly to Leighton in a clear goalscoring position. However, rather than allowing play to continue or awarding a penalty, the referee instead gave a foul against Bridges, summing up a hugely frustrating afternoon.

In the end, it finished 1–1, with Bridges left to reflect on what might have been in a match where the officiating took centre stage.
