FROM THE CHAIRMAN

The commitment and spirit within this group remain as strong as ever, and tonight is another opportunity to show what they are capable of.

To our supporters, thank you once again for your tremendous backing. The FA Cup is about atmosphere, excitement and shared experiences, and I hope we can create a memorable one here at Jubilee Field tonight. Make plenty of noise, get behind the players and make sure the Kingstonian players know exactly how difficult it is to come here and play!

I must also thank our wonderful staff and volunteers. Your hard work behind the scenes makes every matchday possible, and your contribution is never taken for granted.

The lights are on, the stage is set, and we have the opportunity to create another memorable FA Cup night at Jubilee Field!

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A HISTORY OF THREE BRIDGES FOOTBALL CLUB FOUNDED: 1901

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and claimed their first league championship in the 1907/08 season. Their first significant triumph came in 1933/34 with a Sussex Junior Cup victory, followed by a series of minor honours before they entered the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53. Two years later, they were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63, they won the Division Two Invitation Cup, and were Second Division runners-up in 1968/69, 1973/74, and 1979/80. A notable achievement came in 1970/71 when they defied expectations to win the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s saw a string of successes, beginning with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase in 1981/82, narrowly losing to Molesey (1-2). The following season, they reached the last 32 and captured the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, defeating Hastings Town 3-2. They finished runners-up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament the next year, earning a set of floodlights.

The mid-to-late 1980s were particularly strong: Division One runners-up in 1985/86, repeating the feat in 1987/88 (also winning the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89. A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993, which refocused club priorities and led to relegation in 1996/97. They bounced back by winning the Division 2 League Cup in 1997/98 and finishing as Division 2 runners-up to regain Division 1 status. RUR Cup runners-up in 2003/04, they claimed the trophy in 2007/08.

The 2010/11 season started strongly with nine consecutive league wins, though they ultimately finished 5th. However, they won the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time, defeating Rye United 2-1—a feat repeated in 2011/12 with a 2-1 victory over AFC Uckfield. After a rocky start in one season losing four of the first nine matches, they went on a 29-game stretch with just a single defeat, finishing as Sussex County Football League Champions after a decisive 1-0 win over rivals Rye United.

Their debut season in the Ryman Isthmian League South Division was challenging, but an 11-match run late in the season, including seven wins, secured survival and earned Team of the Month Awards in March and April. Subsequent seasons saw fluctuating results, with mid-season signings helping them avoid relegation and later achieving 7th place in 2014/15, though defensive issues remained. The 2015/16 season saw improved defence but fewer goals scored, leading to a 14th-place finish with 66 points—only six fewer than the previous season.

The 2016/17 campaign was hit hard by injuries, forcing reliance on U21, Academy, and U18 players. Despite squad reinforcements later, relegation could not be avoided. In 2017/18, a strengthened squad and management team, including ex-player Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach Marc Wardley, helped Three Bridges finish second in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, earning promotion back to the Isthmian League.

After 25 years as manager, Paul Faili stepped down in 2018/19 to focus on his role as Club Chairman, handing management to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins and Keith George. Despite a poor start, a brief unbeaten run earned Dynan Manager of the Month, but he departed after continued struggles. Paul Faili returned for the final nine games, securing a 14th-place finish, 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained in charge as manager, supported by Keith George, with coaching duties undertaken by Jamie Crellin, who later retired through injury after making 164 appearances. For the 2021/22 season, Crellin stepped up to become First Team Manager, with Danny Lee appointed as his assistant. Ahead of 2022/23, Brannon O'Neill took on the role of Assistant Manager, while Joe Kay joined the staff as First Team Coach. That campaign proved a remarkable one, as Three Bridges recorded what was then their highest-ever league finish, securing fourth place, although they were ultimately beaten by Chichester City in the playoff final.

In May 2024, Brannon O'Neill departed for Burgess Hill Town, resulting in Joe Kay moving into the Assistant Manager role alongside Jamie Crellin, with Ross Ball joining the coaching setup as Goalkeeping Coach. The 2024/25 season represented a significant milestone with the unveiling of the club's new 3G pitch on 26 December 2024. During construction, home fixtures were temporarily staged at The Bauvill Stadium in Chatham between August and early December. By January 2025, the new facility was fully operational, providing a major boost for the Men's, Women's and youth sides, as well as the local community. On the pitch, despite sitting in the relegation places as late as November, a strong second half of the season saw the team climb to an impressive 8th-place finish.

Much of the 2024/25 squad carried over into the 2025/26 campaign, supplemented by the additions of Sam Roberts, Charlie Bennett and Ade Adeyinka, as the club embarked on a historic season celebrating its 125th Anniversary. The Men's First Team produced outstanding league form throughout, sweeping aside opponents and comfortably securing the Isthmian League South East Division title with 96 points, finishing 11 clear of second-placed Croydon Athletic. Noel Leighton was also crowned the league's top scorer, registering 31 goals.

Capping off a memorable season, the Men's First Team reached the Sussex Transport Senior Cup Final, overcoming National League South sides Horsham and Worthing along the way, before lifting the trophy on penalties against Brighton & Hove Albion's U21's at the Amex Stadium. The league and cup double was secured amid widespread celebrations. Across all competitions, the side scored over 150 goals, with Noel Leighton, Reece Hallard and Charlie Bennett contributing a remarkable, combined total of 95.

Success extended beyond the Men's side, with the Women's First Team completing a treble by winning the SCWGFL Premier Division, SCWGFL Challenge Cup and Combined Counties Trophy. The U18's also enjoyed their most successful league campaign to date in the Isthmian Youth League East Division, while reaching the County Cup Final for the first time. It was a truly exceptional 2025/26 season across the entire club, one that will be remembered fondly for many years to come.

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A HISTORY OF KINGSTONIAN FOOTBALL CLUB FOUNDED: 1885

Kingstonian Football Club was formed in 1919 through the merger of Kingston Town FC and Old Kingstonians FC, although the club can trace its origins considerably further back. In November 1885, Kingston & Surbiton YMCA FC played its first match in Bushy Park. The club subsequently changed its name to Saxons FC in 1887, Kingston Wanderers in 1890 and Kingston-on-Thames Association Football Club in 1893. In 1908, the club split into two, with Kingston Town playing at Norbiton Sports Ground and Old Kingstonians at Richmond Road.

The newly formed Kingstonian began life in the Athenian League, winning the championship in 1923/24 and again in 1925/26. In 1929, the club accepted an invitation to join the Isthmian League, replacing Civil Service FC, and would remain a member of the competition for almost 70 years.

The 1930s represented one of the greatest periods in the club's early history. A talented side featuring players such as Frank Macey, Doug Whitehead and George Lee reached the FA Amateur Cup Final in 1933. After a 1-1 draw with Stockton at Dulwich, Kingstonian travelled to Darlington for the replay and produced a memorable 4-1 victory, with Gibson, Urpeth and Whitehead (two) scoring the goals. The club went on to win the Isthmian League in 1933/34 and again in 1936/37.

Kingstonian came close to another major honour in 1959/60, reaching the FA Amateur Cup Final at Wembley against Hendon. Johnny Whing headed K's into the lead, but two goals in the final three minutes saw Hendon win 2-1. The club had enjoyed an impressive run to the final, defeating Histon, Letchworth Town, Ferryhill Athletic, Carshalton Athletic and Crook Town along the way.

The early 1960s brought further success and, in 1967, Kingstonian won the Surrey Senior Cup for the ninth time. However, the club subsequently entered a period of decline, eventually suffering relegation in 1979. Promotion was regained in 1985, and K's eventually returned to the Isthmian Premier Division, where they won the championship in 1997/98 to secure promotion to the Football Conference.

Richmond Road had been Kingstonian's home since the club's formation, but the ground became increasingly dilapidated and suffered from vandalism. The final match there was played against Bromley in January 1988, after which the club groundshared at Hampton's Beveree Stadium for a season and a half. In August 1989, K's moved into the newly constructed Kingsmeadow Stadium, built on the site of the old Norbiton Sports Ground.

Kingsmeadow soon became the setting for several memorable FA Cup occasions. The club drew with Peterborough United in 1992 before recording a famous victory over Brighton in 1994. K's also performed strongly against Plymouth and, in 1998, held Leyton Orient to a 0-0 draw in front of 3,495 supporters before losing the replay 2-1. The following season brought another impressive cup performance as Kingstonian travelled to Luton Town and led 1-0 before eventually losing 4-2.

The appointment of Geoff Chapple as manager at the beginning of the 1997/98 season transformed the club's fortunes. In his first season, Chapple guided Kingstonian to the Isthmian Premier Division championship and promotion to the Football Conference. K's finished an impressive eighth in their first season at the higher level before achieving their greatest modern success by winning the FA Trophy at Wembley in May 1999, defeating Forest Green Rovers 1-0.

Kingstonian retained the FA Trophy the following season, beating Kettering Town 3-2 in the final at Wembley. The victory gave Chapple his fifth FA Trophy Final success in seven seasons and saw K's record their highest-ever league finish of fifth in the Conference.

The 2000/01 season produced another outstanding FA Cup run. Kingstonian defeated Devizes Town, Brentford, Southport and Southend United to reach the Fourth Round, where they faced Bristol City at Ashton Gate. K's looked set for a famous

victory before Bristol City scored a last-gasp equaliser. The replay, played at Kingsmeadow in front of the television cameras, was won by Bristol City. In contrast, Kingstonian's league campaign was disappointing and they finished next to bottom, suffering relegation back to the Ryman League.

A period of managerial change followed, with Steve Sedgley, Kim Harris and Scott Steele among those taking charge. Relegation to Division One followed in 2004/05, but the club received a major boost off the field when local businessman Jimmy Cochrane took ownership. In 2005/06, Kingstonian improved significantly and ended the campaign with silverware, defeating AFC Wimbledon 1-0 in the Surrey Senior Cup Final.

Alan Dowson became manager midway through the 2006/07 season and brought greater stability to the club. After narrowly missing out on the play-offs in 2007/08, K's enjoyed an excellent 2008/09 campaign. They reached the Third Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, including a 4-0 victory over Braintree Town, with all four goals scored by Dean Lodge. Their biggest success, however, came in the league as Kingstonian won the Ryman League Division One South title by seven points.

The club narrowly missed out on promotion in the following seasons, losing to Boreham Wood in the 2009/10 play-off final and suffering another costly final-day collapse at Margate in 2010/11. After two mid-table campaigns, Kingstonian finished runners-up in 2013/14 and reached the play-offs, but lost to AFC Hornchurch in the semi-final, which proved to be Dowson's final game in charge.

Former Kingstonian midfielder Tommy Williams then took over and guided the club to another FA Cup Third Qualifying Round appearance in 2014/15. In 2015/16, K's lifted their first cup in ten years, defeating Faversham Town 5-0 to win the Isthmian League Cup.

Following a difficult 2016/17 campaign, Craig Edwards replaced Williams and helped the club avoid relegation. At the end of the season, Kingstonian left Kingsmeadow and moved to Fetcham Grove to groundshare with Leatherhead. Edwards departed in October 2017 and was replaced by Leigh Dynan.

For the 2018/19 season, Kingstonian returned to the Royal Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames and began groundsharing with Corinthian-Casuals at King George's Field. It proved to be a turbulent campaign, with three managers in the space of a season. K's went from second in the table on New Year's Day to narrowly avoiding relegation by just one place.

The arrival of Hayden Bird as manager in 2019/20 provided a major boost. Kingstonian reached the First Round of the FA Cup for the first time since 2000/01 and produced a stunning 4-0 victory away at Macclesfield Town before losing to AFC Fylde in the Second Round. Their FA Trophy campaign also produced a memorable 3-1 victory over Woking. Both the 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons were curtailed by the COVID-19 pandemic, with K's sitting fourth in the Premier Division when the latter campaign was abandoned.

Kingstonian began 2021/22 impressively, spending a lengthy period at the top of the Premier Division before a loss of form saw them finish tenth. They also reached the Surrey Senior Cup Final, losing on penalties to Dorking Wanderers after a 1-1 draw. Further managerial changes followed, with Lee O'Leary, Spencer Knight and Simon Lane all taking charge during a difficult period. Lane helped the club avoid relegation in 2022/23, but the 2023/24 campaign proved even more challenging. After a poor season, K's finished bottom of the league and were relegated.

Scott Harris, formerly of Walton & Hersham, was appointed manager for Kingstonian's first season in the Isthmian League South Central Division. With an almost entirely new squad, K's enjoyed an exciting 2024/25 campaign, reaching the play-off semi-finals before losing on penalties to eventual winners Uxbridge. Harris took a break from management during the summer of 2025 but returned in October after Dean Thomas and Mitchal Gough departed as joint managers.

Following a mid-table finish in 2025/26, Kingstonian agreed a new two-year groundsharing arrangement. The club will play its home fixtures during the 2026/27 and 2027/28 seasons at Ashford Town (Middlesex), continuing the long-running story of one of non-League football's most historic and well-travelled clubs.



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MATCH REPORT

THREE BRIDGES 3-2 CARSHALTON ATH.

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE PREMIER DIVISION

MONDAY 31 AUGUST 2026

Three Bridges produced a superb performance at the Jubilee Ground on Bank Holiday Monday to beat Isthmian Premier leaders Carshalton Athletic 3–2 and climb out of the relegation places.

Buoyed by an excellent 2–2 draw at Dulwich Hamlet just 48 hours earlier, and with several players beginning to return from the club's lengthy injury list, Bridges made a dream start against a Carshalton side that had won all five of their previous league matches.

The hosts took the lead after just three minutes following a superb team move. Noel Leighton released Hayden Velvick down the right, and Velvick delivered a pinpoint cross for **Kevin Rivera** to fire home. The advantage was doubled in the 11th minute, with Velvick again the provider, crossing for captain **Noel Leighton** to make it 2–0.

Carshalton responded almost immediately, reducing the deficit in the 13th minute when a slick attacking move ended with **Tope Fandahusi** applying the finishing touch.

Despite the setback, Bridges remained firmly on top and created a succession of chances. Leighton saw an effort blocked off the line before later missing from close range, while Ilic forced a save from a dangerous free-kick and Rivera also passed up a glorious opportunity. Bridges went into the break 2–1 ahead, with the scoreline arguably flattering the visitors given the hosts' dominance.

The second half continued in much the same fashion, with Bridges controlling proceedings. Carshalton left-back Masampu again struggled to contain Velvick, who was beaten only after being brought down inside the penalty area following a move involving Rivera. **Charlie Bennett** confidently dispatched the resulting penalty to restore Bridges' two-goal advantage.

Carshalton's afternoon then went from bad to worse in the 60th minute when Masampu brought down Rivera again, earning a second yellow card and reducing the visitors to ten men. However, Bridges' numerical advantage lasted just three minutes, with Ade Adeyinka also receiving two yellow cards in quick succession.

The hosts appeared to be heading comfortably towards a deserved victory, but Carshalton were handed a lifeline deep into stoppage time when the referee awarded a penalty following a debatable challenge. **Young-Coombes** made no mistake from the spot in the 93rd minute to make it 3–2 and set up a nervy finish.

Bridges held firm, however, to secure a hugely deserved first league victory of the season. The result capped an excellent Bank Holiday weekend, with Jamie Crellin's side collecting four points from their two matches against Dulwich Hamlet and Carshalton Athletic.

The victory also lifts Bridges out of the relegation places and provides a major boost after a difficult start to life at Step 3, heavily disrupted by injuries. With players now returning and performances improving, there is growing optimism that this could be the beginning of something special at Three Bridges.
