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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB FOUNDED: 1901

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and claimed their first league championship in the 1907/08 season. Their first significant triumph came in 1933/34 with a Sussex Junior Cup victory, followed by a series of minor honours before they entered the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53. Two years later, they were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63, they won the Division Two Invitation Cup, and were Second Division runners-up in 1968/69, 1973/74, and 1979/80. A notable achievement came in 1970/71 when they defied expectations to win the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s saw a string of successes, beginning with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase in 1981/82, narrowly losing to Molesey (1-2). The following season, they reached the last 32 and captured the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, defeating Hastings Town 3-2. They finished runners-up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament the next year, earning a set of floodlights.

The mid-to-late 1980s were particularly strong: Division One runners-up in 1985/86, repeating the feat in 1987/88 (also winning the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993, which refocused club priorities and led to relegation in 1996/97. They bounced back by winning the Division 2 League Cup in 1997/98 and finishing as Division 2 runners-up to regain Division 1 status. RUR Cup runners-up in 2003/04, they claimed the trophy in 2007/08.

The 2010/11 season started strongly with nine consecutive league wins, though they ultimately finished 5th. However, they won the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time, defeating Rye United 2-1—a feat repeated in 2011/12 with a 2-1 victory over AFC Uckfield. After a rocky start in one season losing four of the first nine matches, they went on a 29-game stretch with just a single defeat, finishing as Sussex County Football League Champions after a decisive 1-0 win over rivals Rye United.

Their debut season in the Ryman Isthmian League South Division was challenging, but an 11-match run late in the season, including seven wins, secured survival and earned Team of the Month Awards in March and April. Subsequent seasons saw fluctuating results, with mid-season signings helping them avoid relegation and later achieving 7th place in 2014/15, though defensive issues remained. The 2015/16 season saw improved defence but fewer goals scored, leading to a 14th-place finish with 66 points—only six fewer than the previous season.

The 2016/17 campaign was hit hard by injuries, forcing reliance on U21, Academy, and U18 players. Despite squad reinforcements later, relegation could not be avoided. In 2017/18, a strengthened squad and management team, including ex-player Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach Marc Wardley, helped Three Bridges finish second in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, earning promotion back to the Isthmian League.

After 25 years as manager, Paul Faili stepped down in 2018/19 to focus on his role as Club Chairman, handing management to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins and Keith George. Despite a poor start, a brief unbeaten run earned Dynan Manager of the Month, but he departed after continued struggles. Paul Faili returned for the final nine games, securing a 14th-place finish, 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained in charge as manager, supported by Keith George, with coaching duties undertaken by Jamie Crellin, who later retired through injury after making 164 appearances. For the 2021/22 season, Crellin stepped up to become First Team Manager, with Danny Lee appointed as his assistant. Ahead of 2022/23, Brannon O'Neill took on the role of Assistant Manager, while Joe Kay joined the staff as First Team Coach. That campaign proved a remarkable one, as Three Bridges recorded what was then their highest-ever league finish, securing fourth place, although they were ultimately beaten by Chichester City in the playoff final.

In May 2024, Brannon O'Neill departed for Burgess Hill Town, resulting in Joe Kay moving into the Assistant Manager role alongside Jamie Crellin, with Ross Ball joining the coaching setup as Goalkeeping Coach. The 2024/25 season represented a significant milestone with the unveiling of the club's new 3G pitch on 26 December 2024. During construction, home fixtures were temporarily staged at The Bauvill Stadium in Chatham between August and early December. By January 2025, the new facility was fully operational, providing a major boost for the Men's, Women's and youth sides, as well as the local community. On the pitch, despite sitting in the relegation places as late as November, a strong second half of the season saw the team climb to an impressive 8th-place finish.

Much of the 2024/25 squad carried over into the 2025/26 campaign, supplemented by the additions of Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka, as the club embarked on a historic season celebrating its 125th Anniversary. The Men's First Team produced outstanding league form throughout, sweeping aside opponents and comfortably securing the Isthmian League South East Division title with 96 points, finishing 11 clear of second-placed Croydon Athletic. Noel Leighton was also crowned the league's top scorer, registering 31 goals.

Capping off a memorable season, the Men's First Team reached the Sussex Transport Senior Cup Final, overcoming National League South sides Horsham and Worthing along the way, before lifting the trophy on penalties against Brighton & Hove Albion's U21's at the Amex Stadium. The league and cup double was secured amid widespread celebrations. Across all competitions, the side scored over 150 goals, with Noel Leighton, Reece Hallard and Charlie Bennett contributing a remarkable, combined total of 95.

Success extended beyond the Men's side, with the Women's First Team completing a treble by winning the SCWGFL Premier Division, SCWGFL Challenge Cup and Combined Counties Trophy. The U18's also enjoyed their most successful league campaign to date in the Isthmian Youth League East Division, while reaching the County Cup Final for the first time. It was a truly exceptional 2025/26 season across the entire club, one that will be remembered fondly for many years to come.

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A HISTORY OF DARTFORD FOOTBALL CLUB FOUNDED: 1888

Founded in 1888 by members of the Dartford Workingmen's Club, Dartford FC has enjoyed over 130 years at the heart of Kent football. After early years playing friendlies, the club became a founder member of the Kent League in 1894 and soon progressed into the Southern League, winning the Division Two title at the first attempt.

In the early 20th century, Dartford experienced fluctuating fortunes, including financial difficulties, but success returned with a West Kent League and Cup double in 1908–09. Following the First World War, the club was restructured into a limited company and moved to its long-term home at Watling Street, where it would remain for over 70 years.

The inter-war period proved highly successful, particularly under manager Bill Collier, as Dartford won multiple Southern League titles and Kent Senior Cups, while also gaining national recognition through strong FA Cup performances. Post-war years brought mixed results, though the club continued to compete consistently in the Southern League.

A major highlight came in 1973–74 when Dartford secured the Southern League Championship and reached the FA Trophy Final at Wembley. The 1980s saw further success under John Still and Peter Taylor, including league titles, cup victories, and high-scoring teams that attracted growing crowds.

However, financial difficulties in the early 1990s led to the sale of the Watling Street ground and the club's withdrawal from the Southern League in 1992. Dartford's survival was secured by its Supporters' Association, who reformed the club and oversaw a gradual rebuild through ground-sharing arrangements and a return to the Kent League.

The club's fortunes improved steadily, culminating in promotion back to the Southern League in 1996. A major turning point came with the construction of Princes Park, which opened in 2006 and marked Dartford's return to its home town.

On the pitch, Dartford enjoyed a rapid rise through the non-league pyramid, winning the Isthmian League Division One North in 2007–08 and the Premier Division in 2009–10. Promotion to the Conference National followed in 2012 after a play-off victory, marking a return to the top tier of non-league football for the first time in decades.

In recent years, Dartford have remained a competitive force in non-league football, regularly challenging at the upper levels while maintaining a strong community focus. The club's history is one of resilience, revival, and sustained ambition, underpinned by loyal support and a proud Kent heritage.



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MATCH REPORT

THREE BRIDGES 3-2 STEYNING TOWN

SUSSEX COMMUNITY SHIELD

WEDNESDAY 29 JULY 2026

Three Bridges lifted the Sussex Community Shield for the first time in the club's history after edging SCFL Step 5 champions Steyning Town 3-2 in an entertaining contest at Lancing, completing a remarkable domestic treble following last season's Isthmian South East League and Sussex Senior Challenge Cup successes.

With several players unavailable through injury and absence, Bridges knew they faced a stern examination against a strong Steyning side managed by former Bridges captain and assistant manager Brannon O'Neill alongside former Bridges U18's manager Matt Calver. The match was played in aid of Air Ambulance Charity Kent, Surrey & Sussex and in memory of the late Billy Vigar.

Bridges made the perfect start, taking the lead after just four minutes. Billy Irving split the Steyning defence with a superb through ball, allowing captain **Noel Leighton** to race clear before calmly guiding the ball past the advancing goalkeeper with the outside of his boot. The strike also marked a memorable personal milestone as Leighton reached 100 goals in a Three Bridges shirt.

Steyning responded well and thought they had a route back into the game in the ninth minute when Kuntu-Blankson went down inside the penalty area. The referee was unmoved, instead producing a yellow card for simulation. Bridges continued to dictate proceedings and should have doubled their advantage midway through the half.

Leighton's perfectly weighted pass released Hayden Velvick one-on-one, but the Steyning goalkeeper produced an excellent save before both Leighton and Reece Hallard were unable to convert from the resulting scramble.

The second goal eventually arrived on the stroke of half-time. Reece Hallard delivered an inviting cross towards the back post where **Hayden Velvick** battled to force a header over the line despite the desperate attempts of a defender to clear. Bridges deservedly went into the interval with a two-goal advantage.

Steyning emerged with renewed purpose after the restart and almost scored immediately, only for Sam Freeman to produce an excellent save from Brewer's close-range header. The striker would not be denied for long, however, finding the net in the 54th minute with an excellent volley that flew beyond the diving Freeman to reduce the deficit.

The momentum swung firmly in Steyning's favour and Bridges struggled to regain the control they had enjoyed before the break. Their pressure told with 15 minutes remaining when Ginger headed home from a free-kick delivery to level the scores at 2-2.

Any nerves among the Bridges supporters lasted only moments. From the resulting spell of pressure, Steyning failed to deal with a corner and **Billy Irving** rose highest to power a well-placed header into the net and restore Bridges' lead at 3-2.

Bridges nearly wrapped up the victory soon afterwards when Hallard was presented with a glorious opportunity, but his effort drifted wide. Steyning threw everything forward in the closing stages, but Irving capped a magnificent individual display with a heroic goal-saving block in the 89th minute to preserve the lead and secure the trophy.

The victory sees Three Bridges begin the new campaign with silverware and continue the momentum built from last season's historic success.
